

According to the Common Policy adopted by the Bishops of New Jersey, this preparation requires attendance at a marriage preparation program (Pre-Cana) as well as sessions with the parish deacon or priest. Therefore, couples should make arrangements at the Parish Office one year before the planned wedding date and before finalizing any social plans.

From the Pastor
The Most Holy Body &
Blood of Christ
June 3, 2018

The Book of Ecclesiastes tells us that “there is nothing new under the sun.” As the ‘me-too movement’ and Church Programs like ‘Protecting God’s Children’ have shown,

sinful and sick behavior has been around for ages. In the past, these things were ‘swept under carpet’ or referred to by euphemisms in accord with the expected propriety of the time. These days we know to be on the lookout for those who ‘groom,’ ‘entice,’ ‘segregate’ and then abuse minors; we have professionals and legal officials who will investigate allegations and safeguard those being violated. But this was certainly not the case [almost, if not anywhere!] in the late 1800’s when a king who was far worse than the violent dictator, Idi Amin, who wreaked havoc in Uganda from 1971-1979, ruled there.

King Mwangi, [reigned: 1884-1888; 89-97] a violent ruler and pedophile, forced himself on the young boys and men who served as pages and attendants in his court; those who refused his advances were executed. Of the many who suffered under his reign of terror, some were Christians who strove to live by the ethical ideals of their faith, which the king scorned and despised. On June 3, 1886, after a 37-mile march from the court to the execution site during which 3 died, *Saint Charles Lwanga* and 21 others were wrapped in reed mats and burned alive.

Collect - St. Charles Lwanga & Companions, Martyrs

O God, who have made the blood of Martyrs the seed of Christians, mercifully grant that the field which is your Church, watered by the blood shed by Saints Charles Lwanga and his companions, may be fertile and always yield you an abundant harvest. Through our Lord Jesus Christ ... and ever. Amen.

MARTYRS: THE SEEDS OF THE FAITH. On October 18, 1968, when *Blessed* Pope Paul VI canonized *Saint Charles Lwanga*, who was the catechist for some of his *companion-martyrs*, the Pope noted how the seeds of *Catholicism* were first sown in Africa by martyrs. Among them

were *Saints Cyprian, Felicity & Perpetua*, and the great *Saint Augustine*, who was persecuted but not killed. And in a *gracious ecumenical gesture*, the Pope also added, “Nor must we forget those members of the Anglican church who also died for the name of Christ.” At the time, such praise of *Protestants* was highly unusual - but the blood of Martyrs can even sow the seeds for Christian Unity!

Prayer over the Offerings - Saint Charles Lwanga

We offer you sacrifice, O Lord, humbly praying that, as you granted the blessed Martyrs grace to die rather than sin, so you may bring us to minister at your altar in dedication to you alone. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

TEACH YOUR CHILDREN WELL. In a shocking horror, among the executioners was the father of one of the boy-martyrs, who encouraged his son to renounce his faith! To hear that in these days some parents just hand out condoms and birth control pills, but offer their children little, if any, encouragement to be chaste, is almost just as sad! May we have the courage of the *Ugandan Martyrs*, and strive to learn, live by, and promote Christian sexual ethics and practices.

Prayer after Communion - Saint Charles Lwanga

We have received this divine Sacrament, O Lord, as we celebrate the victory of your holy Martyrs; may what helped them to endure torment, we pray, make us, in the face of trials, steadfast in faith and in charity. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

WE REAP WHAT WE SOW. On June 3, 2015, Bishop Robert Barron proclaimed, “*Charles Lwanga, you won!*” For while the number of Christians in the USA and Europe is plummeting, the number of African Christians is skyrocketing! No wonder so many parishes now have an African-born Priest! We MUST ask ourselves: are we committed to our faith, and, if so, what are we doing to better establish it and help it grow in our great country? *Saint Charles Lwanga and Companions, pray for us!*

**Contact your Legislators to Oppose
Assisted Suicide**

**On Monday, March 12, the Assembly
Judiciary Committee released the Aid in Dying for the
Terminally Ill Act (A1504). The bill will now be voted
on by the General Assembly, possibly as early as
June 7. The bill would allow physicians to
prescribe drugs to end the lives of terminally ill
individuals considered to have six months to live.**

**The facts are clear - in California, in Vermont
and in Oregon - states that have passed assisted suicide
bills - insurance companies have denied individuals
expensive healthcare coverage but offered them low cost
drugs to end their life.**

**In an era of cost control and managed care,
patients with lingering illnesses may be branded as a
financial liability for the insurance company,
and decisions to encourage death could be driven by
reducing costs.**
