USCCB—Prayers and Devotions

How do I pray? Various forms of prayer are presented in the Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC 2623-2649). These various forms include prayer of blessing or adoration, prayer of petition, prayer of intercession, prayer of thanksgiving, and prayer of praise.

What is meditation? Meditation is a Christian practice of prayer dating back to the early Church. As the Catechism states: "Meditation is above all a quest. The mind seeks to understand the why and how of the Christian life, in order to adhere and respond to what the Lord is asking." By meditating on the Gospels, holy icons, liturgical texts, spiritual writings, or "the great book of creation," we come to make our own that which is God's. "To the extent that we are humble and faithful, we discover in meditation the movements that stir the heart and we are able to discern them. It is a question of acting truthfully in order to come into the light: "Lord, what do you want me to do?" (CCC 2705-2706). Meditation is an essential form of Christian prayer, especially for those who are seeking to answer the vocational question, "Lord, what do you want me to do?"



Neither the Roman Missal nor the Book of Blessings has particular orations for a Baccalaureate Mass or a Rite for Blessing Graduates. However, there are many appropriate Mass oration options, among

which are those entitled 'For the Progress of Peoples.' While the Church's - and every Christian's - ultimate goal is God's Heavenly Kingdom, we must make our earthly journey as pleasantly beneficial as possible. For as an intention in the Liturgy of the Hours or Divine Office states: "Grant that the more we look forward to a new heaven and a new earth, the more we may seek to better this present world." [Friday Evenings in Eastertime, weeks 2 & 4, and week 6 in places where the Ascension is transferred to Sunday.]

As we lift up the Class of 2018 in prayer, we also pray for all students and all those in any type of training, as well as all teachers and instructors. May the Spirit of Wisdom and Understanding fill the minds and hearts of all who endeavor to develop their God-given intelligence and skills. May their generous use for the common good help God build up His Kingdom on earth.

Collect - For the Progress of Peoples

O God, who gave one origin to all peoples and willed to gather from them one family for yourself, fill all hearts, we pray, with the fire of your love and kindle in them a desire for the just advancement of their neighbor, that, through the good things which you richly bestow upon all, each human person may be brought to perfection, every division may be removed, and equity and justice may be established in human society. Through our Lord Jesus Christ ... and ever. Amen.

LOVE YOUR NEIGHBOR AS YOURSELF. As Christians all our hopes and plans must somehow express our love of God, our love of neighbor, and our love of self. By striving to keep a perfect balance between these three expressions of love: our love of God, neighbor and self, we can be sure we are properly using all God has entrusted to us.

Prayer over the Offerings - For Progress of Peoples

Hear, O Lord, in your mercy, the prayers of those who cry to you and, as you receive your Church's offering, grant that all may be filled with the spirit of divine sonship, so that, with inequalities overcome by charity, one family of peoples may be formed in your peace.
 Who lives and reigns for ever and ever. Amen.

DIVINE SONSHIP. Through Baptism, we are God's ADOPTED children, but we have an even deeper bond with God. For we also share in Jesus Christ's 'divine sonship.' As God's Only-Begotten Son, Jesus has an eternal and equal dignity with the Father, or in 'lay' terms: He was not 'adopted' by God as we are. As the Catholic Catechism explains it, Jesus "**distinguished his sonship from that of his disciples by never saying 'our Father.'** except to command them: **'You, then, pray like this: "Our Father."**", and he emphasized this distinction, saying **"my Father and your Father".**" [#443] By sharing in this special bond, all we strive to do in Jesus' Name actually continues His ministry! What an honor we have in this special bond with Jesus!

Prayer after Communion - For Progress of Peoples

Having been fed with the one Bread by which you constantly renew the human family, we pray, O Lord, that from participation in this Sacrament of unity we may draw a love strong and pure to help peoples in their development and, prompted by charity, to fulfill what justice requires.
 Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

FROM WORSHIP TO WORK. Just as a graduation ceremony is rightfully called a 'commencement' or a 'beginning, the holy Mass is a start, not an end! Once we 'download' God's directions from His manual, the Bible, in **The Liturgy of the Word - and are fortified with sacramental grace in The Liturgy of the Eucharist,** we are 'sent' to bring these gifts into our waiting and ever wanting world. Each time we 'graduate' - be it from a school, training program or a holy Mass - may we 'commence' with the work we have been chosen and gifted by God to do!

FEAST OF OUR PATRON—SAINT JUSTIN THE MARTYR

June 1st is the feast of our parish
patron, St. Justin the Martyr.

June 1, 1989 is also the day our
parish was dedicated and consecrated by the
late Bishop John Reiss after the renovations.
So we celebrate two feasts on June 1st—our
patron and the anniversary of the dedication
our church.

According to the “General Norms for the
Liturgical Year and the Calendar” (1969), the
“title of a particular church” is a “solemnity” in that
church (par. 59, no. 4), and it outranks the feasts of the
Lord in the General Calendar and the Sundays in
Ordinary Time (“Calendar,” par. 59, nos. 5-6).

What that means is that the Memorial of St. Justin the
Martyr on June 1st becomes a solemnity in parishes
named St. Justin the Martyr. A solemnity is the highest
rank of liturgical celebration.

A little known fact is that the parish feast day can be
moved to a Sunday in Ordinary Time. “For the pastoral
advantage of the people, it is permissible to observe on
the Sundays in Ordinary Time those celebrations that fall
during the week and have special appeal to the devotion
of the faithful....”

There are several reasons a parish would move the feast
day of its patron to a Sunday in Ordinary Time; First,
more members of a parish are exposed to their parish’s
patron on a Sunday. This gives them the opportunity to
learn about the patron — both through the bulletin and
the homily. Since everyone is not able to attend weekday
Mass, all the members of the parish will be able to
celebrate it.

**Accordingly, I will transfer the Feast of St. Justin the
Martyr to the weekend of June 9/10th this year. The
readings of the Mass will be proper to the feast day.**

St. Justin the Martyr, pray for us.
