

Today's Readings

Reflections by Rev. Leonard N. Peterson

Reading I: Isaiah 42: 1-4, 6-7

God's servant will accomplish his work quietly and he will respect others as he brings back the apostates among his people living in "the coast lands." All people need to realize their blindness or imprisonment so as to be cured.

Reading II: Acts 10: 34-38

Peter's sermon delivered in Cornelius' home touts Jesus' openness to all people, and then expounds on how Jesus "went about doing good, for God was with Him."

The Gospel: Matthew 3: 13-17

Jesus' is baptized in the Jordan by a reluctant John the Baptist. The term "righteousness" refers to ethical justice. The divine voice expresses the Father's approval not only of Jesus but also His special relationship with the Father as His Son.

From the Pastor The Baptism of the Lord - A January 12, 2020

THE MORE THINGS CHANGE, THE MORE THEY STAY THE SAME. On *January 13* we honor a Saint whose name in Latin means 'cheerful,' 'joyous' or 'hilarious:' *Saint Hilary* of Poitiers. Once a boy's name spelled with only one 'l,' it is commonly airl's

name spelled with a double 'I.' Born around 315 in Poitiers, France, he died there in 367 or 368, having served as Bishop of Poitiers from 353, although he was exiled to the East in 356. To understand his importance, and why he was declared a Doctor of the Church in 1851, we need to recall our Church's complex history.

After Christianity became 'legal' with the Edict of Milan in 313, which ended the fierce persecution that sought to destroy her, she almost crashed by internal strife over theological issues! The main 'heresy' at the time, Arianism, denied Jesus was divine, which would have rendered almost all that Jesus did heretical, for only God can forgive sins, alter Commandments, establish a new Church, etc. After praying the Collect for the Mass celebrated in Saint Hilary's honor, we'll explain how he combated the demons of his day. [That's why he is often depicted with a biblical symbol of evil: a demon, a dragon or a snake.]

Collect - St. Hilary, Bishop and **Doctor of the Church**

Grant, we pray, almighty God, that we may rightly understand and truthfully profess the divinity of your Son, which the Bishop Saint Hilary taught with such constancy. Through our Lord Jesus ... for ever and ever. Amen.

A SAINT WITH A VERY SLOW START. As a young man, the future Saint was indifferent about religion; raised in a noble, pagan family, he married and had children; one of whom is a Saint: his daughter *Abra*. As he pondered the purpose and meaning of creation, life and death, he was drawn to the Christian faith and was baptized. Shortly after, he was elected by the Priests and people of his Diocese as Bishop as was the custom back then - as was optional celibacy and a married clergy. But when he sided with Saint Athanasius, the main defender of Christ's divinity, he was exiled.

MAKE LEMONADE WITH LIFE'S LEMONS. He was true to his upbeat, happy name: he dealt with heretics with uncommon kindness; he excused their errors as unfortunate mistakes, not intentional attacks; he focused on the beauty of God's creation, especially the human person, and, above all, he did not become bitter in his exile. In fact, what the Arians intended as a punishment ironically led to their downfall and eventual condemnation - even by the Emperors who once supported them.

For during his exile, **Saint Hilary** spent his time reading and studying each side's position; he fine-tuned the 'Catholic' response to 'Arian' issues; he prepared homilies and presentations in which he presented the 'orthodox' view of Christ's dual nature: human and divine. Then, when he was allowed to return to Poitiers, he purposely meandered, very slowly, back to France - preaching and teaching the truth about Jesus throughout Greece and Italy! May we use our 'punishments' and 'exiles' as wisely!

WE BUILD ON A SOLID FOUNDATION. As one of the first great theologians with the freedom to study and teach, read and write, Saint Hilary's writings, which we still have, offer excellent exposés on the Trinity, the Gospel of Matthew, and the *Psalms*. He also experienced how the Arians, using hymns NOT based on Scripture, promoted their heresies by the songs they sang. So, he began to write hymns which promoted the True Faith; he was among the first in the Western or Latin Rite Church to do this. And to this day, every hymn in any official Catholic hymnal must be approved by a Bishop's committee - lest we sing heresy!

WHAT DO WE DO TO STAY ON COURSE? In every age, new questions arise - and new ideas are put forward - but how do we know which ones to believe and follow? While we wish living out our faith was easier, Jesus did say, "Do not think that I have come to bring peace upon the earth. I have come to bring not peace but the sword." [Matthew 10:34] Do we make use of the many Catholic periodicals, websites, CDs, books, etc., that help us know the Truth? Saint Hilary, Bishop and Doctor of the Church, pray for us!


