

BAPTISM OF THE LORD



Today's Readings & Gospel *Reflections by Rev. Leonard N. Peterson*

Reading I: Isaiah 42: 1-4, 6-7
The servant whom the prophet speaks of is a "chosen one," just like Moses and David. He contrasts his gentle ways with a military method.

Nevertheless, he will still "bring forth justice."

Reading II: Acts 10: 34-38
Peter acts as a missionary preacher in this scene at Cornelius' house, announcing the original proclamation of God's working through Jesus who was "anointed with the Spirit and power."

The Gospel: Luke 3: 15-16, 21-22
John proclaims that One is coming
who will baptize "with the Holy Spirit
and fire." Then Jesus submits to
John's baptism to endorse all that
John preached. Notably Jesus prays at
this time of His own endorsement by
the Father and the Holy Spirit.

From the Pastor The Baptism of the Lord January 9, 2022

Year 'C' - THE GOSPEL OF SAINT LUKE. Today's celebration of The Baptism of the Lord brings an end to Christmastime; we enter Ordinary Time tomorrow. For the next 7 Sundays; then, after Lent, the Sacred

Triduum, and Eastertime, we reenter Ordinary Time and the Gospel [except on Trinity Sunday] will come from Luke for the next 23 Sundays! So, let's refresh our knowledge of this Evangelist and Luke's many unique accounts of Jesus' earthly life. We begin by praying the Collect for the Mass on Saint Luke's Feast Day: October 18.

Collect - Saint Luke, Evangelist
Lord God, who chose Saint Luke
to reveal by his preaching and writings
the mystery of your love for the poor, grant that
those who already glory in your name
may persevere as one heart and one soul and that
all nations may merit to see your salvation.
Through our Lord Jesus ... ever and ever. Amen.

WHO WERE SAINT LUKE'S SOURCES? Most scripture scholars agree that Matthew and Luke had the same main source: both seem to have started with Mark's Gospel. Both enhanced it with other unknown sources and 'adapted' their Gospel to the community for which they wrote. Matthew, who wrote for a mainly Jewish audience, stresses how Jesus fulfilled what we call 'Old' Testament prophecies. Luke, who wrote to Gentiles whom Jews thought to be excluded from God's promises, highlights how Jesus reached out to ALL people: Jew and Gentile, men and women, saint and sinner. What makes Saint Luke's Gospel unique?

As Luke bluntly states: "Since many have undertaken to compile a narrative of the events that have been fulfilled among us, just as those who were eyewitnesses from the beginning and ministers of the word have handed them down to us, I too have decided, after investigating everything accurately anew, to write it down in an orderly sequence for you." [Luke 1:1-3] There are many theories as to who he investigated and who helped him better organize his Gospel.

As seen above, tradition has long held that **Saint Luke** crafted at least 3 icons of our **Blessed**

Mother and that she was one of his primary sources. Only Luke gives us the most details of that first Christmas; only he tells of the conception of John the Baptist; the angelic visits to John's father, Zechariah, and to Mary. Only Luke says that poor, lowly shepherds were the Christ Child's first visitors, and that Jesus was presented in the Temple and it was there that, as a young boy, He was found teaching the elders. Only Luke records the great canticles, prayed each day: the Canticle of Zechariah [Morning Prayer], Canticle of Mary [Evening Prayer] and the Canticle of Simeon [Night Prayer]. Logic says the only one who would know all this was she who "kept all these things, reflecting on them in her heart" [Luke 2:19] - our Blessed Mother.

We are also indebted to Luke for being the only Evangelist who gives us some of the most treasured Gospel passages. Among them are the Parables of the Good Samaritan [10:29-37], the Woman's Lost Coin [15:8-10], the Prodigal Son [15:11-32], the Rich Man and Lazarus [16:19-31], the Widow and the Unjust Judge [18:1-8] and the Pharisee and the Tax Collector [18:9-14]. Only Luke has these memorable quotes: "One's life does not consist of possessions" [12:15] - "Do not be afraid any longer, little flock" [12:22] - "The kingdom of God is among you" [17:21] - "Father, forgive them, they know not what they do" [23:34] and "Today you will be with me in Paradise" [23:43].

As a physician, Luke gives very detailed accounts of the healing miracles, describing ailments from a very sensitive doctor's perspective. He alone notes that as Jesus prayed in the Garden of Gethsemane His sweat was "like drops of blood" [22-44]. As the only non-Jewish writer in the New Testament [Luke was Greek by birth], he stresses Jesus' outreach to Gentiles or non-Jews. wrote a sequel to his Gospel, which is the longest of the four Gospels, known as the Acts of the Apostles - the Church's first 'history' book. We put single quotes marks about 'history' since Luke did not intend it as a totally factual record of events, but as a modified account that stresses the theological importance of the early decades of Christianity. May we draw closer to God and His Church through Luke's Gospel.

In the back of our Church, we have the Evangelist Door. There you will find a very short description of his Gospel and the date of his feast day, In Christ,




