From the Pastor 14th Sunday in Ordinary Time - A July 5, 2020

WE NEED THE GIFT OF JESUS IN THE MOST HOLY EUCHARIST. Last month, in our bulletin article on Corpus Christi, one oration referred to the Most Holy Eucharist as medicine. Many long for a dose of that great Sacrament in this pandemic isolation. And the Priest who died 481 years ago

today, on what is now his Feast Day, knew how important it is to receive the proper medicine at the proper time in a dual way. For before Ordination, Saint Anthony Zaccaria was a medical doctor who left his practice to care for sin-sick souls; wait till you hear what kinds of 'medicines' he prescribed! First, pray the Collect that may be used when his Feast Day does NOT fall on a Sunday as it does this year.

Collect - Saint Anthony Zaccaria, Priest Grant, O Lord, that in the spirit of the Apostle Paul we may pursue the surpassing knowledge of Jesus Christ, for, having learned it, Saint Anthony Zaccaria constantly preached your saving word in the Church. Through our Lord Jesus ... for ever and ever. Amen.

**REMEMBER 'FORTY HOURS' DEVOTION?** Soon after Martin Luther's criticism and rejection of many Catholic beliefs and customs took root and led the Reformers to 'throw out the baby with the bathwater,' holy men and women like Saint Anthony Zaccaria sought to stop clergy and others who 'sold' the grace-filled rites we must freely give and who did not properly celebrate them. To fortify the faithful, *Saint Anthony Zaccaria* encouraged frequent reception of Holy Communion and regular time spent in Eucharistic Adoration. But why was it called 'Forty Hours?'

For 40 hours, the Blessed Sacrament was exposed on an Altar in a monstrance during which communal and private, personal prayers would be offered. In more modern times, the Host was returned to the Tabernacle during the overnight hours for safety and security. Some say it was set at 40 hours to match the many '40's' in the Bible: the 40 days/40 nights of rain in Noah's time; Moses' 40 days on Mount Sinai; the Israelites' 40-year desert journey; Jesus' 40day desert fast; the 40 days between Easter and the Ascension to name just a few biblical '40's.' Saint Charles Borromeo taught that 40 represented the 40 hours Our Lord's Body rested in the tomb. Whatever its origin, its purpose is far more important: for Eucharistic Adoration is intended to expand and prolong what we receive at holy Mass and create a desire and hunger for another dose of the ultimate medicine: Christ's Most Sacred Body and Precious Blood.

FIRE & BRIMSTONE. Most people in today's Church would be offended, if not totally turned off, by Saint Anthony Zaccaria's harsh tone and condemnatory flare. While it is true that we can 'catch more flies with honey than vinegar,' it is also true that not everything is the fault of one's parents or upbringing, society or tough breaks, disorders or other external circumstances. Sometimes we are just plain lazy, intrigued by what we know is bad, foolishly overconfident that we can handle temptation, etc. And while we prefer to preach about God's forgiveness and mercy, we would be bad 'doctors of the soul' if we did not, on occasion, echo the Apostle's teaching that "If we say, "We are without sin," we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us." [1 John 1:8]

**DO WE HIDE BEHIND EXCUSES?** Many have a laundry list of reasons why they reject God and/or His Church: a personal tragedy; the wide variety of worldly woes; the sins of the clergy; abusive nuns; someone sat in 'their' pew; etc. When Saint Anthony Zaccaria was just a baby, his father died; he was raised by his then-18-year-old widowed mother; some mocked the custom he promoted of ringing church bells on Fridays at 3 PM to commemorate Christ's Death, his attempts to reform the Church were met with harsh resistance; the **Barnabite Order** he founded, which he named after Saint Barnabas, the companion of *Saint Paul*, to whom he had a special devotion, was investigated twice after being falsely accused of all sorts of improprieties; he contracted a disease while on a preaching mission and died in his mother's arms when he was just 36! Could all our woes make us a Saint? Saint Anthony Zaccaria, pray for us.
