





MARRIAGE: The Sacrament of Marriage requires a time of spiritual preparation. According to the Common Policy adopted by the Bishops of New Jersey, this preparation requires attendance at a marriage preparation program (Pre-Cana) as well as sessions with the parish deacon or priest. Therefore, couples should make arrangements at the Parish Office one year before the planned wedding date and before finalizing any social plans.

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From the Pastor 20th Sunday in Ordinary Time - A August 16, 2020

FROM RAGS TO 'RAGS'
- SORT OF ... This
week we honor the
man who wrote in
his last will and
testament: "I was
born poor, I have
lived in poverty, and I
wish to die poor."

While that's not an easy thing to do when you're the Pope, Giuseppe Melchiorre Sarto, born on June 2, 1835, into poverty in Venice, and who entered eternal glory on August 20, 1914, shunned many papal privileges - long before it became fashionable. He abolished the papal custom of eating alone begun by Pope Urban VIII, who reigned from 1623-1644. He offered simple Sunday instructions to ordinary people in a Vatican garden and sought to help all Catholics better understand and celebrate our Faith. Each oration for his Feast Day, August 21, leads into three central points about Saint Pius X, whose Feast Day is a day after his death date, as Saint Bernard of Clairvaux's Feast Day was set on August 20 in the 1100's, long before Saint Pius X.

Collect - Saint Pius X, Pope

O God, who to safeguard the Catholic faith and to restore all things in Christ, filled Pope Saint Pius the Tenth with heavenly wisdom and apostolic fortitude, graciously grant that, following his teaching and example, we may gain an eternal prize. Through our Lord Jesus ... for ever and ever. Amen.

RESTORE ALL THINGS IN CHRIST.' When they accept their election, Popes choose a motto, often from Scripture, for what politicians call their 'platform.' While not a biblical quote, Saint Pius X's motto, which was melded into his Collect, was 'Restore All Things In Christ' - which makes a deeply theological, POSITIVE statement. While he feverously fought to spare the world the horrors of armed conflict [he died 31 days after WWI erupted], he never lost hope in God's creation, including the human person. His choice of the word 'Restore' and not 'Renew' showed his belief that human sinfulness had not destroyed our 'Original Goodness.' 'Original Sin' certainly tainted it, but with God's help, we can

restore it! What an upbeat view of humanity!

Prayer over the Offerings - Saint Pius X, Pope

Receive with kindness our oblations and grant, O Lord, we pray, that, following the teachings of Pope Saint Pius, we may celebrate these divine mysteries with sincere reverence and receive them in a spirit of faith.

Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

THESE DIVINE MYSTERIES.' Although he is the last Pope NOT to have a Doctorate until Pope Francis, Saint Pius X actively opposed two very dangerous theological movements: Modernism and Relativism. The Modernism camp sought to modify Catholic beliefs and rituals in tune with 'modern' styles and 'issues,' with little, if any, concern for our traditional roots or biblical basis. This mindset has splintered Protestantism into almost innumerable sects, in which one can find a Christian community in which anything goes! The doctrine of

Relativism holds that there is no eternal, unchangeable Truth, or to put it simply: what's 'right or wrong' changes according to time or place. This mindset rejects any notion that God's Commandments, Church decrees, or Natural Law have unchanging value.

By codifying Canon [Church] Law, organizing the Church's liturgy [Mass, Morning/Evening Prayer, Sacraments and other rites] Saint Pius X made more firm the 'Rock' on which Jesus builds His Church. This made it easier for every Catholic to build his or her house, not on sand, but on rock.

Prayer after Communion - Saint Pius X, Pope

Celebrating the Memorial of Pope Saint Pius, we pray, O Lord our God, that by the power of this heavenly table we may be made constant in the faith and be of one accord in your love.

Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

THIS HEAVENLY TABLE.' In a move deplored by many, Saint Pius X encouraged people to receive Holy Communion weekly, if not more often. And he lowered the age of First Eucharist from 12 to 7, the age of reason. He also mandated that 'CCD:' the Confraternity of Christian Doctrine be offered in every Parish so children could learn the Catholic Faith. Saint Pius X, pray for us. In Christ,
