

From the Pastor The Holy Family of Jesus, Mary & Joseph - A December 29, 2019

CHANGE & TRANSITION: A
BLESSING & A CURSE. At the
'turning of the year,' as we
reflect on the past and ask
God's blessing on the future,
we have a great Saint to help
us ponder life's inevitable
changes and transitions in
Pope Saint Sylvester I. He is
the last Saint we honor each

year as his *Feast Day* is *December 31*, the day he was buried in 335. Born around 250, he was elected Pope in 314 and reigned for 21 years as our 33<sup>rd</sup> Pope, the 32<sup>nd</sup> Successor of *Saint Peter*.

In his days, the Church's legal status went from 'outlawed enemy' of Rome to the official State religion. While the Emperor Constantine's *Edict of Milan* ended violent persecution of Christians, let them worship in public, and gave them many other rights, it also opened the proverbial Pandora's Box of problems. After praying his Collect, we will reflect on some of the *blessings* and *curses* during *Pope Saint Sylvester* I's papacy.

Collect - Saint Sylvester I, Pope

Come, O Lord, to the help of your people, sustained by the intercession of Pope Saint Sylvester, so that, running the course of this present life under your guidance, we may happily attain life without end. Through our Lord Jesus ... for ever and ever. Amen.

BLESSINGS. When the Church was made legal, she began to enjoy: the end of persecution; the right to worship in public; the ability to build public structures and establish public policies; and the formation of forums to debate, discuss, and decide on theological questions and other issues. And as the papacy became more formalized and centralized, uniformity and clarity helped end the disarray that distinguished the Church's first 300 years of history.

Some say the greatest gift was the conversion of the Emperor Constantine. According to legend, *Saints Peter and Paul* appeared to him after he had contracted leprosy, assuring him that if he was baptized, he'd be cured. *Saint Sylvester I*, who is often depicted with images of the two great Apostles, had the honor of baptizing him.

Constantine returned the favor by giving the Pope two gifts: a castle on Rome's Lateran hill as a home, and a nearby pagan temple as a church. To this day, the *Basilica of Saint John Lateran* is the Bishop of Rome's Cathedral. Constantine also gave property on which the first *Saint Peter Basilica* was built, which he helped finance, as well as many other ecclesial *structures*.

Pope Saint Sylvester I also promulgated many policies as the papal role developed; many are still in effect to this day! He declared the Sign of the Cross was a divine gift; gave Bishops the exclusive right to consecrate the Sacred Chrism used to anoint in Baptism, Confirmation, Holy Orders and new church dedications; mandated that the Eucharist be consecrated on a white linen corporal or cloth, and Deacons wear dalmatics; and called both Saturday AND Sunday the Lord's Day or the Sabbath.

<u>CURSES</u>. Once Christianity became legal, many joined or returned to the Church, but not always for the right reasons. Once becoming Christian became the 'politically correct' thing to do, many joined <u>in name only</u>. While the Church grew in numbers, her members' overall faithfulness to the Gospel lessened. And when those who had left during turbulent times tried to rejoin, they were not, understandably, always welcomed back by those who had endured persecution.

The State's overpowering interest in and desire to control Church matters were also great challenges. As is still the case today in places like China, the government appointed Bishops and decided other religious issues. The Council of Nicaea, which gave us the Creed we still profess at Mass, was called - not by *Pope Saint Sylvester I* but by Constantine - who had it convened - not in Rome, but in the Eastern part of the Roman Empire to appease 'the East.' In fact, *Pope Saint Sylvester I* did not even attend the Council of Nicaea but was represented by other clerics.

BALANCE & PEACE. To his credit, Pope Saint
Sylvester I wisely encouraged cooperation and
peace between the Church and the State. May
we strive for these ideals in the controversies
and elections of 2020! Pope Saint Sylvester I,
pray for us! Father Dan and I wish you all a
Merry Christmas & Happy New Year 2020!



Next Week at Masses the Cantor will read ...... "The Epiphany Proclamation" Here is the reason why! The proclamation of the date of Easter and the other moveable feasts on Epiphany dates from a time when calendars were not readily available. It was necessary to make known the date of Easter in advance, since many celebrations of the liturgical year depend on its date. The number of Sundays that follow Epiphany, the date of Ash Wednesday, and the number of Sundays that follow Pentecost are all computed in relation to Easter. Although calendars now give the date of Easter and the other feasts in the liturgical year for many years in advance, the Epiphany proclamation still has value. It is a reminder of the centrality of the resurrection of the Lord in the liturgical year and the importance of the great mysteries of faith which are celebrated each year. Each year the proper dates for Ash Wednesday, Easter, Ascension, Pentecost, the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, and the First Sunday of Advent must be inserted into the text. Those dates are found in the table which is included with the introductory documents of the Roman Missal. The form to be used for announcing each dates is: the date of month, e.g., "the seventh day of April." On the Epiphany of the Lord, after the singing of the Gospel, a Deacon or cantor, in keeping with an ancient practice of Holy Church, announces from the ambo the moveable feasts of the current year according to the following text. (The musical notation is found in Appendix I of the Roman Missal, Third Edition. USCCB.ORG)
