From the Pastor 27th Sunday in Ordinary Time - C October 6, 2019

HEADLESS SAINT? Six months ago next week the world was shocked to see Paris' famed Notre Dame Cathedral's spire crash through its roof during a devastating fire. In support of French Catholics - and all who hope and pray the Cathedral will be restored as a Catholic house of worship - we'll reflect on *France's Patron Saint: Saint* Denis or Dionysius. Dame Cathedral is 'owned' by

the French government; like most church property, it was 'taken' during the French Revolution; that's why, I believe, the Vatican and other Catholic groups should <u>NOT</u> help finance its restoration ... unless it remains fully 'Catholic.']

Born in Italy, *Saint Denis* was sent to France by Pope Saint Fabian [reigned: 236-250; Feast Day: 01/20] and was executed [250-270?] with Rusticus, a Priest, and *Eleutherius*, a Deacon. We know little about him; we believe he was the first Bishop of Paris and chose what had been a Druid pagan temple a small island in the Seine River, the Île de la Cité, Paris' geographic center, as the site of its first church. Beheaded on Montmartre, the Mount 'of Mars,' but commonly called 'of Martyrs,' legend says he carried his head for miles to his grave on which was built the Basilica of Saint Denis. After praying the Collect for Saint Denis, Bishop, and Companions, Martyrs, whose Feast Day is October 9, we'll go more into this 'over the head' legend.

Collect - Saint Denis, Bishop, & Companions, Martyrs
O God, who sent Saint Denis and his companions to preach your glory to the nations and strengthened them for their mission with the virtue of constancy in suffering, grant, we pray, that we may imitate them in disdaining prosperity in this world and in being undaunted by any trial.

Through our Lord Jesus ... for ever and ever. Amen.

<u>DECAPITATION: IT MAKES A STATEMENT!</u> The legend of Saint Denis' decapitation and headless stroll to his grave seem to come from the 9th Century, long after his death. As seen in the statue above, which graces *Notre Dame*

Cathedral, he is usually depicted carrying his head, which makes a profound statement. For the method used to execute a Church leader was often chosen ... to make a statement.

Some were *burned at the stake* with their books and writings as a sign that all who accepted their heretical teachings would burn in Hell. Those who had abandoned the Faith were *drowned* or 'rebaptized' in the hope they would be 'saved' by being 'rewashed.' Bishops and other Church leaders were *decapitated* to show that the bonds of Christ's Body, His Church, had been severed and, without a head, would die.

However, according to legend, *Saint Denis* kept his head ... a sign to his executioners that they had failed at their ultimate goal: to destroy the Church! During the French Revolution, those who sought to sever all ties to the Church or Crown often used a *guillotine* to decapitate their enemies. Sadly, many statues of the Saints, erroneously thought by commoners to be royalty, were also decapitated.

WE DESTROY THE CHURCH AT OUR OWN RISK. In every age the Church has been, is, and always will be in need of reform and purification. However, as efforts to eradicate the Church by Communists, Fascists, Nazis and other radical regimes have shown - and as we are sadly seeing in our own increasingly secular society - we weaken or destroy the pillars of Faith at our own peril! Perhaps we need 'unknown' Saints like Saint Denis - and their all-too-silly-to-be-true legends - to remind us that we need the Church and her teachings ... as much as we need a good head on our shoulders!

SAINT DENIS IS PATRON SAINT OF WHAT? Not surprisingly, the intercession of Saint Denis is implored by those suffering from headaches. But given his dealings with the Druid pagans and their bizarre faith, he is also Patron Saint of those dealing with frenzy, strife and diabolical possession. [Personally, I think he should also intercede for Nativity Scene figurines and other statuary that lack heads, legs, hands, arms, tails, ears and other body parts.] Saint Denis, Bishop, & Companions, pray for us.


