From the Pastor 28th Sunday in Ordinary Time - C October 13, 2019

A SAINT WITH NO CALENDAR DATE? Most canonized Saints do NOT have a date on the Church's Universal Calendar. In the liturgical reforms of the 1960's at Vatican Council II, the calendar was 'cleaned up' to give precedence to Jesus, Mary, and key Saints and events - which led some to

believe we 'kicked out' some Saints - but that is not true. In the official roster of Saints, there are 5, 6, or more Saints honored each day. However, only those of greatest importance for all people have a date on the Universal Calendar.

So, along with *Saint Valentine* [February 14], *Saint Christopher* [July 25], *Saint Bernadette* [April 16] and countless others, we have *Saint Gerard Majella [*October 16], the Patron Saint of expectant mothers and of those striving to conceive a child. While these calendar-less Saints have no official orations in the Roman Missal [generic orations for martyrs or for holy men or women are used at Masses honoring them], *Saint Gerard Majella* has at least two popular prayers.

Prayer to Saint Gerard Majella for a Safe Delivery

O Glorious Saint Gerard,
because when falsely accused of a crime,
you did bear, like your Divine Master,
without murmur or complaint,
the calumnies of wicked men,
you have been raised up by God as the
patron and protector of expectant mothers.

Preserve me/N. from danger and from the excessive pains accompanying childbirth, and shield the child which I/N. now carry/carries, that it may see the light of day and receive the purifying and life-giving waters of Baptism through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

A PIOUS SAINT, FALSELY ACCUSED. Born into poverty and hardship near Naples, Italy, in April, 1726, Saint Gerard Majella's desire to serve the Lord was not easy; rejected by the Capuchins due to ill health, he was accepted as a lay brother by the Redemptorists in 1749 at the age of 23. A tailor by trade, he provided menial tasks, serving as the Order's tailor, cook, sacristan, and infirmarian. Today, he would be called overly

scrupulous, if not scrupulously simplistic - but due to his care for the poor, his prayers for the sick, and his gentle, unassuming, childlike trust in God ... he became a powerful intercessor while on earth and from his place in heaven.

PATRON SAINT OF EXPECTANT MOTHERS. Two events led him to become *Patron Saint of Expectant Mothers*. When an expectant mother became ill, she held onto a handkerchief he had left behind and which he had told her to keep; her recovery and safe delivery was credited to his intercession. When another expectant mother accused him of being the father, he and his Order were shocked, to say the least. Like *Jesus*, who remained silent before His accusers, *Saint Gerard* also remained stoically silent ... and prayed. She eventually recanted her story, and he was praised for the positive, trusting way he dealt with a most vilely false accusation.

Prayer to Saint Gerard Majella for Conception

O Good Saint Gerard, powerful intercessor before God and wonder worker of our day, confidently I call upon you and seek your aid. On Earth you always fulfilled God's designs, help me now to do the holy will of God.

Implore the Master of Life, from whom all paternity proceeds, to render me/N. fruitful in offspring, that I/she may raise up children to God in this life, and in the world to come, heirs to the Kingdom of His Glory. Amen.

"HERE, THE WILL OF GOD IS DONE, AS GOD WILLS, AND AS LONG AS GOD WILLS." These words, which hung as a sign over his door, were his 'motto.' He, in turn, encouraged others to entrust themselves, and their hopes and dreams, to God's will. So he became Patron Saint of Those Seeking to Conceive. He was 29 when he died from tuberculosis on October 16, 1755. He was canonized on December 11, 1904 by Pope Saint Pius X. In 1977, the late Archbishop of Newark, Peter Leo Gerety, declared his shrine in Saint Lucy Church, a mere stone's throw off I-280, as the National Shrine of Saint Gerard Majella. 


