
### St. Justin the Martyr Roman Catholic Church

### First Reading: Genesis 15:5-12, 17-18

### Second Reading: Philippians 3:17-4:1, or 3:20-4:1



From the Pastor 2nd Sunday of Lent - C March 17, 2019

WHAT? WHY NO WEARING OF THE GREEN AT HOLY MASS TODAY? This may shock some, be an outrage and blasphemy to others ... but the liturgical color for Saint

Patrick's Day is NEVER GREEN; it's either ROYAL PURPLE when it's in LENT or WHITE when it's a Solemnity, as it is in Saint Patrick's Cathedral and all of Ireland ... but not this year, since it falls on a Sunday in Lent! [I'm sure some clergy will violate this norm, Saints preserve us; of course, the laity can keep the custom of 'the wearin' of the green' today - but all who celebrate Saint Patrick's Day should know something about this popular Saint.

Sadly, just as *Saint Valentine* went down the secular sewer and is all but forgotten on his Feast Day, poor *Saint Patrick* gets lost in the parties, parades, politics - and, dare I say - *green beer* that flows in his 'honor'. After praying the Collect from the Mass in his honor, which may be used to close the Universal Prayer this weekend, we'll review the life of the man who died in or around 461 on what is now his Feast Day, *March 17* ... and the reason why he's such a great Saint!

### Collect - Saint Patrick, Bishop

O God, who chose the Bishop Saint Patrick to preach your glory to the peoples of Ireland, grant, through his merits and intercession, that those who glory in the name of Christian may never cease to proclaim your wondrous deeds to all.

Through our Lord Jesus ... forever and ever. Amen.

SAINT PATRICK: THE MAN & THE LEGEND. Like many Saints of the Church's first millennium, there are countless legends and stories about Saint Patrick. Did he drive all snakes from Ireland, when other islands, like Hawaii, also have no snakes? Probably not. Was he the first to bring Christianity to pagan Ireland? No. Was he Irish by birth? No; he was born in Britain and lived at times in France. Did he use three-leaf shamrocks to explain the Trinity? Perhaps, but no records show he did that. Was Patrick his baptismal name? No. It was Maewyn Succat, he adopted Patrick or Patricius upon becoming a Priest.

WHO WAS THE 'REAL' SAINT PATRICK? We cannot say anything with absolute certainty about him. Sources list his birth year as in the late 300's or early 400's; he died on what is now his Feast Day: March 17 in or after 461. He was probably born in what is now Scotland, as Roman forces were withdrawing from Britain. As a teenager, he was captured by Irish slave traders who brought him to *Ireland's* west coast, where he tended sheep for six years. It was there that the non-religious, perhaps atheistic youth, heard 'voices' and had 'visions' which led him to embrace Christianity. We know this from his autobiography - his 'Confessios' - in which he also admitted that, as a Bishop, some of his vile sins of 30 years earlier were still being thrown in his face; he dismissed his critics by saying he had long since 'confessed' and did penance for them! [These days, he'd probably be removed from Priesthood for whatever 'sins' he had committed!]

**SAINT PATRICK'S MINISTRY.** Having felt called by 'visions' and 'voices' to serve Christ, Saint Patrick broke free from slavery, walked 200 miles to the Irish coast and sailed back to his family. Eventually he went to France where he entered a seminary, was ordained a Priest, and at 43, a Bishop. Returning to then mostly pagan Ireland, he began to promote Christianity with great success AND with fierce opposition. He established dioceses all throughout *Ireland*, ordained many Priests, and sought to bring peace and justice to that still troubled land. In the only other authentic work of his we still have - his 'Letter to the Soldiers of Coroticus' - he excommunicated the British tyrant Coroticus for indiscriminately slaughtering the inhabitants of an Irish town, among whom were some newly baptized, still wearing their white garments and on whom the Sacred Oils were still wet!

I am sure *Saint Patrick* is still at work, striving to restore Christianity to *Ireland* where, regretfully, so few now practice the Faith! Besides all the other *'Irish* customs' we keep in his honor, I believe he would be most pleased if we heeded his call to confess and do penance for ours sins! [Our Lenten Penance Service is Friday, April 12 at 7:30 pm.] *Saint Patrick, pray for us!*


