Before coming to Confession, use an 'Examen' [below] to examine your conscience. Begin with your state in life [i.e., married, single, parent, etc.] and approximate time since your last Confession; list all grave, serious, major [mortal] sins by number and kind; a general admission of sinfulness suffices for less serious [venial] sins: i.e., impatience, intolerance, stinginess, lack of charity, forgiveness, etc. After the Priest offers a penance, listen to the Prayer of Absolution; pray the Act of Contrition AFTER you leave.

A BIBLICAL EXAMINATION OF CONSCIENCE

"The LORD God ... called to the man and asked him:
"Where are you?"

He answered, 'I heard you in the garden; but I was afraid, because I was naked, so I hid.' [Genesis 3:9-10]

Am I growing in my capacity for truly loving, honest and mutually-respectful relationships?

Am I honest with myself? Am I honest with those I love? Am I honest with God?

Do I need to grow in courage, and in my ability to deal with conflict in honest, respectful and constructive ways?

Am I so afraid of God - or of what He asks of me - that I try to hide from the LORD or from the Church's rites and rituals?

Am I a respectful, dependable person, in whom others see another Christ?

Do I think of my activity - family, work, leisure - as ways to serve God and bring God's presence into the world?

"LORD, you have probed me, you know me: you know when I sit and stand; you understand my thoughts from afar. You formed my inmost being; you knit me in my mother's womb. My very self you know." [Psalm 139:1-2, 13, 14b]

Do I misuse the gifts God has entrusted to me:
All my talents? All my treasure? All my knowledge? All
my abilities and skills?

Do I use God's gift of my sexuality for manipulation or pleasure rather than an expression of mature, committed, monogamous love?

Have I taken seriously God's personal call to me to be holy - to be His child in every sense of the word by participating weekly in the Sunday Eucharist
and other religious services?
Have I taken the time to pray
and to allow God's love to touch me?

Am I aware of the sacredness of earth and life; do I build my life upon that awareness?

Do I avail myself to the sacramental grace that comes to us in the Most Holy Eucharist and in Confession, Penance or Reconciliation?

"As the Father loves me, so I also love you.

Remain in my love. If you keep my commandments, you
will remain in my love."

[John 15:9-10a]

Do I do all I can to bring Christ's compassion and justice into my little part of the world, through all I say and do?

Do I have a genuine love and concern for others? Or have I hardened my heart toward certain people, or refused to reach out to those whom I have hurt?

Am I living a life committed to justice?

Do I participate actively in community and political life, making all my decisions according to the Gospel?

Have I succumbed to prejudice, bigotry or any form of degradation of people?

Am I growing in my capacity for steadfast and committed love: of myself, of my family and of my friends?

Am I also growing in my capacity for steadfast and committed love for the poorest and for the most rejected, in whom God is also present?

ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF SIN

Loving God, your mercy is our hope: welcome us to the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

Make us a living sign of your love for all to see: people reconciled with you and with each other.

Make us grow in your peace: and seek to spread it throughout the world. In forgiving our sins help us to love others and to forgive their sins against us.

Give light to our darkness: and lead us by your truth.

In your mercy free us from the past: and enable us to begin a new life of holiness.

Overcome the harm our sinfulness has brought us: and guide us back into the ways of love and peace.
