

From the Pastor The Epiphany of the Lord January 5, 2025

SAINT PAUL-OUTSIDE-THE-WALLS BASILICA. The Holy Father opened the Holy Doors at the Papal Basilica of Saint Paul-

Outside-the-Walls [henceforth: PBSPOTW] today, so we will explain its significance. This is #4 in our yearlong Jubilee Year series; for past articles, like the explanation of the second set of the four Holy Doors opened, at the Pope's Cathedral, the Basilica Cathedral of Saint John Lateran, visit our parish website We will reflect on the other two Major Basilicas: Saint Peter Basilica, the first Holy Doors, which were opened on Christmas Eve, near Saint Peter's Feast Day - and Saint Mary Major, near a Marian Feast Day. Back to PBSPOTW.


**ANOTHER GIFT TO NEWLY 'LEGIT' CHURCH.** 

Soon after the Emperor's Edict or the 'Peace of Constantine' in 313 granted the Church legal status, he permitted excavation at the site where Saint Paul the Apostle's remains supposedly rest. He was probably beheaded around 65-67 by Nero, a mile or so from his tomb, where 1<sup>st</sup> Century graves were found, so Constantine had a Basilica built over it, which Pope Saint Sylvester [Feast Day: 12/31] consecrated in 324. [Even though Saint Paul was a professed Christian, which costs one many privileges and rights, he was a Roman citizen and, unlike Saint Peter, would have been granted a formal burial and identifiable gravesite.

Over the centuries, the PBSPOTW was renovated and enlarged; courtyards, naves and cloisters were added; huge walls to defend it were erected; and it was adorned with a bell tower and magnificent ornate Byzantine doors. It was, until the construction of the 'new' Saint Peter Basilica in 1626, the largest Basilica in Rome!

On July 15, 1823, a fire destroyed it, but it was reconstructed with whatever survived the catastrophic disaster and was rededicated by Pope Gregory XVI in 1840. In 1928, a portico with 150 columns was added, and it has been maintained and underwritten by the generosity of benefactors from all over the world. However, its most notable - and talked about - feature goes back to the 5<sup>th</sup> Century, to the days of Pope Saint Leo the Great.

PAPAL MEDALLIONS. In the 5<sup>th</sup> Century, the PBSPOTW became the home of a long series of medallions; each one depicts one of our 266 Popes, from Saint Peter to the present pontiff, see above. They are just over



4½ feet tall; while most of them ring the interior walls of the Basilica, a few are on the exterior walls. Legends abound that once there is no more room for another of these papal friezes [a broad horizontal band of sculpted or painted decorations, especially on a wall near the ceiling] it will be the end of the world. These apocryphal tales, not sanctioned by the Church, have been 'adapted' over the centuries as 'new' walls for the friezes have been 'found.' [So, relax; "it ain't over till it's over," which could be soon!]

THE QUEST FOR CHRISTIAN UNITY. At the Last Supper, Jesus fervently prayed that we, His Church: "may all be one, as you, Father, are in me and I in you, that they also may be in us, that the world may believe that you sent me." [John 17:21] The scandal of Christian DIS-unity - and the all-out fights we Christians have had with each other - compromises, cripples or kills our mission. While our efforts may seem miniscule, given the task of reunifying the Church, at least after 400 years of little, if any, ecumenical dialogue, in the past 50 years or so have seen some steps toward unity. The PBSPOTW is, in some ways, Ground Zero in the efforts to deepen our unity in Christ.

Eight days before the Feast of the Conversion of Saint Paul, January 25, the Church begins a novena or nine days of prayer with a solemn ceremony at the PBSPOTW. The annual Week of Prayer for Christian Unity seeks to focus on what we share in common, above all, our common Baptism, which makes us brothers and sisters in Christ. May the Apostle who rests beneath the PBSPOTW, which archeological studies seem to verify, intercede for the Church and her quest for reunion. May this Jubilee Holy Year and its activities, also bring us one step closer. Happy New Year 2025!






