



From the Pastor 2nd Sunday of Easter - C April 28, 2019

THE 'SUCCESSFUL FAILURE' SAINT. Since the eight days of the Octave of Easter outrank all Feasts, Memorials and other days, we cannot celebrate the Mass in honor of those whose

feast days fall in this privileged time. April 28 is the feast day of <u>two</u> Saints, both of whom were Priests: *Saint Peter Chanel*, the focus of this article, and *Saint Louis Grignion de Montfort*. The expression, 'To Jesus through Mary', is attributed to *Saint Louis Grignion de Montfort*, who will fittingly be the focus of <u>next</u> week's article, on the first Sunday in May: the month devoted to our *Blessed Mother*.

It is also fitting that we conclude this year's Easter Octave on the feast day of a man who, like Jesus, after enduring the Cross, brought new life to so many: Saint Peter Chanel. Born in 1803 in France, this intellectually, academically gifted, pious man longed, even as a child, to serve the Lord in the mission territories in the-then totally pagan South Pacific Isles. In the hopes of fulfilling his dream to be a missionary, he joined an Order that sent Priests to foreign missions: the *Marists,* then called the Society of Mary, when he was 28. Almost immediately he endured the first of countless hardships and setbacks in his ministry; in the end, he died, as Jesus did: as what seemed - at the time - to be a dismal failure. After praying the Collect from the Mass offered in his honor, we will tell ... the rest of the story.

Collect - Saint Peter Chanel, Priest and Martyr O God, who for the spreading of your Church crowned Saint Peter Chanel with martyrdom, grant that, in these days of paschal joy, we may so celebrate the mysteries of Christ's Death and Resurrection as to bear worthy witness to newness of life. Through our Lord Jesus Christ ... and ever. Amen.

A SAINT WHO WAS A SUCCESSFUL FAILURE.

It seems the future Saint was the victim of his own success. He began his religious studies to become, as I and Father Tom are, <u>Diocesan</u> Priests, and spent his first three years of

Priesthood as the Pastor of a rundown, lifeless country parish that he so enlivened, he caught the eye of diocesan officials. Sensing they would never send him to the missions, he joined the newly-formed *Marists*, who were so impressed with his academic abilities, his superiors also did <u>not</u> send him to the missions; they assigned him to teach at their seminary for five years.

In 1836, his dream began to come true; the *Marists*, having been given some South Pacific Islands to evangelize, appointed *Saint Peter Chanel* the Superior of a little band of missionaries sent to proclaim the Faith to its inhabitants. After a ten-month-long, treacherous journey, they arrived at the islands, and he went off, with his companions, to the Island of Futuna in Fiji - whose king has only recently forbidden cannibalism! He was only sent there for a mere six months - but he ended up staying there for five years.

Life on such tropical islands was no paradise; he faced loneliness and fatigue, sickness and disease; he struggled to learn their language, and dealt with corrupt colonizers, whalers, traders, and warring natives. Despite little apparent success and severe want, disappointment and distrust, he maintained a serene and gentle spirit. While the king permitted him to baptize the new natives who requested it, he became enraged when his own son sought Baptism. On the night of April 28, 1841, the king - fearful of losing his prestigious position as high priest and monarch, sent some warriors to Father Peter Chanel's hut, where they clubbed him to death and cut up his body with hatchets. In the eyes of this world he died a total, complete FAILURE.

News quickly spread around the islands of the brutal, violent murder of this kindhearted, gentle, helpful Priest. So many were so moved by this 'tragedy' that - as some reports say within a mere 5 months the entire island was Catholic - and has remained so to this day. [A report from 2018 records the island as **99%** Roman Catholic!] So, in the eyes of God, **Saint Peter Chanel** was a total and complete <u>SUCCESS</u>!

May all that we see as a failure become, with God's grace, a success! *Saint Peter Chanel, pray for us.* Happy Easter, Alleluia, Alleluia, Alleluia!


