

From the Pastor 5th Sunday of Easter - C May 19, 2019

THE WISDOM AND STRENGTH OF THE CROSS. This week, on May 22, we have the optional memorial of a Saint who teaches us, by her example, the 'wisdom and strength of the Cross' as we pray in her Collect. Born in 1381 in Umbria, Italy [about 70 miles north of Rome], Margherita Lotti, better known as Saint

Rita of Cascia, felt called by God, even as a child, to enter a convent and Religious Life. Her parents, however, forced her into marriage [which was sadly 'normal' in those days for political and/or economic reasons] to a man named Paolo Mancini with whom she had twin boys. She endured his violent temper, infidelities, and ties to mob-like associates; she even helped him become more Christian. But like the two feuding families of 'Romeo and Juliet' fame: the Capulets and the Montagues, the Mancini family also had a mortal enemy - the Chiquis family. After the Chiquis' assassinated Paolo, his sons vowed to avenge his death. 2All this sounds more like a soap opera than the life of a Saint, and these were just SOME of the crosses God asked Saint Rita to bear! No wonder she is, among other things, the patron saint of sterility, abuse victims, loneliness, marriage difficulties, parenthood, widows, the sick, bodily ills, and wounds. She is also **Saint Jude's** female counterpart: the other patron saint of impossible causes. After praying Saint Rita's Collect, we'll learn more of her inspiring life which can teach us the 'wisdom and strength of the Cross.'

Collect - Saint Rita of Cascia, Religious
Bestow on us, we pray, O Lord, the wisdom
and strength of the Cross, with which you were
pleased to endow Saint Rita, so that,
suffering in every tribulation with Christ,
we may participate ever more deeply
in his Paschal mystery.
Who lives and reigns ... for ever and ever. Amen.

GOD'S EVER MYSTERIOUS WILL. Even though her husband's murder ended some of the crosses she bore because of his angry, sinful deeds, she not only mourned his loss - she prayed for him and performed penances in reparation for his

However, she still feared for her twin boys, who had vowed to avenge their father's death. She dreaded the thought that - if they carried out their murderous plans for revenge they would die in mortal sin. When her sons contracted dysentery [one of many plaques that decimated Italy back then] and both died, she saw - in that tragedy - God's saving hand by which the boys were kept from dying in mortal sin. She also saw these events as signs from God to pursue her lifelong desire to enter Religious Life. Freed from the bonds of marriage by her husband's death, and from her duties to care for her children by her sons' death, she expected her admission into the convent to be a breeze ... but God does not usually work that way, as Saint Rita found out.

The Prioress, afraid that *Saint Rita's* late husband's violent past and ties to the feuding families [some Sisters in that convent were members of the other family], rejected *Saint Rita's* request to join them - unless she was able to end the feud between the two families. A few years later, when a plague afflicted the head of the Mancini family, she ended the feud with the Chiquis Family - and *Saint Rita* was admitted into the convent - at the age of 36.

As a Religious Sister, *Saint Rita* was exemplary in her prayer life and service to the poor. She was so devoted to the Lord's Passion, which was a common devotion in her time, that when she developed a wound on her forehead, many saw it as a 'stigmata' or physical share in the wounds of Christ. She is often depicted with a thorn pressed into her forehead - or a ray shining from a crucifix to her head. After suffering from tuberculosis for years, which left her bedridden. she died in 1457, at the age of 76, on what is now her feast day: May 22.

Saint Rita was canonized by Pope Leo XII on May 24, 1900; on the 100th anniversary of her canonization, *Saint John Paul* praised her as "a disciple of the Crucified One" and an "expert in suffering." All who suffer from life's seemingly endless crosses, disappointments, challenges, or impossible situations, should seek the intercession of this great woman! *Saint Rita of Cascia, pray for us.*

PRISON MINISTRY REFLECTION

"I've been in quite a few prisons and still go into at least a couple each week, but there is something about going into New Jersey State Prison in Trenton that still shakes me. It's not fear. It is just that most of the men incarcerated there are doing substantial time in prison. Many will die there. I was there recently with a group called Kenosis. Each year, in April, they host a retreat for about 40 to 60 inmates from Thursday evening through Sunday afternoon. It is grueling for the volunteers...2 hours on Thursday, 10 hours on Friday, 12 hours on Saturday and 8 hours on Sunday. I did the whole thing once and in the following years I went in for either a Friday or Saturday. It is great

because the team of volunteers, about 15 men, introduce the men to the gospel and begin to develop relationships with the men there. After the retreat is over, smaller (8 or so) groups of volunteers go into the prison on the 1st and 3rd Tuesdays of each month to continue sharing the gospel and building community. There is something about sitting next to a man who is 58 years old and has been incarcerated since he was 19. Or having a conversation with a man who is just beginning a sentence of 50 or 75 years. I don't know how someone without the Lord in his life can make it through that journey or make it through mentally unscathed. Yes, to be handed sentences like that you would have had to do something horrible...but here is the awesome part...if that man, no matter what he has done, surrenders his life to the Lord by accepting Jesus Christ as his Lord & Savior, he is FORGIVEN by God and, once he leaves this earth he will spend eternity in heaven with God. He will still have the practical consequences of his crime/sin (his incarceration), but the God of all creation will have adopted him into his family just like any other person who puts their faith in Jesus. Awesome, just awesome.

My prayer is for the men there (and those in every other prison) who do not know the Lord yet, that they would surrender their lives to the lover of their soul and find REAL FREEDOM even though they are incarcerated. Bill"
