

From the Pastor 18th Sunday in Ordinary Time - B August 4, 2024

THE BREAD OF LIFE
DISCOURSE. Last week
we began a 5-week
consecutive proclamation of the 6th Chapter
of John's Gospel: the
Bread of Life Discourse.
Every 3 years, we
proclaim Mark's Gospel,

which is the shortest of the 4, so we enjoy a 5-week expose on biblical Eucharistic Theology. Since we are also in the 3-year National Eucharistic Revival, our August bulletin articles will be on this Eucharistic theme.

Anyone who has distributed Holy Communion has had some awkward moments. We have had to offer 'just a blessing' or say a kind word to non-Catholics or non-Christians who just 'get in line' to receive what - or rather Who - they are not properly disposed to receive. [The OCIA: Order of Christian Initiation of Adults is open to all non-Catholics who wish to be prepared to receive the Blessed Sacrament.] After saying, "The Body of Christ," we have gotten responses like, "And also with you." - "And with your spirit." and "Thank you." Or we just get a blank stare, which clues us not to even offer the Eucharist to them!

Even <u>more</u> disturbing is: even some Catholics do these things! Some do <u>not</u> say "Amen" which makes us wonder if they know what they are doing. Some say "Amen" <u>AFTER</u> the Host is in their mouth, which could cause it to fall out. Some 'snatch' the Host from us, rather than make a <u>throne</u> for us to carefully place the Host. Some do not fully expose their tongue and expect us to reach <u>INTO</u> their mouth, or <u>bite</u> the Host with their teeth, or <u>lick</u> our fingers. This is not a slot machine. Forgive me for being so grossly honest, but this is the sad reality.

NONE of this is why the USA's Bishops called for a National Eucharistic Revival, but the 'Bread of Life' Discourse provides an opportunity to reflect on our 'Holy Table Manners.' For as a liturgical mantra says: "Lex Orandi/Lex Credendi." This is translated as "the law of prayer or how we worship is the law of belief or what we believe." Or in plain English: what we do or, do not do, shows what we believe, or do not believe. Let me give you a 'host' [pun intended]

of examples of what we <u>should</u> - or should <u>not</u> do - and why.

GENUFLECTING & KNEELING. We 'bend the knee' before His Real Presence in the Eucharist. When possible, we **GENUFLECT** or touch one knee to the floor and make the Sign of the Cross when we enter and leave the place where the Blessed Sacrament is reposed. If the Tabernacle is empty, the door is left open and the Sanctuary Lamp unlit [as it always is from before Holy Thursday's Mass until after Holy Communion at the Easter Vigil] and we BOW to the Altar. We **KNEEL** after the **Santus** for the rest of **Eucharistic** Prayer and after the Lamb of God Litany. As a common sign of reverence, the USA's Bishops direct us to **STAND** to receive Holy Communion, since we have already knelt twice to show our respect, and to avoid kicking or tripping others.

COMMUNION IN THE HAND. To receive in the hand, form a 'throne' with one hand under the other - raised high so the Minister can see how you wish to receive Holy Communion. BOW right before the Minister says, "The Body of Christ Say "Amen" and allow the Host to be SECURELY PLACED in the PALM of your hand; do not reach for or pinch it lest it be knocked to the floor. WHILE still standing before the Minister, place the Host in your mouth, and return to your place.

<u>communion on the tongue</u>. To receive on the <u>tongue</u>, extend your tongue out for hygienic reasons, so the <u>Minister</u> does not touch your lips, tongue, mouth or teeth. <u>BOW</u> as the <u>Minister</u> says, "<u>The Body of Christ</u>" - say "<u>Amen</u>" - and <u>then</u> extend your tongue so the <u>Minister</u> can place the <u>Host</u> on it. Then return to your place.

OTHER CONCERNS. Should a Host fall, the Minister normally picks it up unless it was already in your mouth; please be kind and hygienic: pick it up, since it was in your mouth, and consume it. Making a Sign of the Cross is optional; no need to show a sign of reverence to the Altar, Tabernacle or Crucifix for JESUS HIMSELF IS IN YOU! Barring an emergency or if performing another Ministry [i.e.: hand out our bulletins, etc.], all should return to their place, join in the Communion Chant, and pray. In the coming weeks: Eucharist is the Real Presence.
