

From the Pastor 4th Sunday of Easter - C May 12, 2019 Good Shepherd Sunday

PRAY FOR RELIGIOUS

VOCATIONS. Since the 4th
Sunday of Easter's Gospel
is always about the Good
Shepherd, so it is also the
World Day of Prayer for
Vocations. Today's
Vocation article focuses
on the need to pray for
those considering God's
call to the Religious Life.
How is Religious Life

different from <u>Diocesan</u> Priests like me and Father Tom?

DIOCESAN Priests merely make *promises*: of obedience to our *local* Bishop who can assign us anywhere within that Diocese; to celibacy or not marrying; to a *personal* prayer life; and to live as the people we serve do. In God's *higher* call to **RELIGIOUS Life**, Priests, Brothers and Sisters vow to live: in *chastity;* in a *communal* prayer life; to obey their Superior who can send them anywhere their Order serves; and to poverty or owning nothing personally. Each Order has its own charism or style; Franciscans follow Saint Francis' care for the poor; Dominicans, Saint Dominic's style of preaching; Jesuits, Saint Ignatius of Loyola's rule for academics and service, etc. we will offer other points about *Religious Life* after each of the three orations for Masses celebrated for an increase of Vocations to the Religious Life.

Collect - For Vocations to Religious Life

Holy Father, who, though urging all the faithful to perfect charity, never cease to prompt many to follow more closely in the footsteps of your Son, grant, we pray, that those you have chosen for this special calling may, by their way of life, show to the Church and the world a clear sign of your Kingdom Through our Lord Jesus Christ ... and ever. Amen.

IN CHRIST'S FOOTSTEPS. In a world so <u>ME</u>-CENTERED, Religious follow in the footsteps of Jesus by taking Him at His word: "Everyone who has given up houses or brothers or sisters or father or mother or children or lands for the sake of my name will receive a hundred times more, and will inherit eternal life." [Matthew 19:29] They gain innumerable siblings - in their brothers or sisters in the Order, and many

possessions and places to live - by sharing all things. They are truly <u>IN</u> the world but not <u>OF</u> the world, as Jesus calls us all to be. While fewer women and men are entering <u>Religious</u> <u>Life LOCALLY</u>, that's <u>not</u> so everywhere. And Orders who have maintained <u>religious garb</u>, strong <u>communal</u> life and a clear <u>Catholic</u> identity, have the most novices and postulants. But they need our prayers and support - and our openness to join them!

Prayer over the Offerings: Vocations to Religious Life
Receive in compassion, holy Father,
the offerings we bring you, and grant
fraternal communion and spiritual freedom
to all who set out joyfully to imitate your Son
by following the narrow way.
Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

IMITATING JESUS. Jesus said of Himself: "Foxes have dens and birds of the sky have nests, but the Son of Man has nowhere to rest his head." [Luke 9:58] By vowing poverty, Religious imitate His total reliance on others to provide their needs. By sharing all they have, they mirror the early Church's communal life: "All who believed were together and had all things in common; they would sell their property and possessions and divide them among all according to each one's need." [Acts 2:44-45] With fewer entering local Orders, they cannot support their retired or infirm members; that's why, each December, we have a Second Collection for Retired Religious.

Prayer after Communion: Vocations to Religious Life

Strengthen your servants, O Lord, with this spiritual food and drink, so that, always faithful to the call of the Gospel, they may make present everywhere the living image of your Son.
Who lives and reigns for ever and ever. Amen.

IMAGES OF JESUS. Our world certainly needs to 'see' an 'image' of Jesus in every Christian; but the most powerful images of Jesus have been seen in Religious. Is God calling you or someone you know to be another Mother Teresa, Francis of Assisi, or one of the countless Religious who serve God and His People? Pray for Vocations to the Religious Life! Father Tom and I extend our best wishes to all mothers for a Happy Mother's Day.
