

From the Pastor 5th Sunday of Easter - A May 10, 2020 Mother's Day

HONOR YOUR BLESSED MOTHER! This week, on May 13, we honor our Blessed Mother under her title 'Our Lady of Fatima.' The Church does not require us to accept apparitions; in fact, she more often rules <u>against</u> a purported apparition if it, in any

way, is contrary to our Faith. No valid apparition: contradicts the Gospel; adds anything to what God has already revealed; or profits a visionary or those promoting it. This was <u>not</u> the case in *Fatima*, Portugal, on the 13th day of each month, from May to October, in1917.

Our Lady appeared six times to young Francisco and Jacinta and their cousin, Lucia, entrusting three main messages to them - of which only one became 'famous.' The so-called 'Third Secret of Fatima' is a misnomer: the first two messages were not secrets, and the third message was more of a private revelation concerning 'a bishop in white' of which there are many, as clerics in warm climates often wear white cassocks. However, even skeptics have to admit that what *Our Lady* foretold' not only came true; the reasons she gave for her 'predictions' are also, sadly, very, very true. More about the three revelations at *Fatima* after praying the Collect for her *Feast Day:* the anniversary of the First Apparition: May 13.

Collect - Our Lady of Fatima

O God, who chose the Mother of your Son to be our Mother also, grant us that, persevering in penance and prayer for the salvation of the world we may further more effectively each day the reign of Christ. Who lives and reigns ... for ever and ever. Amen.

THE FIRST 'SECRET:' HELL'S ETERNAL FIRE. In a series of apocalyptic visions, *Our Lady* showed the three children the just punishment and horrific penalty for our sins: the eternal, tormenting fires of Hell. As the Catholic Catechism teaches: while God does not desire *"that any should perish but that all should come* to repentance," [2 Peter 3:9c], Jesus did warn us about *"the unquenchable fire"* [Mark 9:43] and *"the eternal* punishment" [Matthew 25:46] that awaits those who ignore the hungry or thirsty, the stranger or naked, the ill or imprisoned. And like all good mothers, who warn their children not to become dangerously presumptuous and overly assured of their Father's forgiveness, our *Blessed Mother*, out of love for us, showed the visionaries the dreadful fate of unrepentant, mortal sinners.

THE SECOND 'SECRET:' FAITH OR FIASCO. Our Lady of Fatima also foresaw the fearful fallout of faithless societies: the disintegration of the family; the disrespect for life; the decrease in ethics and morals; etc. Many know she asked for reparations for sins against her *Son* and her *Immaculate Heart* and for prayers for the Conversion of Russia. So the Fatima Decade Prayer, "*O my Jesus, forgive us our sins, save us* from the fires of hell, and lead all souls to heaven, especially those in most need of Thy mercy." was added to the *Rosary*. Before we condemn Communist Russia or her wicked stepsister, Communist China, is not the same fearful fallout of faithlessness in the USA? Our Blessed Mother was on to something ... and we'd better pay heed!

THE THIRD 'SECRET:' VILE PERSECUTION. While the third message was not publicly disclosed until May 13, 2000, at least two Popes [and others] had read the letter written by Sister Lucia, who died at age 97 on February 13, 2005, but kept it 'classified.' There were many rumors about its content: was it the Doomsday date? A description of a nuclear WWIII? Was it, as some comedians suggested, the bill for the Last Supper? It turned out NOT to be a laughing matter.

COINCIDENCE OR DIVINE PROVIDENCE? As the world watched in horror, during one of his hundreds of 'Popemobile' rounds through *Saint Peter Square*, Pope, now *Saint John Paul II*, was nearly assassinated: hit by two bullets at close range. The date: *May 13*, 1981: *The Feast of Our Lady of Fatima;* he said *Our Lady* saved his life: *"one hand pulled the trigger, another guided the bullet."* One year later, as a pilgrim to *Fatima*, he had the bullet that nearly ended his life placed in the crown of the statue of *Our Lady of Fatima*!

Happy *Mother's Day* to all earthly mothers - and to our *Blessed Mother*. Father Dan and I continue to offer the sacrifice of Mass for all our parish families during this pandemic and hope we will soon be together at the altar.
