

From the Pastor 12th Sunday in **Ordinary Time - B** June 20, 2021 Father's Day

PRAY FOR ME AS I PRAY FOR YOU. On this Father's Day, I request your prayers for me and for all those who you respectfully refer to as 'Father:' the **Priests**, who have given their lives in service to God's

Many years ago, during a Priests' Retreat, the retreat master lightheartedly referred to us as 'Dads Without Diapers,' but that is not to say that we are free from dealing with loads of ... stuff! In fact, as I will explain below, while we have numerous 'perks,' we also face some pointed challenges. [At least in our time and place, unlike others, being ordained does not lead to persecution or execution; at least this is NOT the case - for NOW - in the USA!]

People.

However, in every time and place, we Priests need your prayers - so, please, on this Father's Day, offer these orations for me and for all who have, or currently do, or will serve, as your spiritual 'Father.' These prayers are from the first set of orations entitled, 'For the Priest Himself' -Especially for A Priest with the Care for Souls.

Collect - For the Priest Himself - A

O God, who have willed that I preside over your family not by any merit of mine but out of the abundance of your untold grace alone, grant that I may carry out worthily the ministry of the priestly office and, under your governance in all things, may direct the people entrusted to my care. Through our Lord Jesus ... for ever and ever. Amen.

PRESIDING OVER GOD'S FAMILY. This is a most moving image of my role as Pastor, quite like that of Saint Joseph's foster-fatherhood over Jesus. Just as Saint Joseph must have felt so honored by his special role, so am I. But it must have also filled him with tremendous concern that he never offend or fail to protect Jesus or His Mother. For as Pastor, I must nurture and reverence the Christ who is present within you. I must also treat you as a son or daughter of our Blessed Mother, making sure, as she does, that none of her children are lost or in need.

Prayer over the Offerings - For the Priest Himself - A O God, powerful and kindly ruler of days and seasons, look in mercy on the ministry given me by your grace and, through the power of this oblation, direct the hearts of Priest and people to be so disposed that the obedience of the flock may never fail the shepherd, nor the care of the shepherd be lacking for the flock. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

"WE'RE ALL IN THIS TOGETHER!" While this catchphrase has been often repeated, perhaps ad nauseum, during the pandemic, it is, has always been, and always will be, also true of the Church. For unless Priests and People, Shepherd and Sheep, Head and Body work together, we are doomed. No wonder, as Saint John Vianney, Patron Saint of Priests, said: "When people want to destroy religion they begin by attacking the priest; for when there is no priest, there is no sacrifice: and when there is no sacrifice, there is no religion." When we Ordained Ministers sin, we need your prayers and support more than ever! The days are long gone [at least I hope they are!] when Priests were heartlessly stern when hearing Confessions; we pray you are as compassionate and understanding of our failings as we are trained to be of yours.

Prayer after Communion - For the Priest Himself - A Almighty ever-living God, source and perfection of every virtue, grant, we pray, that by participation in this mystery I may do what is right and preach what is true, so that by my deeds and by my words I may offer to the faithful instruction in your grace. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

PRAY FOR HOLY LEADERS. It is jokingly said that teachers need to be merely one chapter or one page ahead of their students. Sometimes, I feel as if I am volumes behind some of those I am called to lead and serve. At other times, I am barely a page - or just a few words - ahead of you. But with your encouragement and prayers, we Priests can be the shepherds the Good **Shepherd** chose us to be. So, be quick to pray for us - and to forgive us as we strive to guide the flocks entrusted to us into the heavenly pastures.




