From the Pastor 18th Sunday in Ordinary Time - B August 5, 2018

THROUGH DEATH TO NEW LIFE. This week we honor a Saint beatified by Pope Saint John Paul II in 1987 while on a pastoral visit to Germany; he then canonized her in Rome on October 11, 1998. Who

would imagine so much goodness and life would come from a gas chamber used by the Nazis to execute so many people. We must never forget the life of Edith Stein, now Saint Teresa Benedicta of the Cross! Here's the Collect for her Feast Day: August 9, the probable day when, in 1942, she and her sister Rosa, also a Jewish convert to Catholicism, died at the hands of sadistic Nazi evildoers.

<u>Collect - Saint Teresa Benedicta of the Cross,</u> Virgin & Martyr

God of our Fathers, who brought the Martyr Saint Teresa Benedicta of the Cross to know your crucified Son and to imitate him even until death, grant, through her intercession, that the whole human race may acknowledge Christ as its Savior and through him come to behold you for eternity.

Who lives and reigns ... forever and ever. Amen.

Edith Stein, the youngest of 11, was born into a prominent Jewish family in Breslau, Germany [now Wroclaw, Poland] on October 12, 1891 as her family marked Yom Kippur or the solemn Day of Atonement. A brilliant philosopher, she became an atheist at 14, but was so intrigued by Saint Teresa of Avila's autobiography, she converted to Catholicism in 1922 and became, like the Saint whose name she took in Religious Life, a Carmelite Sister.

After 4 years at the German Cologne Carmel, she moved to a monastery in the Netherlands. Ironically, her Prioress sent her there to protect her from the Nazis, whose plan to exterminate all Jews had become apparent. However, in 1940, in retaliation for being denounced by the Dutch Bishops, the Nazis arrested all Dutch Jews who had become Christians; *Teresa Benedicta* and her sister Rosa, a helper at the Carmel, were arrested in the chapel and sent to Auschwitz, where she and nearly 1,000 Jews were gassed on August 9, 1942.

Critics of **Pope Pius XII**, who say he did not do enough [he did <u>so much!</u>] to save Jews, dismiss how many Catholic Priests, Religious and Laity the Nazis killed in retaliation when Church leaders criticized Nazi Germany.

What moved her to become Catholic? Even in her 'atheist' years, **Edith Stein** was moved by her experiences as a nurse during **WWII** and by an anonymous woman she wrote about in her journal. While visiting Frankfurt's Cathedral she saw a woman 'making a visit' to the Blessed Sacrament and was so struck by how the woman 'conversed' so 'casually' with her 'friend' - which, indeed, is what she was doing as she prayed to Jesus, truly present in the Eucharist!

She fully embraced her faith in Jesus as Lord, but never forgot her family-by-birth and prayed they would achieve salvation by being faithful to God's promises. It shocks some that, as the Catholic Catechism teaches, <u>all</u> people of goodwill, who faithfully follow the dictates of their conscience, can achieve, by God's desire to save all people, eternal salvation. This is true for Jews, Moslems, Buddhists and even atheists who defend human dignity and live a moral life.

In her writings, she saw herself as a modern-day Queen Esther, who valiantly risked her life to save her people; while the biblical Queen Esther survived the reign of a tyrannical despot, and Edith Stein did not, both gave witness to God's power shining through the weak who totally offer themselves in God's service. Sadly, her canonization caused angst among some, who reject her as a traitor.

As Pope Saint John Paul II said in Edith Stein's canonization homily: "May her witness constantly strengthen the bridge of mutual understanding between Jews and Christians." May God forgive us for taking our Faith, and the right to freely practice it, for granted. Saint Teresa Benedicta of the Cross, pray for us.

Father Tom, the deacons, our entire parish family and I, take this opportunity to congratulate Mr. Donald Gries. Don has been active in our parish in many capacities. Bishop O'Connell has selected Don as one of eleven men to commence studies for the diaconate next month. Our prayers are with Don, his wife Debbie and his family. Congratulations and best wishes!




