From the Pastor Our Lord Jesus Christ. King of the Universe - B [34<sup>th</sup> or Last Sunday in Ordinary Time - B] November 21, 2021

NOVEMBER IS THE MONTH OF ALL SOULS. In the fourth of our fivepart Month of All Souls series on the **Prayers for** the Dead, we reflect on the Collects for the Funeral of an

**Unbaptized Child** which I have, mercifully, never had to use. To their great credit, healthcare workers quickly and rightly baptize newborns in danger of death when no Ordained Minister is present. As the Catechism teaches: anyone, even non-Christians, can baptize those in danger of death - if that person, or those responsible for him or her, like a parent, requests **Baptism**. And as long as water [via sprinkling, pouring or immersion] is used and the words, "I baptize you in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit." are said - it is a valid Baptism.

The **Church** also provides a special service for the Funeral of an Infant, which we will reflect on next week. Today's orations are intended for children whose parents intended to have them baptized but who died before they were adopted by God through the cleansing waters of rebirth - which puts the Church in a quandary. For Jesus bluntly stated: "Amen, amen, I say to you, no one can enter the kingdom of God without being born of water and Spirit." [John 3:5]. Yet He also said, "Let the children come to me, and do not prevent them ..." [Matthew 19:14b]. So, based on these two divine pronouncements, the **Church** provides these two hope-filled orations.

Collect - For the Funeral of an Unbaptized Child - A Receive the prayers of your faithful, Lord, and grant that those you allow to be weighed down by their longing for the child taken from them may be raised up by faith to hope in your compassion. Through our Lord Jesus ... for ever and ever. Amen.

HOPE IN GOD'S COMPASSION. The rubrics for such funerals remind the minister to balance both "doctrine of the necessity of Baptism" with the pastoral consolation needed by the parents and loved ones of the deceased child. The rare permission is given for a Bishop to allow the Funeral Mass or other Rites to take place at the child's home, privately, or with limited access.

"While only a Pope can declare a deceased person to be in heaven, all ministers are expected to instill, encourage, and nurture the HOPE that God will grant eternal life in heaven to everyone.

Anyway, as I was taught: since God is perfect justice and perfect mercy, would not God - who made the rule about the necessity of Baptism make an exception to that rule in such a case? In any case, while the Catholic Church never proclaims as a dogma or doctrine anything that is not clearly stated in the **Bible**, she does offer the HOPE that God, in His mercy, will reunite unbaptized children with their baptized loved ones. 'Limbo' was never defined as dogma - it was merely an 'opinion' based on scripture; nor does the word 'Limbo' even appear in the current Catechism. [FYI: catechisms are NOT infallible documents!] And while Catholics may believe in or reject 'Limbo,' current theology prefers to focus on God's justice and mercy.

Collect - For the Funeral of an Unbaptized Child - B O God, searcher of hearts and most loving consoler, who know the faith of these parents, grant that, as they mourn their child,

now departed from this life, they may be assured that he/she has been entrusted to your divine compassion. Through our Lord Jesus ... for ever and ever. Amen.

WE CAN BE SAVED BY THE FAITH OF OTHERS. In addition to all that we have already said, the **Church** offers the HOPE that since the parents INTENDED to have their child **baptized**, but for whatever reason did not fulfill that intent, God will still grant that grace. It is the Church's longstanding belief in three forms of **Baptism**: Baptism of WATER - Baptism of DESIRE - and Baptism of BLOOD or martyrdom. While Baptism of WATER fully incorporates us into Christ's Body, the Church, the other two forms create what theologians call 'a salvific link' to Christ and His Church - which Saint Thomas Aquinas taught was enough to attain eternal salvation. So, by the parents' desire, and, perhaps, even the deceased child's desire, if they were old enough to understand, we have every reason to HOPE that God welcomes such children into heaven.

part of the "Youth Group." Our next meeting will be on Sunday, November 21st The Youth Group generally meets twice a month on Sunday




