

<u>Reading I: I Samuel 16: 1b, 6-7, 10-13a</u> God chooses David, Jesse's youngest son, to be His anointed one, and Samuel complies. This story also contains an element of fear of Saul.

<u>Reading II: Ephesians 5: 8-14</u> There is a clear contrast made between Christian and pagan life, in terms of light and darkness.

<u>The Gospel: John 9: 1-41</u> The essence of the "sixth sign" is not simply that a man's sight is restored, but that light is given to one who has never had it. The Pharisees ironically illustrate true blindness, not of the eyes but of the heart.



From the Pastor

4th Sunday of Lent - A Laetare [Rejoice] Sunday March 22, 2020

Having passed the 'halfway' mark of *Lent,* we '*lighten up*' with rose colored vestments, flowers and other signs of joy on this *Laetare* or *Rejoicing Sunday.* This week we rejoice in honoring the <u>first</u>

known 'New World' Saint: *Saint Turibius of Mogrovejo, Bishop.*

Born in Spain on November 16, 1538, into a noble family, *Turibius* studied law and became Granada, Spain's chief judge. He was very devoted to the Catholic Faith; even as a child he prayed, fasted and gave to the poor. Since he prayed the Rosary each day and took part in other public *Marian devotions,* he is often depicted praying before an image of our *Blessed Mother,* but he expressed no desire to become a Priest - however ...

His reputation as a faithful, moral, pious Catholic layman 'altered' his plans to continue his judicial duties in Spain. After praying the Collect, used in *Lent* to conclude the *Universal Prayer* on his feast day - *March 23* - in places not named for him or where there's a strong devotion to him, I'll explain the curious way he became the Archbishop of Lima, Peru and the first 'New World' Saint.

Saint Turibius of Mogrovejo, Bishop O God, who gave increase to your Church through the apostolic labors and zeal for truth of the Bishop Saint Turibius, grant that the people consecrated to you may always receive new growth in faith and holiness. Through our Lord Jesus ... for ever and ever. Amen.

THE NEW WORLD NEEDS A GOOD BISHOP! While some colonists who came to the Americas had sinister, self-seeking, ulterior motives, most missionaries came with good intention: to share the Catholic Faith - and its promise of eternal life - with Native Americans. And while, these days, many only focus on the crimes and abuses committed by those with evil intent, much good was accomplished by those who gave up so much to come to the Americas. Among them were *Saint Turibius* and those he confirmed: the future *Saint Rose of Lima* and, according to some

sources, Saint Martin de Porres.

THE LAWYER WHO GOT 'TAKEN.' Church leaders in the 'Old World' knew the 'New World' desperately needed holy Bishops - but, naturally, they wanted to keep their best Priests in Europe. So they asked the layman *Turibius*, who was not even a Deacon or Priest, to leave Spain to be the Archbishop of Lima, Peru; but he cited every canon [Church] law that forbade the giving of such positions to laymen. So they offered to ordain him a Deacon, Priest and Bishop in one ceremony - and he accepted his 'calling.'

IT WAS EVEN WORSE THAN HE IMAGINED! He began his service as chief shepherd by reaching out to the many sheep who had been abused, misused or ignored by the foreign clergy sent to help them. He disciplined those who took advantage of the natives, which made him hated by corrupt clergy and laity. He embarked on a seven-year journey, mostly on foot, to visit every Parish in his Diocese, teaching, preaching and celebrating the Sacraments in each place he visited. And he founded the first seminary in the Americas to provide native-born Priests.

HE GAVE ORDINARY WITNESS TO HIS FAITH.

Interestingly, *Saint Turibius* did not do anything <u>EXTRAORDINARY</u> or <u>EARTH-SHATTERING</u>; he simply lived out his Catholic Faith in everyday, ordinary ways - which drew many to him and to the Church. He regularly confessed his sins; he actively participated in daily Mass; he celebrated the Sacraments with devotion and fervor; he strove to better understand all that he taught and celebrated; he accepted whatever those he served could afford to offer; and he <u>respectfully</u> challenged all who failed to attain the ideal.

<u>A HUMBLE SAINT</u>. During his long, arduous visitation of his immense Archdiocese, he strove to learn the languages and dialects of his diverse flock. To shun praise and attention, he supported the poor <u>anonymously</u>. He had no plans or desire to get ordained, yet accepted God's call as it came to him through Church leaders. Admitting his limitations, he accepted help from another missionary, *Saint Francis Solanus*, who was canonized in 1726, and whose feast day is *July 14. Saint Turibius of Mogrovejo, Bishop, pray for us!*

Though there is a sadness for not being able to participate at Holy Mass, one should not feel guilty for not going to Mass when it is necessary to stay home for the health and safety of all. However, we should all spend time in prayer in these difficult and challenging times.

If we are not able to attend Mass, we can still unite ourselves to the Eucharist through making a spiritual Communion. By making an Act of Spiritual Communion, we express our faith in Christ's Real Presence in the Eucharist and ask him to unite himself with us. Here is the Act of Spiritual Communion written by St. Alphonsus de Liguori:

> My Jesus, I believe that You are present in the Most Holy Sacrament. I love You above all things, and I desire to receive You into my soul. Since I cannot at this moment receive You sacramentally, come at least spiritually into my heart. I embrace You as if You were already there and unite myself wholly to You. Never permit me to be separated from You. Amen.

We have canceled our Religious Education classes for two weeks starting March 16th and have cancelled all social activities until further notice. Finally, let us pray for all those affected by the coronavirus pandemic and may the Divine Physician restore us quickly to health, peace and normalcy. God Bless you all!
