

From the Pastor 5th Sunday in Ordinary Time - C February 10, 2019

A WOMAN OF GREAT ACTION. We know almost nothing about Saint Scholastica, but we do know a great deal about her twin

brother, *Saint Benedict*, who was born in 480 and died in 547. He died on March 21, which would always put his Feast Day in Lent or Holy Week, so the 1969 liturgical reforms moved it to July 11. He is still known for his compendium of policies governing proper monastic life, aptly called 'The Rule of Saint Benedict.' But what about his twin sister, whose *Feast Day* is today, *February 10*, which we cannot celebrate, as a Sunday takes precedence over feasts in honor of the Saints, unless it's the Parish's Patron Saint. After praying the Collect for the Mass normally celebrated on her Feast Day, we will explain why Saint Scholastica is still so important to us today - even though we 'modern,' 'active' people seem to have little in common with a contemplative Nun from the Middle Ages.

Collect - Saint Scholastica, Virgin

As we celebrate anew the memorial of the Virgin Saint Scholastica, we pray, O Lord, that, following her example, we may serve you with pure love and happily receive what comes from loving you. Through our Lord Jesus ... forever and ever. Amen.

MORE THAN A CUTE STORY. Perhaps the most widely known story about the sibling twin Saints is their last conversation, just days before Saint Scholastica died. As was customary, and still is, in monasteries, men and women lived, worked and even prayed at totally separate sites. It was the siblings' custom to visit with each other once a year, at a place near, but outside, *Saint Benedict 's* monastery's gate. After praying and reflecting on holy things together, they would retire to their respective monasteries before nightfall. But one time, Saint Scholastica wanted to continue conversing with her brother, who became anxious about returning to his cell and ignored her requests to stay longer. So, she bowed her head and prayed for rain; immediately the skies burst open in a torrential downpour that made it impossible for **Saint Benedict** and his confrères to leave.

Pious legend, based on historical facts, suggests this stormy night prayer meeting between the two Saints took place on *February 7, 547*, the Thursday before the *Lenten* fast which, back then, was quite severe! Three days later, while back in his cell, *Saint Benedict* saw a *dove* flying toward heaven and interpreted this as a sign that his sister had died. [Her images usually depict her with a dove.] *Saint Benedict* was correct; she was dead, and the third day after their 'last supper' - *February 10* - has long been *Saint Scholastica's* Feast Day. What can we learn from this story?

LISTEN CAREFULLY ... WITH THE EAR OF ... THE HEART. The prologue of *The Rule of Saint*Benedict begins with this sagacious advice, to not just listen, but to listen with the ear of one's heart. Ironically, Saint Benedict was so concerned about keeping the monastery custom of never staying outside one's cell that his heart could not hear what would be one of his sister's last wishes: to spend quality time with her brother. How often do we 'break' this 'first rule' by allowing 'life' to get in the way of truly living?

WELL-BALANCED SPIRITUAL LIFE. Eastern philosophies and decorators strive to keep the 'Yin/Yana' The in balance. 'Yin' ['shady' side] and masculine 'Yang' ['sunny' side] complete each other, leading to perfect balance. [Editor's note: I am not being a sexist; that is the Chinese root of these words!] But the Christian faith also promotes this harmonious balance. We see it in Luke 10:38-42: Mary, the 'contemplative' one, sat at Jesus' feet to listen to Him, while her sister *Martha*, the 'active' one fussed over dinner. In John 21:21-23, Jesus told Peter to be active in feeding and tending the flock until he was also crucified, and not to be concerned about John, who would die of natural causes, and reflected on the Gospel until he died of old age. We see it in our Blessed *Mother*, who <u>actively</u> cared for *Jesus* and Joseph, yet "kept all these things, reflecting on them in her heart." [Luke 2:19] And we see it in Saints Scholastica and Benedict, who once shared the same tomb. May the patron of rain and *storms*, *Saint Scholastica*, *pray for us!*

Pre-registration is required so we can ensure we have enough soup and salad for all who attend. Please return registration forms to the parish office by Friday, March 1, 2019.



# World Day of the Sick— Communal Anointing of the Sick and Day of Prayer for Health Care Workers

We will celebrate the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick at Mass: Saturday February 16<sup>th</sup> Time: 2:00pm

Anointing "is not a sacrament for only those who are at the point of death" but is intended for all those who are seriously ill. Consequently, what we formerly called "Extreme Unction" is now more properly called "The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick".

More has changed than the sacrament's name. Our experience of the revised Sacrament of the Anointing has brought about a change in the way we think about the sacrament. For example: 1) This sacrament (like all sacraments) is a community celebration; 2) sickness involves more than bodily illness; and 3) anointing heals us through faith.

Offering the sacrament before one is in the final moments of life affords the patient a better opportunity to appreciate the prayers and symbols of the rite. Also, in light of a shortage of priestly vocations and increasing demands on the priest's time, a priest may not be immediately available at the final moments of life.

The grace of the sacrament has the following effects: the uniting of the sick person to the passion of Christ for his or her own good and for that of the whole Church; the strengthening, peace, and courage to endure in a Christian manner the sufferings of illness or old age; the restoration of health, if it is conducive to the salvation of his soul; and preparation for the passing from this life to eternal life (Catechism 1532). At this time, we will also extend a blessing to all medical personnel, health care workers and caregivers. Finally, we would ask that those who wish to be anointed call the parish office at 732-270-3980 to register and to arrive with their caregivers approximately 20 minutes before the start of the Mass. There will be people available to write your name on an index card which your caregiver will give to the priest when he comes to anoint you.
