From the Pastor
32nd Sunday in

**A SAINT WHO PROVES:
WITH GOD, ALL THINGS
ARE POSSIBLE!**

Maria
Francesca Cabrini,
born on July 15, 1850,
in Italy, was 2 months
premature [in those
days, that was certain
death!] and the young-
est of 13, of whom
only 3 survived past

adolescence. Taught by the Sisters of the Sacred Heart, she was an excellent student; but they rejected her request to join their Order due to the illnesses that beset her all her life. But what she lacked in health she certainly made up in stamina!

A priest invited her to teach at the House of Providence Orphanage in Italy, to which she drew some women to join her in communal life. She became '**Mother Cabrini**' when she made religious vows, adding the name 'Xavier' in honor of the **Patron Saint of Missionaries: Saint Francis Xavier** [Feast Day: December 3] in whose footsteps she hoped to follow as a missionary to China. Her dream seemed to be coming true when the Orphanage School closed, and her bishop asked to her to found the **Missionary Sisters of the Sacred Heart** to care for poor children. But God had other plans for her, which we'll explain after you pray the Collect for the Mass offered on her Feast Day: **November 13:** the day on which she died of complications from dysentery at 67, in 1917, in one of her own hospitals: Columbus Hospital, in Chicago, Illinois, recently closed.

Collect - Saint Frances Xavier Cabrini, Virgin

God our Father, who called
Saint Frances Xavier Cabrini from Italy
to serve the immigrants of America,
by her example, teach us to have concern for the
stranger, the sick, and all those in need,
and by her prayers help us to see Christ
in all the men and women we meet.
Through our Lord Jesus ... for ever and ever. Amen.

"NOT EAST, BUT WEST!" These words of Pope Leo XIII [02/20/1878 - 07-20-1903: 4th longest Pope!] dashed all her hopes of ever going to China. The Holy Father needed her to sail to the USA to care for the hordes of Italian immigrants streaming to America. So off she went, at 38, to America,

even though, from her childhood, she was deathly afraid of the sea! Amazingly, she crossed the Atlantic Ocean about 30 times ... for with God, all things are possible! [Mercifully, unlike **Saints Peter; Elizabeth Ann Seton**, whose son was in the US Navy; **Brendan the Navigator**; and **Nicholas**, Mother Cabrini is NOT the **Patron Saint of Sailors!**

GOD RARELY MAKES IT EASY! After Mother Cabrini arrived in New York City on March 31, 1889, with 6 other Sisters, they faced hardships, disappointments and rejection. The convent promised them was no longer available; like most immigrants to America, she and her Sisters were unwelcome, ill-treated and scorned; even the then-Archbishop of New York, Michael Corrigan, wanted them to return to Italy! Yet despite her many trips to Europe, she always returned to America. She is the **Patron Saint of Immigrants.**

THE FIRST CITIZEN OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA TO BE CANONIZED. In 1909, at 59, she became a naturalized citizen of the USA. She blessed her new homeland with 67 institutions that ministered to every nationality, race, religion or economic level. She urged immigrants to keep their traditions and embrace the good, wholesome ways of their new home. By her God-given gifts of kindness and humility, she won the praise of many, who then donated money, time, and support for her orphanages and her scholastic and medical institutions. She is the **Patron Saint of Hospital Administrators.**

HER ROAD TO SAINTHOOD. A mere 21 years after her death, she was beatified by Pope Pius XI on November 13, 1938. After two miracles were credited to her [through her intercession, sight was restored to a child blinded by a medical mishap, and a terminally ill member of her congregation was healed] she was canonized by Pope Pius XII on July 7, 1946. Her body was originally buried at the Saint Cabrini Home in West Park, NY, but most of her body was moved to the Cabrini Shrine in NYC in 1931, in preparation for her canonization. Her head is in Rome, at their Motherhouse, and one of her arms is in her shrine in Chicago - ergo the expression, "Mother Cabrini, pull yourself together!" **Saint Frances Xavier Cabrini, pray for us and the success of our "Called By Name" program.**

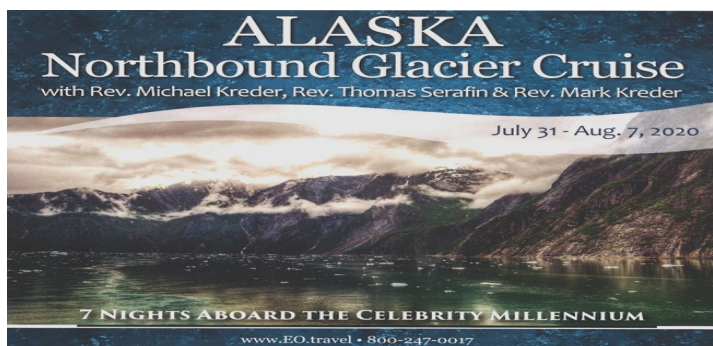

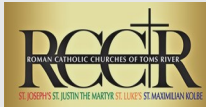

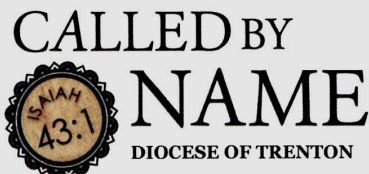
