MARRIAGE: The Sacrament of Marriage requires a time of spiritual preparation. According to the Common Policy adopted by the Bishops of New Jersey, this preparation requires attendance at a marriage preparation program (Pre-Cana) as well as sessions with the parish deacon or priest. Therefore, couples should make arrangements at the Parish Office one year before the planned wedding date and before finalizing any social plans.

MISSION STATEMENT: The goal of Saint Justin the Martyr Parish is that each member grow in the Grace through Jesus Christ, and in so doing cooperate with the Holy Spirit in giving glory to God, in experiencing the salvation of their soul, and in building up the Body of Christ.

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From the Pastor Pentecost - A May 31, 2020 "HE WHO SINGS PRAYS <u>TWICE</u>." This phrase, attributed to *Saint Augustine of Hippo* [354-430], was a mere pagan teenager when the holy man we honor this week on June 9, *Saint Ephrem, Deacon and Doctor*

of the Church [306/307-373] died - but that phrase could have been Saint Ephrem's motto. For to teach and promote the Christian Faith, Saint Ephrem - nicknamed 'The Harp of the Holy Spirit' - wrote numerous hymns, of which 400 still survive. By putting doctrines to simple melodies, he enabled even children to memorize dogmas - just as trite tunes help them learn their "ABC's" and correctly spell "M-I-S, S-I-S, S-I-P-P-I." [Did you just sing those tunes in your head?] On another 'note,' there is much more to this Deacon/Doctor-Saint than his musical skills; after praying the Collect for the Mass celebrated in his honor, we'll discuss some of these things.

Collect - St. Ephrem, Deacon & Doctor of the Church Pour into our hearts O Lord, we pray, the Holy Spirit, at whose prompting the Deacon Saint Ephrem exulted in singing of your mysteries and from whom he received the strength to serve you alone. Through our Lord Jesus ... for ever and ever. Amen.

HUMBLE BEGINNINGS. We know very little about *Saint Ephrem's* early life; some accounts say he was born into a Christian family and that his father was a Catholic Priest; others say his father was a pagan priest who converted along with his whole family. Most accounts agree that he was baptized when he was about 18 and ordained a Deacon around - or even at the same time.

We <u>do</u> know, even from totally <u>secular</u> sources, that the world in which he lived was violently anti-<u>Christian</u> and anti-<u>Catholic</u> (sadly, our world is becoming much the same). When the diabolical despot Diocletian, who reigned as Rome's Emperor from 284 to 305, started the last major persecution of the Church, which lasted until the Peace of Constantine in 313, *Saint Ephrem* left Syria. He headed west to Edessa, in modern-day Turkey, where he began to combat his opponents in the Church's 'civil' war: the Arian heretics, who denied the divinity of Christ. Needless to say: his life as not an easy

one!

<u>A MONK, A HERMIT, A DEACON, A PRIEST</u>? We are not absolutely certain HOW *Saint Ephrem* served the Lord and His Church in 'ministry.' While the *Sacrament of Holy Orders*' three stages: *Deacon, Priest, Bishop* - have not significantly changed since apostolic times, the life of a Religious [Monk, Hermit, Nun, Sister, Brother] and the *Laity* <u>HAS</u> radically changed. Nor was it uncommon in *Saint Ephrem's* days for the non-ordained and married couples to promise virginity, perpetual celibacy or abstinence.

As in our own time, a *Deacon* in his days assisted *Priests* by providing food and other aid to the poor, and by preaching the Gospel - which, as already explained, he so beautifully did through song. He is credited with being the first to add liturgical music, in addition to biblical Psalms and Canticles, to the sacred liturgy. It was his first and primary duty as a *Deacon* - caring for the needy, as did the first *Deacons*, who the *Apostles* ordained to serve at table by distributing food *[Cf. Acts 6:1-7]* - that led to his death in 373. As he tended to those suffering from a plague, he contracted the disease and died.

Numerous sources say that *Deacon Ephrem* was encouraged to accept God's call to *Priesthood*, but declined the position for which he felt unworthy. Some sources say he was even nominated to be a *Bishop*, but to avoid that honor, he feigned madness.

While he defined himself as an ascetic, he made a living by performing, in addition to his ministry, manual labor, making sails for ships, and by living an austere, simple life. He sought the guidance of *Saint Basil the Great* to resolve his own spiritual struggles, and spent his last years in solitude, praying and writing to help others combat their demons. He is the *Patron Saint of Spiritual Directors* and of those suffering bodily ills and sexual temptations. *Saint Ephrem, Deacon & Doctor of the Church, pray for us.*
