

From the Pastor 1st Sunday of Advent - A December 1, 2019

NICHOLAS. Santa Claus certainly borrowed many attributes and practices from Saint Nicholas of Myra, whose Feast Day is December 6. However, most children should be VERY HAPPY that Santa does NOT use Saint Nick's criteria for giving gifts. For Saint Nicholas only gave to

children whose families were so destitute and poor that - in order to have food and other necessities - their parents had to <u>sell</u> them into <u>slavery</u> or a life of <u>dissipation!</u> More on this after a brief review of **Saint Nicholas**' background.

Born on March 15, 270, in the town of Patara in what is now present-day Turkey, where his uncle served as Bishop, **Saint Nicholas** served as Bishop of Myra, a town not far from his birthplace. The few 'facts' we have about him suggest he was the only child of Greek parents who raised him in the Christian faith. His parents died when he was a young man during an epidemic that ravaged that area, leaving him a sizeable inheritance. He chose to donate his wealth to charity so he could serve the Lord and was ordained a Priest by his Bishop-uncle. After praying the Collect for the optional Mass offered on his feast day, we will tell more about **Jolly Old Saint Nick**.

Collect - Saint Nicholas, Bishop

We humbly implore your mercy, Lord: protect us in all dangers through the prayers of the Bishop Saint Nicholas, that the way of salvation may lie open before us. Through our Lord Jesus ... for ever and ever.

Amen.

APPLES, ORANGES OR BALLS OF GOLD? Among the symbols of Saint Nicholas are three or more golden balls, or a bunch of apples or oranges which all have the same source. As mentioned above, destitute families had little choice but to offer their children as slaves or even prostitutes in order to feed and care for them. It is said that Bishop Nicholas 'bought' the three daughters of a distraught man who was about to make the horrific decision to sell them. So, he tossed 3 bags of gold through the man's window to be

used as a dowry to 'free' his eldest daughter; he did it two more times to 'redeem' the other two airls.

A REALLY SMART SANTA! Bishop Nicholas went to the Council of Nicaea [May-August, 325], about 400 miles north of Myra, at which clerics and theologians met to debate Arianism, the heresy named after a Priest, Father Arian, who said Jesus was ONLY HUMAN, NOT DIVINE. If Jesus were not both human and divine, Sacraments would lose their grace-filled power; Jesus would be the blasphemer His critics said He was, as only God can forgive sins or change Commandments as He did when He said, "It is written, but I say..." The Council's debates, which produced the long Nicene Creed we still profess, almost verbatim, were often quite heated. One 'rumor,' devoid of any historical proof, is that Bishop Nicholas angrily slapped Arian in the face! If so, it was a sign of things to come!

HE SUFFERED FOR HIS GOOD WORKS. Until the Edict of Constantine in 313, the persecution of Christians was rampant. Saint Nicholas was often jailed, tortured and mocked; some say his reddish face was caused by being struck in the face by those seeking to silence him and stop him from putting his Faith into action. So, he is the Patron Saint of the Innocent or Falsely Accused, Children, Pawnbrokers, Mariners [his relics were sailed from Turkey to Italy], Repentant Thieves, Archers, Greece, and Russia. [Nicholas was the baptismal name of the first Russian Christian prince, Askold, who lived in the 800's; Saint Olga had a church named in honor of Saint Nicholas built over Askold's tomb in Kiev in the 900's.

SAINT NICK & SANTA ARE NOT IDENTICAL. No one knows what the real Santa Claus looks like [if you stay up and peek, he may not leave any gifts!], so Saint Nicholas became his 'model.' In the 1600's, Dutch Protestants brought 'Santa Claus' to America, they made him look less episcopal or bishop-like. His red vestments became more of a regal red robe [it eventually became a red suit]; his miter or hat retained its form: a long, narrow, pointed hat, but became floppy, rather than vertically stiff, and lost the two talens that hang off the back but gained a pompom; and he lost his crozier; some say red and white candy canes represent a Bishop's staff. Saint Nicholas, pray for us. May God grant us a spiritually uplifting and fulfilling Advent!



Have you ever wondered why popes change their names? Some may ruminate over, why does a newly elected pope take on a different name than the one given to him at birth? **Let's** take a look and see if we can solve the mystery. From a theological perspective, the changing of a name signifies a transformation within the person to where they become different altogether, and it signals a change in their life. Consider Abram to Abraham, Jacob to Israel, Simon to Peter, or even Saul to Paul. Something happened at a crucial point in their lives that led God to change their name and it was a transformation in who they were to the very core of their being; in essence the person is different, they are not the same. Now, this wasn't the impetus for the first pope to change his name and those that followed, it was for a practical reason. But, over the years the underlying aspects are more theological, one of tradition and chosen with purpose in mind. Just for a matter of clarity, a pope does not have to change his name, but it's a tradition that goes back to the 6th century. The first pope to change his name was Pope John II in 533. His given name was Mercurio and he felt having a name of a pagan god (Mercury) was not appropriate. However, his successors went back to the then tradition of keeping their given names even as they became pope. Then in 983 Pietro Canepanova was elected pope and did not want to be known as Peter II (using the name of St. Peter, the first pope, as Pietro equals Peter in Italian). So, to alleviate this problem he chose the name of John XIV. As a matter of note, there has not been a pope who has used the name Peter since the Apostle Peter himself. The next pope to keep his birth name, was Giovanni di Gallina Alba, and he became John XV. Upon his death in 956, his successor and those following began to use a regnal name on a regular basis. Of notable mention, the last pope to use his given name is Adrian VI in 1522 (he was the last non-Italian [he was Dutch] until 1978 when **John Paul II** was elected who was from Poland). However, there is some debate about this. Some say it was **Pope Marcellus II in 1555**, whose birth name was Marcello, which is a derivation of Marcellus. As we can imagine, and as was the case with Cardinal Jorge Bergoglio of Buenos Aires in Argentina when he became **Pope Francis** in 2013, the regnal name is also chosen with a purpose; the name selected has intentionality. Cardinal Bergoglio chose his name in honor of St. Francis of Assisi, in hindsight we see why he chose this name. It was St. Francis's commitment to the poor that has also marked the pontificate of Pope Francis. Cardinal Albino Luciani, when elected, chose the names of his two predecessors John XXIII and Paul VI, both of which have had a profound influence on the modern Church, so, he became Pope John Paul (I). His successor Karol Wojtła of Poland chose the name **John Paul II**, to honor his predecessor. Some may ask, "hmmm, I wonder what name has been used the most?" That's a good question! The name used most often is John. **Pope John XXIII**, who died in 1963, being the most recent. *Tied for second; Gregory and Benedict at sixteen times each.* Interestingly enough, Linus was the 2nd pope after Peter, but has not been used since. It may be a tough sell for someone to use it now with the advent of the Peanuts character, and with him always carrying a blanket! There are others whose name has not been reused, for instance, Hyginus, Zephyrinus, Dionysius, and Lando to name a few. Most of these names come from the first 350 years of the Church's history, and Lando coming from the 10^{th} century. I wonder if any future pope will use Lando? Hmmm, maybe, if his last name is Calrissian-Hehehe. Fr. Dan 514 page 4
