

From the Pastor 22nd Sunday in Ordinary Time - C September 1, 2019

SAINT PAUL VI, POPE. A few years ago we reflected on the two suggested sets of orations for Labor Day: 'For the Sanctification of Human Labor' - A & B. This year we will reflect on the two

special <u>Collects</u> from the same section of the Roman Missal: II. FOR CIVIL NEEDS #30. For the Preservation of Peace & Justice - B. These two <u>Collects</u> [aka Opening Prayers] capture the essence of the often-quoted words of one of our newest Saints: Saint Paul VI: "If you want peace, work for justice."

Last October 14, Pope Francis canonized Giovanni Battista Montini, born on September 26, 1897, who took the papal name *Paul VI*, and who reigned from June 21, 1963, until his death on August 6, 1978. [When sportscaster Phil Rizutto, who was live-broadcasting a Yankee game that day, heard of the Pope's passing, he actually commented on air, "Well, that kind of puts a damper even on a Yankee win." At least he did not utter {udder?} his most famous phrase, "Holy cow!"] Anyway, we will apply the adage Pope *Saint Paul VI* [Feast Day: May 29] gave us, "*If you want peace, work for justice*" to the two *Collects* that detail how we must *'labor'* if we truly want peace and justice.

Collect B-1- For the Preservation of Peace & Justice

O God, Creator of the world, under whose governance the design for all the ages unfolds, be attentive, we pray, to our petitions and grant to our times tranquility and peace, that we may exult with unceasing joy in praise of your great mercy.

Through our Lord Jesus Christ ... and ever. Amen.

NO JUSTICE, NO PEACE; KNOW JUSTICE, KNOW

PEACE. One key way God continues His 'governance' over His creation is through the 'laws' He 'pre-programs' into human hearts and minds [natural law] - and reveals through sacred Scripture and Church teaching - which should be - and must be - the basis for every manmade law or policy. For instance, the biblical clause, "A person will reap only what he sows" [Galatians 6:7] - which common sense and basic logic also

reveals, must be the basis for every just and sensible human law or policy.

Likewise, these two biblical injunctions: "[The Lord will judge and bear witness against all] who deprive a laborer of wages." [Malachi 3:5] and Saint Paul's advice to 'slaves' [aka: workers] to "be obedient to your human masters ... not only when being watched, as currying favor, but as slaves of Christ." [Cf. Ephesians 6:5-6], hold employers and employees equally responsible to act justly and honestly. For God never governs by force - but only by means of those who strive to listen for, hear, and heed His ways.

Collect B-2- For the Preservation of Peace & Justice

O God of peace, who are peace itself and whom a spirit of discord cannot grasp, nor a violent mind receive, grant that those who are one in heart may persevere in what is good and that those in conflict may forget evil and so be healed. Through our Lord Jesus Christ ... and ever. Amen.

WE MUST BE ONE IN HEART AND MIND. All of Catholic Social Teaching is rooted in the Bible and firmly rooted in real life realities. Consider these words from another Apostle: "Behold, the wages you withheld from the workers who harvested your fields are crying aloud, and the cries of the harvesters have reached the ears of the Lord of hosts." [James 5:4] Some are surprised that such secular, economic warnings are found in sacred Scripture - but we are called to live our heavenly faith in every earthly reality. As this optional Collect notes, we must have the heart and mind of God - and abide by it in all we say and do - if we are to live in peace and justice.

In our imperfect world, where all are tainted by sin, all of us will constantly have to battle selfishness, self-centeredness, and the gnawing temptation to put ourselves first - or worse, to think only of ourselves. That's why tolerance and forgiveness, patience and trust, honesty and truth must guide all we say and do. Without these, we will never know peace or justice in our homes, our workplaces or wherever. Happy Labor Day Weekend. [Summer's over ... holy cow!]


