A COMMUNAL ANOINTING OF THE SICK A BLESSING OF HEALTH CARE PROFESSIONALS At Mass SATURDAY, FEBRUARY 8, 2020, at 9:30am

We will celebrate the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick at Mass: Saturday February 8th at 9:30am.

Anointing "is not a sacrament for only those who are at the point of death" but is intended for all those who are seriously ill. Consequently, what we formerly called "Extreme Unction" is now more properly called "The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick".


More has changed than the sacrament's name. Our experience of the revised Sacrament of the Anointing has brought about a change in the way we think about the sacrament. For example: 1) This sacrament (like all sacraments) is a community celebration; 2) sickness involves more than bodily illness; and 3) anointing heals us through faith.

Offering the sacrament before one is in the final moments of life affords the patient a better opportunity to appreciate the prayers and symbols of the rite. Also, in light of a shortage of priestly vocations and increasing demands on the priest's time, a priest may not be immediately available at the final moments of life.

The grace of the sacrament has the following effects: the uniting of the sick person to the passion of Christ for his or her own good and for that of the whole Church; the strengthening, peace, and courage to endure in a Christian manner the sufferings of illness or old age; the restoration of health, if it is conducive to the salvation of his soul; and preparation for the passing from this life to eternal life (Catechism 1532). At this time, we will also extend a blessing to all medical personnel, health care workers and caregivers.

Finally, we would ask that those who wish to be anointed call the parish office at 732-270-3980 to register and to arrive with their caregivers about 20 minutes before the start of the Mass. There will be people available to write your name on a label so the priest will know your name when he comes to you.

From the Pastor 3rd Sunday In Ordinary Time - A January 26, 2020

ABRACADABRA!

Magicians are known to use the word 'abracadabra' as they perform their tricks, but did you know it is an ancient and potent word? We have proof it has existed in Latin since the 4th Century, and is of Hebrew or Aramaic origin. Its literal translation, "it

will be created by my word," explains why enchanters say it as they 'make magic.' And it played a part in helping the man we honor this week, *Saint John Bosco*, win over young boys for Christ.

Born on August 16, 1815, near Turin, Italy, *Don Bosco*, as he is also called, died in 1888 on what is now his Feast Day: *January 31*. Ordained a Priest in 1841, he was canonized, appropriately [according to our current calendar] on April Fools' Day: April 1, 1934, which was also Easter that year. However, as his story shows, he did not become a Saint by magic or by simply playing the fool. After praying the Collect for the holy Mass offered in his honor, we'll explain.

<u>Collect - Saint John Bosco, Priest</u> O God, who raised up the Priest Saint John Bosco as a father and teacher of the young, grant, we pray, that, aflame with the same fire of love, we may seek out souls and serve you alone. Through our Lord Jesus ... for ever and ever. Amen.

AGAINST ALL ODDS. The world in which Father Bosco lived was stern and strict, black or white. Some were deemed 'good,' deserving of every blessing; others were deemed 'bad,' deserving of every punishment. With no child labor laws or social services to care for orphans, many boys lived on the streets. As the Industrial Revolution turned towns like Turin into factory meccas, boys fled there to earn money so they and their families could afford basic necessities. But with no adult oversight or ethical training, they often became like wild animals - and were treated - by civil and even religious authorities - as

degenerate demons, with no redeeming qualities - until they met *Don Bosco*. When John Bosco was two, his father died,

leaving his mother and two older brothers nearly destitute; yet his mother always offered alms to those worse off than they were. Her tender care for the less fortunate profoundly influenced him; in fact, in 2006, Pope Benedict XVI declared 'Mamma Margarita' Bosco 'Venerable' which put her on the path to Sainthood! By being moved, as Jesus was, by compassion for those written off as hopeless and useless, *Saint John Bosco* intervened in the bleak situation of poor boys in a most unusual, interesting way.

After becoming a Priest, which one brother vehemently opposed, *John* established a 'group home' known as the *Oratory of Saint Francis de Sales,* who eventually became known as the *Salesians. Father Bosco* was a kindly spiritual father to boys in need, and gained their interest, trust and admiration by juggling, doing acrobatics and magic tricks BEFORE giving a talk or sermon or leading them in praying the Rosary. He is often depicted with an image of *Our Lady* due to his strong devotion to our *Blessed Mother.*

His approach to the education and spiritual formation of boys was quite unique for its time. He rejected corporal punishment, sought to remove every near occasion of sin that could lead them astray, and advocated the frequent reception of the Sacraments of *Reconciliation* or *Penance* and of *Holy Communion*. He included sports and other non-academic activities in their educational training, intermingling spiritual and temporal, heavenly and earthly aspects into all he and the boys did. He also provided training in the crafts for those not academically gifted, so they could have self-worth and pride in their ability to support themselves and loved ones.

Don Bosco was never deterred by the challenges he faced: lack of financial means to meet his Order's - and the boys' - many needs; opposition from corrupt business owners who basically enslaved the boys; anti-clerical attitudes; false accusations of abuse; assassination attempts; etc. Yet, against all odds, he became the Patron Saint of young people, apprentices, and Catholic publishers and editors. *Saint John Bosco, Priest, pray for usl*






