From the Pastor

This Father's
Day we pray
for our two
living Holy
Fathers: Pope
Emeritus

Benedict and Pope Francis, who accepted the awesome challenge to 'shepherd' and 'father' the Church on earth. [And I thought I had it rough 'shepherding' and 'fathering' one Parish!] Calling a mere mortal man our 'Holy Father' riles fundamentalists and some Catholics who 'read their own issues' into biblical texts like "Call no one on earth your father; you have but one Father in heaven." [Matthew 23:9] And there are numerous biblical injunctions asserting that **only God** is holy. However, we do not 'deify' or make into a god what we call holy, like the Holy Land or a Holy Day!

Why do we call the Pope our 'Holy Father?' He is the 'Chief Pastor' of the Church; the 'Supreme Pontiff' or bridge-builder between all Christians who, like a wheel's axle, unites every spoke; the 'Vicar of Christ' and 'Successor of Saint Peter' to whom Jesus entrusted His Church, and who 'fathered' the first Christians. So on this Father's Day we pray for our 'Holy Fathers.'

Collect - For the Pope

O God, who chose your servant Francis.
in succession to the Apostle Peter
as shepherd of the whole flock, look favorably on the
supplications of your people
and grant that, as Vicar of Christ on earth,
he may confirm his brethren and that the
whole Church may be in communion with him
in the bond of unity, love and peace,
so that in you, the shepherd of souls,
all may know the truth and attain life eternal.
Who lives and reigns ... for ever and ever. Amen.

"MAY THEY BE ONE." Of all the things Jesus prayed for at the Last Supper, the night before He died, His greatest concern was for our unity: "May [they] all be one, as you, Father, are in me and I in you, that they also may be in us, that the world may believe that you sent me." [John 17:21] And what better way to help keep us one than to unite us as **one** family around **one** father, **one** flock around **one** shepherd.

No wonder Jesus established His Church firmly on the rock of **Saint Peter's** confession of faith - and around the man who, as our 'Holy Father,' both 'fathers' and 'shepherds' the flock!

Prayer over the Offerings - For the Pope

Be pleased, we pray, O Lord, with the offerings presented here and govern with unfailing protection your holy Church, together with Francis our Pope, whom you have chosen to be her shepherd. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

WE MUST PRAY FOR ONE ANOTHER. In the Preface I of Apostles we pray: "**eternal Shepherd, you do not desert your flock, but through the blessed Apostles watch over it and protect it always, so that it may be governed by those you have appointed shepherds to lead it in the name of your Son.**" Not only do the Apostles and their successors who have died intercede for the Church from heaven; today's shepherds: all Bishops, Priests and Deacons, also pray for the unity of the Church. But without our prayers, and our obedience to those who shepherd us, the flock will be scattered. So pray for all who 'father' and 'shepherd' us today!

Prayer after Communion - For the Pope

Having been made sharers at the heavenly table, we humbly entreat you, Lord: by the power of this mystery, strengthen your Church in unity and charity and, as you have entrusted your servant Francis with the office of shepherd, grant him always salvation and protection, together with the flock entrusted to his care. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

A FATHER TO THE FATHERLESS. Perhaps one of the most difficult things for a father to do is to get his children who are well-off to assist those who are fatherless or in need. As this oration reminds us, the **Holy Father** not only unites us; he must also call us to express our love in **charity**. **Pope Francis** is certainly known for calling us to care for the poor! Father Tom and I wish all fathers a **Happy Father's Day!**

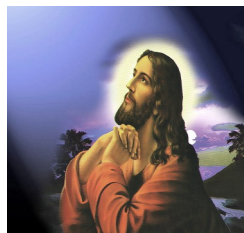

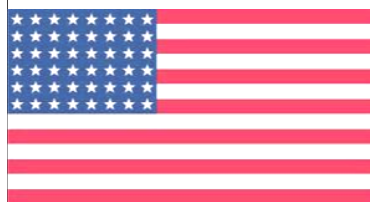
