



From the Pastor 16th Sunday in Ordinary Time - C July 21, 2019

ARE ALL CATHOLICS (ROMAN' CATHOLICS? _Why do Catholics honor a man born in Lebanon in 1828, whose name, Yussef Antoun Makhluf, was changed to Sharbel, or as some spell it, Charbel? Why is a non- Roman Catholic Priest-Monk, who lived for 19 years in a

monastery, and then for 23 years as a hermit, who suffered a stroke and died while celebrating Christmas Eve Mass in 1898, given a *July 24th Feast Day?* Why did the recently-canonized *Pope Saint Paul VI* [Feast Day: May 29] beatify *Father Sharbel* in 1965 and canonize him in

Some reasons are: shortly after his burial, dazzling lights shone around his tomb; his body was found to be incorrupt, even by medical doctors; in life, and after death, he is credited with working miracles for Christians and even Muslims. But we'll tell you the main reason he's a Saint after you pray his Collect.

Collect - Saint Sharbel Makhluf, Priest O God, who called the Priest Saint Sharbel Makhluf to the solitary combat of the desert and imbued him with all manner of devotion, grant us, we pray, that, being made imitators of the Lord's Passion, we may merit to be co-heirs of his Kingdom. Who lives and reigns ... for ever and ever. Amen.

HE'S A 'LIVING' REMINDER OF OUR MULTI-RITE **CATHOLIC CHURCH.** Sadly, most Roman Catholics like me are unfamiliar with the non-Latin Rites that form the Catholic Church. This brief article could never do justice to the complexity of our Church's *Rites,* but here's an overview. After the Lord's Ascension, the first disciples spread the Faith by bringing it to the major cities of the then-known world. They established Churches that were loosely united [the Church was still illegal!], and adapted what could be altered to accommodate each area's language, culture, etc. While the core teachings of the Faith were and are the same everywhere, Catholicism [the word 'catholic' means 'universal'] became 'different' in different places.

<u>CHURCH 'CENTERS' or PATRIARCHS</u>. As the Church 'grew', she adopted each area's customs and language. The disciples of *Saints Peter and Paul*, who were martyred in Rome, adopted Latin and other <u>Roman</u> styles, giving us the <u>Latin Rite</u> to which we belong. The disciples of *Saint Mark*, who went to Alexandria, Egypt, formed the <u>Coptic Rite</u>. Saint Thomas went to India, where the <u>Syro-Malabar Rite</u> was formed; many Indian parishioners also belong to this <u>Rite</u>. There are other <u>Rites</u> with apostolic history, but we will only address one more <u>Rite</u>.

The disciples of *Saint James*, who oversaw the *Jerusalem Church*, gave us many *Rites*, like the *Maronite Rite* to which *Saint Sharbel* belonged. Each *Rite* differed in language and style, but were all '*Catholic*': the Roman or Latin Rite has *statues* and only uses *unleavened* bread, as did Jesus at the Last Supper; Eastern Rites prefer *icons* and use *leavened* bread. We *CAN* receive Holy Communion in each other's Rite but only if the Pope is mentioned - by name - in their 'Anathema' which we call a 'Eucharistic

Prayer.' [Warning: their Mass is much longer!]

ORTHODOX CHURCHES. Things got really muddy in the 300's when Constantine split the Roman Empire in half; he made <u>Rome</u> the center of the <u>West</u> and <u>Constantinople</u> the center of the <u>East</u> - which also 'split' the Church. Politics and other issues also drew us apart, not in theology, but in governance. The <u>East</u> called the Pope 'first among equals,' but not the central role the <u>West</u> gives him. In 1054, each side 'excommunicated' each other, creating a <u>Catholic</u> and an

<u>Orthodox</u> Church, to which many Eastern Rite Churches belonged. While we have a long way to go, some Eastern Rite Churches never

rejected the Pope, and some have reunified with Rome in recent centuries, which brings us back to *Saint Sharbel*.

In icons, *Saint Sharbel* holds a *Maronite Rite Cross* which has *3 crossbars* to signify the *Trinity* and the Church's 3 levels: the Pope; their

Patriarch [Bishop]; and the whole college of Bishops. *Pope Saint Paul VI* thought <u>Roman</u> Catholics needed an <u>Eastern Rite</u> Catholic saint to remind us we are all one. *Saint Sharbel, pray for us and for the unity of ALL Christians!*
