From the Pastor

12th Sunday in Ordinary Time - A June 21, 2020

The Pope of the Rosary.' The 225th Vicar of Christ, *Pope Saint Pius V's* brief six-year reign [January 7, 1566 - May 1, 1572] is commonly known for two things. One, after his election

as Pope he chose to continue to wear his offwhite Dominican habit - for reasons that may surprise you - a custom each of his 41 successors has kept to this day! Two, in 1570, he promulgated the Roman Missal which was [almost] the only ritual permissible in the Latin Rite Church until *Pope Saint Paul VI* promulgated the 1969 Roman Missal we now use, and which was revised in 2011.

There is much more to Antonio Ghislieri, who was born on January 17, 1504, to a poor but noble Italian family, and who labored as a shepherd. After praying the Collect for the Mass in his honor on his *Feast Day: April 30* - the day before he died - we'll review his tumultuous reign. [May 1 had been the *Feast of Saints Philip & James;* it moved to May 3 in 1955 when May 1 became the *Feast of Saint Joseph the Worker* to counter communist May Day rites.]

Collect - Saint Pius V, Pope

O God, who in your providence raised up Pope Saint Pius the Fifth in your Church that the faith might be safeguarded and more fitting worship be offered to you, grant, through his intercession, that we may participate in your mysteries with lively faith and fruitful charity. Through our Lord Jesus ... for ever and ever. Amen.

BATTLES FROM THE WEST AND THE EAST - AND BATTLES FROM WITHIN. The Church and the world during Pope Saint Pius V's reign was, in many ways, the bleakest of times. Some say Pope Saint Pius V is a posterchild for nepotism: his uncle, Pope Paul IV, had named him a Cardinal, destining him for the papacy. But he continued to wear his coarse-fabric Dominican habit, an 'itchy' penitential practice, even under his papal vesture. He banned violent 'games' like bullfighting, relocated prostitutes to rural areas, opened hospitals for the poor, fasted,

and simplified papal celebrations, using the money saved to feed poor Roman converts.

BATTLES FROM THE WEST. While Protestant Reformers decimated Catholic populations, their rejection of the Pope and our central teaching office led to chaos. Protestantism has morphed into over 1,000 sects; and since nature abhors a vacuum, many monarchs claimed papal authority for themselves, creating national churches and regional sects, making the Catholic/Protestant split less theological and more political. Pope Saint Pius V's ill-advised excommunication of Elizabeth I, intended to 'shame' her into reunion with Rome, backfired, and English persecution of Catholics became brutal and unforgiving.

BATTLES FROM THE EAST. Things were far worse in the East; the Ottoman Empire's quest to impose Islam was violently enforced; the Turks were triumphant and unmerciful, executing those who would not convert, as do today's radical Islamic terrorists. But against all odds, on October 7, 1571, at the Battle of Lepanto, Greece, severely outnumbered Christian forces, won a decisive naval battle against the Turks, halting the spread of Islam. Pope Saint Pius V, who had asked Catholics worldwide to pray the Rosary for the troops, credited the victory to our Blessed Mother, and declared the first Sunday of October the Feast of Our Lady of Victories. In 1963, *Pope Saint John XXIII* changed its name to Our Lady of the Rosary and set in on October 7.

BATTLES FROM WITHIN. The implementation of the decisions made at the Council of Trent [1545-1563], called to explain the issues questioned and correct the abuses - raised by Protestant Reformers, fell to *Pope Saint Pius V*: a truly thankless job! Some of the unwelcomed changes were: Bishops had to live in their own Dioceses and reqularly visit their Parishes; clerics were to shun extravagance and questionable behaviors; he founded Seminaries with Saint Charles Borromeo to properly train Priests academically and spiritually, and 'CCD' classes for children; he set the rubrics for all liturgical services, especially the Mass, and forcibly implemented them. All this made him many enemies ... but it firmly set the Church on 'the Rock' - on the Successor of Saint *Peter* - and recommitted her to her Founder: Jesus Christ. Pope Saint Pius V, pray for us. Father Dan and I extend our best wishes to all fathers!

Guidelines for the Sacrament of Reconciliation:

The sacrament will be available again beginning Saturday, June 20, 2020 at the regular time of 3:30 p.m.

- The sacrament will not be offered in the church as was the norm before the virus pandemic. Instead, those seeking the sacrament will utilize the two doors on the RE building side of the church. The penitent will walk up to one of the doors and knock and the priest will open the door and hear the confession. The penitent and the priest must both be wearing face masks and practicing social distancing of 6 feet.
- -Those waiting in line must also wear masks and distance themselves 6 feet from the next person in line. The line will begin where the asphalt meets the grass and wrap around to the parking lot side of the church.
- -- The penitent will keep in mind that their confession will be as brief as possible. Confession, as it has in the past, is not the time to seek counsel; Confession is not a therapy session. Confession, in simple terms, is confessing ones sins, the priest may give some brief comments then the penitent receives the penance, then Act of Contrition and Absolution.
- **Missing Sunday Mass and Holy Days of Obligation is still under a dispensation until September 7, 2020, so there is no need to confess missing Mass. **Weather permitting.-

These guidelines are in place until further advised.
