

Reflections on Today's Readings by Rev. Leonard N. Peterson

First Reading: Isaiah 50:4-7

Here we have a direct reference in the Old Testament to the future sufferings of Jesus in the New. With God the Father as His help, Jesus does not "shield His face from buffets and spitting."

Second Reading: Philippians 2:6-11

The beautiful ancient hymn describing Jesus, which St. Paul quotes here, was composed independently of the Epistle. From her beginning, the Church has always recognized the humility practiced by the Second Person of the Blessed Trinity.

The Passion Narrative: Luke 22:14-23:56

Jesus' farewell speech at a meal opens St. Luke's passion narrative, followed by all those depictions of Jesus' suffering and the disciples' disloyalty at this crucial time. Meanwhile, Jesus continues to associate with sinners, even from the cross. His splendid vindication awaits.



From the Pastor
Palm Sunday
of the Passion of the Lord - C
April 14, 2019

THE MYSTERY OF THE HOLY CROSS. The orations offered at all Masses this first day of Holy Week are for Palm Sunday of the Passion of the Lord. However, there is a Votive Mass entitled 'The Mystery of the Holy Cross' for use

in **Ordinary Time** to help us delve into the awesome reality of Christ's suffering and death for US! As we prepare to enter into the shortest and most intense liturgical time: the **Sacred Triduum** or **Great Three Days**, let us use the various 'angles' provided by the three orations from this Votive Mass to prayerfully consider Christ crucified.

Collect - The Mystery of the Holy Cross

O God, who willed that your
Only Begotten Son should undergo the Cross
to save the human race, grant, we pray, that we,
who have known his mystery on earth, may merit the grace of his redemption in heaven.
Through our Lord Jesus ... forever and ever. Amen.

ATONEMENT & REDEMPTION. By paying the price for our sins, Jesus reconciled us to the Father; however, the graces Jesus won for us do not work by magic or without our participation in them! Just as a winning million-dollar lottery ticket holder's life does not change until the ticket is 'redeemed' or 'cashed in,' Christ's salvific Death cannot change us until we accept it for ourselves. One primary way to do this is by actively participating in the events of Holy Week.

On Good Friday, all who participate in the 3 pm Celebration of Our Lord's Passion and Death will be invited to come forward and, with the simplest of gestures: a kiss or bow, a genuflection or touch of the Wood of the Cross, thank Jesus for atoning for our sins. Will you be among those who publicly come forward to give thanks?

<u>Prayer over the Offerings - Mystery of the Holy Cross</u>

May this oblation, O Lord, which on the altar of the Cross canceled the offense of the whole world, cleanse us, we pray, of all our sins.

Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

ALTAR OF THE CROSS. In Preface V of Easter, we proclaim that Jesus "brought the sacrifices of old to fulfillment in the reality of the Cross" and "showed himself the Priest, the Altar, and the Lamb of sacrifice." Volumes could literally be written about each one of these vivid, biblical and profound images of what was won for us in the Mystery of the Cross. Or you could just come to Holy Thursday's 7:00 pm Evening Mass of the Lord's Supper to see how the sacred liturgy makes these images come alive in that moving, once-a-year, special celebration.

At that Mass we proclaim two main biblical sources for the Eucharist: the Sacrifice of the Passover Lamb, and the earliest record of the Mass from Saint Paul's Letter to the Corinthians. Then we make it come alive: the Altar is set and special prayers are prayed, but after Holy Communion, the Eucharist is not returned to the tabernacle as usual. Instead, it is borne in solemn procession to the Place of Repose, just as Jesus left the Upper Room after the Last Supper, to pray in the Garden before His arrest. Solemn Adoration continues until 10:30 pm Night Prayer, and then some 'keep watch' through the night and until the Eucharist is consumed during the main Good Friday Service. Don't miss it!

Prayer after Communion - Mystery of the Holy Cross

Having been nourished by your holy banquet, we beseech you, Lord Jesus Christ, to bring those you have redeemed by the wood of your lifegiving Cross to the glory of the resurrection. Who live and reign for ever and ever. Amen.

RESURRECTION. After Saturday's nightfall, we begin to celebrate Christ's Resurrection. We defiantly stand in the darkness around a new fire, and then transform the tomblike church into the bright light of Christ, risen among us, in a brief candlelight service. After proclaiming some highpoints of salvation history, culminating in the Easter Gospel, we welcome our newest members through Baptism, Confirmation and First Eucharist. Come to the 7:30 pm Easter Vigil, the main Mass of the year!

FAST AND ABSTINENCE GUIDELINES

Those 14 and older are to ABSTAIN from meat on Ash Wednesday and all Lenten Fridays. Those between 18 and 59 should FAST by eating only one main meal and two smaller ones on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Those unable to abstain or fast for a valid reason [i.e., St. Patrick's Day party or wedding may abstain on another day or perform a different penance; Canon law only permits PASTORS to dispense from fasting or abstaining. Ignoring penitential days, without good cause, is a serious sin of omission. Our Bishops ask us to abstain from meat on Friday all year long for Pro-Life causes and world peace.
