

From the Pastor 14th Sunday in Ordinary Time - B July 8, 2018

We Christians, who live in this time and place, are truly blessed; for while we, on occasion, face insult, mockery or simple disdainful disregard for our Faith, many of our

brothers and sisters elsewhere literally risk life and limb for Christ and His Church. Each summer, in our part of the world, each Parish is asked to sponsor a *missionary* who seeks support for those who often cannot even imagine all the freedoms and luxuries we so often take for granted. These peoples need all the prayers, financial support and hope we can afford to give them.

I ask all to join in prayerful support for our annual mission appeal, scheduled to take place next weekend, by reflecting on the orations provided for Masses offered for *Persecuted Christians*. I hope our prayers will be bolstered by a generous Second Collection for our visiting missionary's cause. Here are the orations for Masses offered for *Persecuted Christians*.

Collect - For Persecuted Christians

O God, who in your inscrutable providence will that the Church be united to the sufferings of your Son, grant, we pray, to your faithful who suffer for your name's sake a spirit of patience and charity, that they may be found true and faithful witnesses to the promises you have made.

Through our Lord Jesus Christ ... and ever. Amen.

UNITED TO THE SUFFERINGS OF CHRIST. Have we become so accustomed to seeing images of Christ crucified, with His Mother Mary and the Beloved Disciples standing beneath the Cross that we fail to hear Jesus calling us to stand with His Mother and Beloved Disciples and to share in their pain? Do we expect the Lord, who suffered so greatly for us, to give us 'a pass' every time challenges or difficulties come our way? This week, can each of us endure just ONE discomfort for the sake of the Gospel, and 'offer it up' in solidarity with - and as a sign of support for - our Christian brothers and sisters who are persecuted for their Faith?

Prayer over the Offerings - For Persecuted Christians
Receive, we ask, O Lord, the prayers and
sacrificial gifts we offer in humility
and grant that those who suffer persecution
for their faithful service to you may rejoice
to be united to the sacrifice of Christ your Son
and may know that their names are written
in heaven among the company of the elect.

Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

EARTHLY PERSECUTION, HEAVENLY PRIZE. So many people willingly sacrifice or forego so many things to achieve or attain passing, finite earthly joys: large, magnificently furnished house; fancy car; vacations; countless luxuries; a body-to-die-for, etc. What are we Christians willing to endure to be gifted with eternal life, a place in God's Kingdom, and our names written in the Book of Life? Sad to say, many will do anything for the things that pass away, but little for the things that last forever! As we pray for those who willingly lose everything for Jesus, what can - and will - we 'give up' for Him?

Prayer after Communion - For Persecuted Christians
By the power of this Sacrament, O Lord,
confirm your servants in the truth and grant
to your faithful who suffer tribulation
that, as they follow your Son
in bearing their cross, they may,
in every trial, glory in the name of Christian.
Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

WHAT CROSSES DO WE BRAVELY BEAR FOR **CHRIST?** I know a Pastor who says we should run our children's Faith Formation Program the way sports or other non-religious kids' groups are run. They DEMAND that parents buy uniforms, attend practices, travel [at their own expensel to venues all over the place - yet these same parents balk at every little requirement for our sacramental preparation programs! Even adults squawk at the simple 'obligations' the Church places on us: fasting and abstinence, keeping holy Sundays and holy days of obligation, contributing to the support of the Church, etc. What crosses - if any - do we bear for our faith? May our persecuted brothers and sisters and Jesus - forgive us!
