From the Pastor Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe - C [34th or Last Sunday In Ordinary Time - C] November 24, 2019

A WOMAN WHO GAVE HER ALL FOR HER KING. On this last Sunday in Ordinary Time, we bring another liturgical year to its climatic conclusion by honoring Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe. With the festival of Thanksqiving this week, and

Advent's 'advent' next weekend, we can easily lose sight of the ultimate price paid by many so they could celebrate what we so often take for granted.

One such brave Christian was Saint Catherine of Alexandria whose feast day is November 25. She was born in 287 in what was, back then, one of the world's finest cities and a center of culture and academia: Alexandria, Egypt. Beheaded on what is now her feast day [circa 305-312], Pope Saint John Paul personally put her back on the Church's Universal Calendar as an Optional Memorial. [She had been removed from it in the liturgical reforms of the 1960's.]

Saint John Paul did this to highlight a Saint honored by both the Latin [Western or Roman] Catholic Church and the Orthodox Church. He also hoped that adding one of the Orthodox Church's main Saints to our calendar would help heal the schism that has separated us since 1054. Although Russia is mainly 'Orthodox' territory, the first Catholic Church built in 'Orthodox' Russia, from 1710 to 1783, was named in honor of Saint Catherine of Alexandria to whom Catherine the Great had a great devotion. Here's the Collect for the Mass celebrated in her honor.

Collect - St. Catherine of Alexandria, Virgin & Martyr

Almighty ever-living God, who gave Saint
Catherine of Alexandria to your people
as a Virgin and an invincible Martyr,
grant that through her intercession we may
be strengthened in faith and constancy
and spend ourselves without reserve
for the unity of the Church.
Through our Lord Jesus ... for ever and ever. Amen.

FROM PAGAN TO PROFOUND PREACHER. Born into a noble pagan family, the future Saint had an insatiable desire for knowledge and loved

to read. Legend says she fell asleep on her books and had a dream of our Blessed Mother and the Child Jesus, whereupon she sought Baptism. When violent anti-Christian persecutions arose, she eloquently defended herself even to the emperor's face! Her words moved others to convert, which enraged the emperor, who ordered that she be put to death.

HER MAIN SYMBOL: A [BROKEN] WHEEL. In the emperor's hope to get her to abandon the Faith, she was viciously tortured; at one point, she was tied to a spiked wheel - which miraculously broke apart! However, when his efforts to coerce her failed, and she refused his offers to have her married off to the best of suitors to violate her vow of virginity, he had her beheaded and later buried on Mount Sinai.

A VERY, VERY BUSY PATRONESS. Since she had a voracious quest for knowledge, she is the Patron Saint of Educators, Librarians, Libraries, Scholars, Scribes, Students, and Teachers. Since she had a great ability to explain and defend Christian dogma, she is the Patron Saint of Attorneys, Jurists, Lawvers. Philosophers. Preachers and Theologians. Having kept her vow of virginity, she is the Patron Saint of Girls, Maidens, and the Unmarried. In light of her many torments and attempted executions, she is the **Patron Saint of Potters** and all who work with a wheel, the Dying, Knife Sharpeners and **Tanners.** [What a busy Saint she must be!]

HEED HER EXAMPLE IN TOUGH TIMES. Thanksqiving this week, and Christmas and New Years' celebrations just around the corner, ask the intercession of Saint Catherine of Alexandria to stay focused on what we have in common and not on our differences. 'Offer up' the little unpleasantries and awkward situations we all face when dealing with family and friends, for our 'sufferings' are nothing compared to what so many Saints bravely endured! If the opportunity arises, offer the Church's position on topics and issues, gently and respectfully - after asking Jesus, our Blessed Mother and the Saints for help! Above all, never give up - for God never gives up on us! Saint Catherine of Alexandria, pray for us. Father Dan and I extend our best wishes for a Happy Thanksgiving and a Blessed Advent!






