

From the Pastor 1st Sunday of Lent - A March 1, 2020

PRAY: FAST: GIVE ALMS. In **Lent** we are urged to keep the three traditional **Lenten** pious practices of **Prayer**, **Fasting** and **Almsgiving**. As the motto for this year's **Operation Rice Bowl** almsgiving campaign, 'For Lent for Life,' suggests: all we do

during Lent - should - and can - give life! And in Part 2 of our reflection on the two sets of Mass orations to be used In Time of Famine or for Those Suffering Hunger we are challenged to become bread for others. Here are the three Mass orations for set B.

<u>Collect - For Those Suffering Hunger - B</u> O God, who did not create death and who provide food for all living things, drive out, in your compassion, the hunger of your servants, that our hearts may serve you with greater readiness and joy. Through our Lord Jesus ... for ever and ever. Amen.

WE MUST SHARE GOD'S GIFTS. One of the first mantras we hear as children, even as infants, is, "SHARE!" This seems to be a lesson we never fully learn. Having four siblings, everything I had to share left very little for <u>me</u> ... but, obviously, I did not starve to death! Nor did I 'do without' any of the other creature comforts I 'had' to share with others. In fact, the more I shared with others, the more they shared with me. And yet stinginess, self-centeredness, and fear of not having enough for '#1' still haunts most of us. Such is the side effect of Original Sin, which we can - and must - combat with sacramental grace.

May those who will be washed clean of sin through the **Sacrament of Baptism** this **Easter** and those who are already baptized, and who can be rewashed of sin through the **Sacrament of Penance** [aka **Confession** or **Reconciliation**], be given divine assistance in overcoming all

human weaknesses. For as this Collect assures us: God ... did not create death;" nor does God "take pleasure in the death of the wicked, but rather that they turn from their ways and live." [Cf. Ezekiel 33:11b] What must we do to turn and to live a more self-less, self-giving, generous life? Prayer Over/Offerings - Those Suffering Hunger - B

To you, O Lord, we gladly offer these gifts from the little we have, humbly imploring your kindness that they may be for us the first fruits of your life-giving generosity. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

FIRST FRUITS. Some say the term 'first fruits' simply means giving a 'tithe' [10%] of one's 'take' in grateful thanks; but 'first fruits' are not just any 10%; they are the FIRST 10% [or more!] of one's **INITIAL** income, given **BEFORE** any of it is used for anything else. It is an act of total trust that what God has given us is just the beginning! In this oration, 'first fruits' refers to the sacred mysteries by which what we offer to God is returned to us a hundredfold. We offer bread and wine; we receive Christ's Body and Blood. We finance the Church and her ministries; we gain heavenly rewards for caring for others. We part with our tangible, earthly goods; we gain God's grace and blessing. What 'first fruits' will we offer to God and His Church this Lent?

Prayer after Communion - Those Suffering Hunger - B

Having received the Bread of heaven from your abundance, O Lord, we pray that it may give us such hope and strength for our labor, that we may provide effectively for our own needs and for those of our brothers and sisters. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

HOPE & STRENGTH VIA HEAVENLY FOOD. To help us become more like Jesus, He literally enters into us as the "Bread from heaven." We are then sent back into the world to be 'food for the hungry.' The worst hunger of all is the **SPIRITUAL** hunger endured by those starving for the hope and peace, guidance and direction only God's Word and the Sacraments can give. However, as the Apostle said: "If a brother or sister has nothing to wear and has no food for the day, and one of you says to them, 'Go in peace, keep warm, and eat well,' but you do not give them the necessities of the body, what good is it?" [James 2:15-16] What can we do this Lent to alleviate the needs of others, to be the presence of the Christ we receive in Word and the Sacraments, to be 'bread for the world?'

Be sure to attend this week's Parish Mission. You will be grateful that you did!


