From the Pastor

Father's Day

**A PATRON SAINT FOR
THOSE BESET BY
TEMPTATIONS &
FAMILY TENSIONS?**

What a comfort to know that even those who come from tough, problem-plagued families, who struggle with all sorts of unmentionable

temptations, who endure unjust condemnation, ridicule and misunderstanding - and who do not do anything spectacular or even noteworthy - can become a canonized Saint! This week we have the option of honoring **Saint Romuald, Abbot**, [pronounced 'rom-ALD'] on his **Feast Day: June 19**, the day he died in 1027 in Fabriano, Italy. Who was this mostly unknown, unimpressive, unsung Saint, who was born in Italy in 951 AD, and who is also venerated by Eastern Rite Catholic Churches? After praying his Collect, we'll try to explain.

Collect - Saint Romuald, Abbot

O God, who through Saint Romuald renewed the manner of life of hermits in your Church, grant that, denying ourselves and following Christ, we may merit to reach the heavenly realms on high. Through our Lord Jesus ... forever and ever. Amen.

A STAIRWAY TO HEAVEN. Long before the English rock band Led Zeppelin released its hit, 'Stairway to Heaven' in 1971, a ballad about a wealthy woman who erroneously and foolishly thought her vast earthly riches could buy her a 'stairway to heaven' [hence the song title], **Saint Romuald** had a similar message for his confrères or brother monks. What makes that so amazing is that he and his fellow hermits had already forsaken almost every earthly pleasure, and yet even they were having a rough time building a 'stairway to heaven!' So **Saint Romuald** radically reformed the lifestyle and requirements or 'rule' for monastic life; thus, he is often depicted in art with monks ascending the 'stairway' he directed his fellow hermits to create by their daily prayers and activities and their communal life. To this day, his directives still inspire the constitutions or 'rules' for those who 'leave all things' to follow Christ as hermits, monks or nuns.

RIISING ABOVE LIFE'S CHALLENGES. While few are called to follow Saint Romuald's radical lifestyle as a hermit, **ALL** are called to learn from and strive to imitate his patient endurance.

After a wayward childhood and early adulthood, **Saint Romuald** witnessed his father kill [some say murder] a relative in a duel over property - which led him to reject possessions and become a hermit. For years, he prayed for his father, who eventually repented. He so unswervingly embraced his vows, his confrères ejected him from the hermitage. Plagued by temptations, he sought escape by personal prayer - and by totally avoiding those whose ways were sinful. [As an old adage says: 'Saints are hell to live with on earth!'] Yet he never gave up on or watered down what he felt called by God to do.

When the future Saint was accused of a scandalous crime by a young, sinful nobleman he had rebuked, he graciously accepted the severe penance his superiors, who believed the false accuser, inflicted on him. They even forbade him to celebrate Mass, which he also accepted, never allowing bitterness or vengeance to poison him, even before being restored to good graces with the Church. After wandering through Italy for 30 years establishing hermitages, he sought permission to fulfill his dream of spreading the Gospel in what is now Hungary. However, he became gravely ill upon his arrival, and, seeing it as a sign from God he was not to sow the Good News in Hungary, he graciously returned home and continued his mission in Italy.

Although **Saint Romuald** was not a biological father, he is a good role model for all fathers this Father's Day. For he spent his time working for and providing the heavenly graces that last forever, not just passing earthly enticements. He did penance for his own father's sin - which led his dad to enter a hermitage later in life. He faced life's countless set-backs and challenges with Christian joy and hope. He strove to do what he could to bring peace and justice, love and mercy into everything he said or did. And isn't this what every Christian father should do? **Saint Romuald, pray for all fathers - and for us! Happy Father's Day!**

New Jersey Independent Victims Compensation Program opens June 15

As had been announced in February of this year, the Diocese of Trenton – along with the other Roman Catholic dioceses in New Jersey – has established an Independent Victim Compensation Program (IVCP) to compensate those who, as minors, were sexually abused by a priest or deacon of the Diocese. The IVCP will be open to claims beginning June 15.

The IVCP is independently administered by experienced victim compensation experts Kenneth R. Feinberg and Camille S. Biros. Mr. Feinberg was the plan administrator for the federal 9/11 victim compensation program, as well as the Boston Marathon bombing compensation program.

The IVCP will handle the submission, evaluation and resolution of individual claims, and will operate independently of the Diocese or any Church-affiliated institution. The administrators of the IVCP will have complete autonomy to determine the eligibility of a claim with the guidelines of the established Protocol. The amount of compensation for those who make a claim will be determined by the IVCP administrators. All victims – no matter when the abuse occurred – are eligible to participate, and all matters will be handled confidentially. Victims of clergy sexual abuse of a minor can begin the process of utilizing the program by going to www.njdiocesesivcp.com and reviewing the Protocol for submitting a claim.

Anyone who was sexually victimized as a minor by a priest or deacon of the Diocese is strongly encouraged to participate in the IVCP. The Diocese also asks that anyone who knows of someone who was abused to pass along this information to the victim so that he or she is aware of the IVCP.

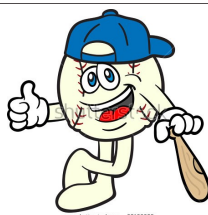

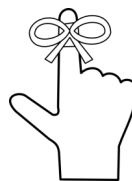

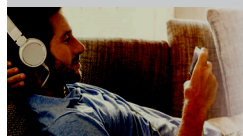
