Today's Readings

Reading I: Isaiah 49: 3, 5-6

The prophet presents himself as another Jeremiah, with references to having a call while still in the womb, and his obligation to fulfill it. He knows that he is to be "a light to the nations" with his announcements.

Reading II: I Corinthians 1: 1-3

Paul uses a standard letter introduction, and then claims to have the same apostolic authority as the original Twelve. He tells his readers that they have been set apart by God and must work to be worthy of that.

The Gospel: John 1: 29-34

The writer tells his readers that the descent of the Spirit upon Jesus was the sign for John the Baptist that He was the one designated by God. He is "the Lamb of God" with all the rich meaning of that term making Him the ultimate sacrifice for our sins.

A SAD SITUATION EVER

ANCIENT, EVER NEW. This
week, on January 21, we
honor one of the most
famous early-Church female
martyrs: Saint Agnes.
There's a plethora of pious
tales about her; most say
she was born in 290 into a
wealthy Christian family
who wanted her to marry

one of her well-to-do suitors. However, she dedicated her life to *Christ* and His Church by maintaining her chaste virginity. Some accounts say after she rejected a man who had lusted for her, he turned her into anti-Christian Roman authorities. She was arrested, pressured to give up her virginity, and persecuted for remaining steadfast; she was executed when she was 12 or 13 in 309. Some sources say the jilted man who had lusted for her and betrayed her went blind! After praying her Collect, more about *Saint Agnes*.

Collect - Saint Agnes, Virgin & Martyr

Almighty ever-living God, who choose what is weak in the world to confound the strong, mercifully grant, that we, who celebrate the heavenly birthday of your Martyr Saint Agnes, may follow her constancy in the faith.

Through our Lord Jesus ... for ever and ever. Amen.

"NOTHING IS NEW UNDER THE SUN." As this quote from Ecclesiastes 1:9: "What has been, that will be; what has been done, that will be done. Nothing is new under the sun." reminds us: our struggles in keeping the faith are not new. Many are still pressured or forced to violate their consciences, abused or raped; human trafficking remains a scourge. As we write this article, the horrors allegedly committed by Jeffrey Epstein are still in the news, as are accounts of teachers, coaches, law enforcement officials, politicians, clergy of every faith, and others, who abuse our very vulnerable young people.

May all victims of abuse, rape or any violation of human dignity rely on the intercession of this powerful Patron Saint who knew - firsthand - the pains they endured. May *Saint Agnes* help them move beyond and let go of their pain, may all offenders be brought to justice; and may those falsely accused be vindicated.

GOD CAN TURN OUR MOURNING INTO LAUGHTER AND OUR SORROW INTO JOY. The customs, devotions and rites developed to honor Saint Agnes and promote her 'cause' or patronage began soon after her martyrdom. Saint Ambrose [340–397] extolled her courageous determination; since antiquity she is one of the 7 female martyrs: Felicity, Perpetua, Agatha, Lucy, Agnes, Cecilia, Anathasia named in the Roman Canon or Eucharistic Prayer I. [The only other woman named is our Blessed Mother.] And her name: Agnes, which in Latin means 'lamb' - set the stage for a Church custom that is still practiced to this day.

THE PALLIUM. As a sign of the Church's unity, all *Metropolitan Archbishops* [MA] wear a pallium: a white woolen 'scarf' with six black silk crosses. New Jersey's MA is Cardinal Tobin of the Archdiocese Newark. When the 5 Ordinaries of the State of New Jersey meet [the main Bishop of each of New Jersey's five



Dioceses: Newark, Trenton, Paterson, Camden and Metuchen] *MA* takes the lead and directs all their deliberations. Where do *palliums* come from?

Since at least the 5th Century, two lambs are blessed by the Pope on Saint Agnes Day, January 21; on Holy Thursday their wool is removed and woven into the palliums which the Pope blesses the following June 29: The Solemnity of the Apostles Peter and Paul. During a Mass at Saint Peter Basilica the Pope used to put a *pallium* on each new *MA* as a sign of his unity with Rome. In 2015, Pope Francis 'tweaked' this tradition: the Pope now HANDS a pallium to each new MA which is placed on his shoulders in his own cathedral by his country's apostolic nuncio or papal ambassador as a sign of unity between the MA and the Dioceses he oversees. Ever ancient, ever new! Saint Agnes, Virgin & Martyr pray for us and for the unity of the Church!




