

For centuries Catholics have turned to the Blessed Virgin Mary, asking for her intercession in times of need by praying the Rosary. This great prayer, whose origins date before the 12th century, uses a meditative repetition of prayers that invoke the intercession of the Blessed Virgin Mary as she leads us to consider the mysteries in the life of her Divine Son, Jesus. Please join with me in praying Our Lady's Rosary every day between now and October 7, the feast of Our Lady of the Rosary, for the many intentions and needs of our nation today, especially for a true respect for life in all its stages from conception to natural death; for the strengthening of marriage and family life; for an end to the COVID 19 pandemic and for all those impacted by it; for a lasting resolution to the racial tensions and injustices that have too long afflicted our country; for an end to the violence and death in our cities, especially among the young; for the victims of sexual abuse and human trafficking; for the poor, the unemployed and those who face economic hardship and for so many of the other intentions and needs that we face in our country and world.

Holy Mary, Mother of God, pray for us sinners now and at the hour of our death. Amen.





Therefore, couples should make arrangements at the Parish Office one year before the planned wedding date and before finalizing any social plans.

22nd Sunday in Ordinary Time - A

HOW CAN SUCH A SINFUL CHURCH BE 'HOLY?' Since we've already reflected on the Saints we honor at this time of year, we'll reflect on the Church which we should REFLECT on and PRAY for more often! As we profess in the Creed: the Church is 'HOLY' - but how can that be when we, her members, are so 'UNHOLY?' For Apostles,

Popes, Cardinals, Bishops, Priests, Deacons, Religious Sisters and Brothers, Lay Men and Women have committed countless denials, betrayals and sinful deeds; at least two madmen, Adolf Hitler and Benito Mussolini, were baptized Catholics! In the following first of five sets of orations entitled, 'For Holy Church: For the Church,' we pray for the Church, which is always perfect in Her Head, Jesus Christ, but imperfect in us, Christ's Body on earth.

Collect - Holy Church-1-A - For the Particular Church

O God, who in your wonderful providence decreed that Christ's Kingdom should be extended throughout the earth and that all should become partakers of his saving redemption, grant, we pray, that your Church may be the universal sacrament of salvation and that Christ may be revealed to all as the hope of the nations and their Savior. Who lives and reigns ... for ever and ever. Amen.

"NO LONGER I, BUT CHRIST." Saint Paul said, "I have been crucified with Christ; yet I live, no longer I, but Christ lives in me." [Galatians 2:19b-20a] However, this quote should, or rather, must be the goal of every Christian. For unless we 'die' to our own ways, plans, dreams, methods, and views - and adopt and live by those of Jesus Christ - He cannot live in and through us. Since so few do this, we have the dichotomy of a **Church** both <u>holy</u> and <u>unholy</u>. Clearly, the Church is not holy in her members; for as Saint Paul bluntly admitted: "This saying is trustworthy and deserves full acceptance: Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners. Of these I am the foremost." [1 Timothy 1:15] However, while the Church is made of sinners, she is holy because her Founder, Jesus Christ, is holy. And the more we become like Jesus, the more holy the whole Church will be!

Prayer over the Offerings - Holy Church-1-A

Look upon the offerings of the people consecrated to you, O merciful God, and, through the power of this Sacrament, grant that the multitude of those who believe in you may constantly be made a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, a people of your own.

Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

PARTAKERS, NOT JUST BENEFICIARIES. We love to receive gifts, and as this oration reminds us: God not only gifts us with life, He gifts us with the Eucharist and all the Sacraments which 'grace' us to become more like Jesus. And since He said: "Without cost you have received; without cost you are to give" [Matthew 10:8b], if we are not becoming what we receive - and sharing it with others - WE are the reason the Church is less holy. But if we become, in word and deed, "a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, a people of his own" [1 Peter 2:9], our world will also be made more holy by the Holy Church.


Prayer after Communion - Holy Church-1-A

O God, who constantly feed and strengthen the Church with your Sacraments, grant to us, who have been nourished at the heavenly table, that, by obeying your teachings of love, we may become for the human family a life-giving leaven and a means to salvation.

THE PROBLEM IS NOT WITH THE TOOLS! The Church is not only holy because it was founded by Jesus; He and His Father also infuse it with: the Holy Spirit; the Truth and every necessary grace and gift. However, just as scalpels or hammers in the hands of skilled surgeons or carpenters can do great works - but in the hands of a child would wreak havoc - so, too, and even more so, the tools Jesus gifts us with through His Church. We say 'even more so' because tools made by humans are, by nature, imperfect. But the Sacraments and all the Church's 'tools' [her rites, her teachings, etc.] are made by God, which, in turn, means they are 'supernatural,' and thus perfect. And while even these, in the hands of imperfect human ministers, will never reach their full potential in us, they do make the **Church** - **HOLY**.
