Reflection on Todays' Readings

"Reproach of Egypt" may refer to circumcision. The people celebrate the Passover, here an older version that did not include the sacrifice of the lamb.

Second Reading: II Corinthians 5:17-21

Paul tells his readers that not only has God reconciled humanity to Himself, but He has also entrusted the reconciling mission of Christ to us.

Gospel: Luke 15:1-3, 11-32

This is perhaps Our Lord's greatest parable. It illustrates several lessons, above all the forgiveness of the father for his younger son's waywardness and his older son's self-righteousness.

Through the gift of the internet, we have access to almost limitless data and endless jokes - literally right at our fingertips - like this silly joke that I hope and pray tickles you ... pink. [Pastor's disclaimer: our Altar Servers are far smarter

than these two ... for our Altar Servers know why we wear rose!

A VERY, VERY BUSY PATRON SAINT OF THE

INTERNET. In what may be a 'Church first,' the Patron Saint of the Internet seems to have been chosen by popular acclaim - via - of all things the internet! In 2005, Pope Saint John Paul II sent out a message seeking suggestions for an 'Internet Patron Saint.' The great biblical communicator, *Saint Paul the Apostle*, was quite popular among the 'voters,' as was Saint Anthony of Padua, who composed or collected volumes of written material ... but Saint Isidore of Seville, Bishop & Doctor of the Church, got the most hits! Born in 560, he died in 636 on what is now his Feast Day: April 4. [Do NOT confuse him with Saint Isidore the Farmer, Feast Day: May 15; who is one of the Patron Saints of ... Farmers.] Why was Saint Isidore of Seville the **Patron Saint of the Internet?** After praying the Collect for his Mass, we'll explain.

Saint Isidore, Bishop and Doctor of the Church

Graciously hear the prayers, O Lord, which we make in commemoration of Saint Isidore that your Church may be aided by his intercession, just as she has been instructed by his heavenly teaching.

Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

A FAMILY OF SAINTS. Imagine having 3 siblings declared Saints, two of whom were also Bishops! Saint Isidore's sister, Saint Florentina, who died about 612 and whose Feast Day is June 20, was a nun who founded and headed many convents. One of his brothers, Saint Fulgentius, died in 533 on what is now his Feast Day: January 1,

though some honor him on January 3. *Saint Fulgentius* spent 25 years as a Bishop fiercely fighting heretics. His other brother, *Saint Leander*, who mandated the profession of the Creed at Mass in the late 500's, was the Bishop of Seville, Spain; after his death *Saint Isidore* then headed that same diocese for 38 years.

There are more than 200 *Saints* with a Feast Day on the Universal Calendar, not counting *Marian* days and countless *'Companions'* remembered with certain *Martyrs*, but many of these 200 Feast Days are optional or limited to their native country; i.e.: *Saint Elizabeth Ann Seton* is only on the USA's calendar. Of the four sibling *Saints*, only *Saint Isidore* has a date on our Calendar; I hope there's no sibling rivalry in heaven! What a holy family, to have produced four *Saints*!

SAINT ISIDORE'S 'ETYMOLOGIES.' His greatest work, which earned him, two decades after his death, in 653, the title Doctor of the Church, was a compilation of word origins and their historical development called 'Etymologies.' It was the first 'Christian' encyclopedia, which gave the Catholic 'twist' or understanding, not only to biblical and ecclesial [Church] matters, but to secular topics as well. It was, in a way, the birth of the marriage of Catholic theology with the rest of the world. Saint Isidore's vast work was a literal storehouse in which he gathered, systematized, and condensed all of the learning possessed by his time - both religious and secular. And it remained the 'textbook' 'prooftext' source used in many educational institutions throughout much of the Middle Ages.

As academically scholarly as he was, Saint Isidore also made time to care for the poor and needy, thus combining the Church's educational, formation and social outreaches. May we never get so busy 'surfing the web' that we fail to make time to care for those around us. And may we use the internet's plethora of data to make our world a better place - and not succumb to its darker side, which has become such a commonly confessed sin in Confession! [Our Penance Service is Friday, April 12, at 7:00 pm.] Whenever we log on, may we always pray: Saint Isidore, Patron Saint of the Internet, pray for us!


