### **Reading I: Deuteronomy 8: 2-3, 14b-16a**

The writer looks back to the past of his people and recalls the manna by which God fed His people. He concludes that "not by bread alone does one live," but by the Word of God.

### **Reading II: I Corinthians 10: 16-17**

Our sharing in the one cup and one loaf of bread forges the unity that we believers have, and this sharing makes us one body

### **The Gospel: John 6: 51-58**

A relationship exists between the believer and Our Lord Jesus that is established by the Holy Eucharist. There is a sharp distinction between the community that possesses "the bread of life," and the ancients, who had only the manna.

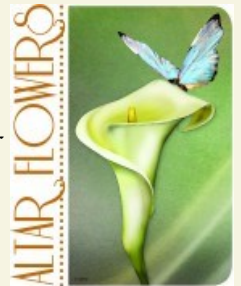

**"EUCHARIST &  
THE CHURCH.** As  
the disciples on  
the road to  
Emmaus

learned, we **MUST** have ***Eucharist*** to be '***Church!***' For as the Gospel notes: reviewing biblical events; sharing concerns; and journeying together was not enough; even the ***Risen Lord's*** explanation of how all the Scriptures referred to Him did not suffice! Only when He was "***with them at table ... took bread, said the blessing, broke it, and gave it to them.***" [C.f. Luke 24:13-35] did they recognize ***Our Lord's Real Presence.*** No wonder the ***Church requires*** us to receive ***Holy Communion*** at least once a year! On ***Corpus Christi***, which celebrates Christ's gift of this great ***Sacrament*** - a gift many were deprived of during the pandemic - may our hearts burn within us, as did the hearts of the first disciples, as we reflect on the orations that extol the unity of the ***Eucharist*** and the ***Church.***

**Collect - Holy Church-1-E - For the Particular Church**

O God, who in each pilgrim Church throughout the world make visible the one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church, graciously grant that your faithful may be so united to their shepherd and gathered together in the Holy Spirit through the Gospel and the Eucharist, as to worthily embody the universality of your people and become a sign and instrument in the world of the presence of Christ.  
Who lives and reigns ... for ever and ever. Amen.

**ONE FLOCK, ONE SHEPHERD, ONE FOOD.** Our Faith uniquely gifted the fractured human family by enabling all to become Christian regardless of their language, native country, diet, gender, economic level, etc. We are 'catholic' which, with a lower case 'c' means 'universal.' ***Baptism*** makes us members of a family that extends all over the earth and into heaven! While each "***pilgrim Church throughout the world***" [i.e.: ***Diocese or Parish***] is different due to its culture, socio-economic level, etc. - and each level of the Church is led by a shepherd with his own gifts and shortcomings and each place the Church gathers - be it a Cathedral or Parish church, Monastery or Convent - has innumerable differences - one

thing - or rather, one ***Person***, is the same everywhere.

For in each ***Tabernacle*** in each worship space - dwells our ***Lord Jesus Christ***, truly present in the ***Eucharist.*** So no matter where we go, we can always find a familiar Face!

**Prayer over the Offerings - Holy Church-1-E**

Celebrating the memorial of your Son's boundless love, we humbly beseech you, O Lord, that through the ministry of your Church the fruits of his saving work may advance the salvation of all the world.  
Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

**NOT JUST 'ME' BUT 'WE.'** While there is some truth in the belief that receiving Holy Communion is a '***ME and Jesus***' moment: the closest we can come to Him until we die; the Eucharist is primarily a '***WE and Jesus***' moment! In a small but subtle 'alteration' in the revised Mass, the Priest no longer says: "***Take this, all of you, and eat it,***" but: "***Take this, all of you, and eat OF it.***" 'Of' implies we only partake in PART of something, a share of the whole; a stake in the enterprise. The Church's ministry will never have its fullest impact until we become the team Christ calls us to be as we share in His Body and Blood.

**Prayer after Communion - Holy Church-1-E**

In this your Church, O Lord, may integrity of faith, holiness of life, fraternal charity and pure religion flourish and abide until the end, and, as you do not fail to feed her with the Body of your Son and with your word, so also never cease, we pray, to guide her under your protection.  
Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

**IMPORTANCE OF THE LOCAL COMMUNITY.** Just as foliage differs according to the local climate and circumstances, so does each Parish. While the basics are the same, the non-essentials can - and should - be adapted to suit each local community's needs. While the Church Universal accomplishes great things because of her size, each Parish affords a sense of closeness, where everyone knows your name - or is at least familiar with your face. As each Parish grows stronger, so does the whole Church - by sharing in the same Food: the ***Most Holy Body and Blood of our Lord Jesus Christ.*** Let us pray for our president, governor and mayor and all who lead us in this difficult time in our country. May God guide us as a nation and as individuals.

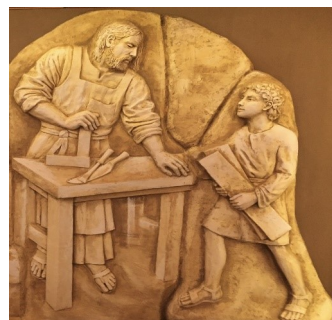
