

**From the Pastor**  
**2<sup>nd</sup> Sunday in  
Ordinary Time - B**  
**January 17, 2021**

**'FABIAN, BISHOP,  
MARTYR.'** This week, on January 20, we have the option of celebrating holy Mass in memory of our 20<sup>th</sup> Pope: Saint Fabian. We know nothing about

his early life or his 14 years as Pope [236-250], but other Popes and Church historians give us some interesting tidbits about him. After praying the Collect for his Feast Day, we'll explain some of the details of his pontificate.

**Collect - Saint Fabian, Pope & Martyr**  
O God, glory of your Priests, grant, we pray,  
that, helped by the intercession of your  
Martyr Saint Fabian, we may make progress  
by communion in the faith  
and by worthy service.  
Through our Lord Jesus ... for ever and ever. Amen.

**A 'HISTORY MAKER.'** In modern times, papal elections draw many to the **Eternal City**; faithful Catholics, the mass media and the curious fill Saint Peter Square. Something similar occurred in ancient times, especially when there was a lull in the persecution of Christians. While Cardinals did not become the sole electors of Popes until the 1090's, Bishops and other Church leaders always took part in the process; many times, the decision was simply made by acclamation.

When the Chair of Peter became vacant in 236, a layman and farmer by the name of Fabian went to Rome to 'witness' history - but 'made' history. During a gathering of many well-qualified clergy, a dove descended from the ceiling and rested atop of the then unknown Fabian. The stunned assembly, recalling what we heard in last week's Gospel: how a dove hovered over Jesus at His Baptism, saw this 'sign' as God's choice for the Bishop of Rome, and Fabian was acclaimed Pope! While some scoff at this, the Apostles chose Judas' replacement, Saint Matthias, by lot. For in biblical days, people chose such methods to give God the chance to intervene if He wished! So, in art, Saint Fabian is often depicted with a dove hovering above his head.

**THE SYMBOL OF VICTORY.** In addition to a dove, Saint Fabian is also depicted holding a

palm branch: symbol of victory over the forces of evil and death. During Saint Fabian's reign, the Roman Emperor Decius began the first empire-wide persecution of Christians; however, he only went after the head of **Christ's Body:** Bishops and other Church leaders. Although the Bishop of Rome's role is less established as it is today, 'getting a Pope' was Decius' main goal. Once captured, he had Pope Fabian imprisoned, tortured, and executed ... but there's much more to his story!

**A GIFTED ADMINISTRATOR.** During the reign of the Roman Emperor Philip, who was kind to Christians, Pope Fabian embarked on building and ornamenting the catacombs, the burial place for Christians, and where Mass was often celebrated. This not only provided a more suitable worship place, it helped protect these holy sites for the future. By designating a section for the burial of Popes, he preserved their relics. While he himself was buried in that section, his remains were transferred in the 1700's to the Basilica of Saint Sebastian, with whom he shares a Feast Day. But in 1850, an archeologist found at his initial tomb a small chunk of marble with the inscription: 'Fabian, Bishop, Martyr' - and in 1915, his tombstone and remains were reunited!

He also set up the organizational format which became what we call 'Dioceses' and 'Parishes.' It took centuries for the hierarchy as we know it to take form, but it always existed in seminal form. The first Pope, Saint Peter, and the Apostles, the first Bishops, made the first Priests [whom they called Presbyters] and Deacons. In time, to these three levels of Holy Orders, were added the now-defunct 'Minor Orders of Porter, Lector, Acolyte and Exorcist. Pope Fabian used this 'hierarchy' to 'organize' and 'structure' the Church.

This enabled the core of our Catholic Faith or its main dogmas to be the same everywhere. But it also allowed nonessential, optional things, like ritual styles, and other local customs, to be adapted to each community's situation or special needs. This, in turn, enabled the Church to keep the 'Deposit of Faith' intact as she spread the 'One True Faith' at one and the same time! And we can thank the brilliant organization skills of Pope Saint Fabian for all this helpful, innovative centralization. Pope Saint Fabian, pray for us!

Thank you to all who helped decorate the church so beautifully. And also to those who helped undecorate the Church at the end of the Christmas season.

This year we were able to have our Masses available on our website and Face Book page for those who are unable to attend Mass in person in these trying times. In the future, we will be appealing for more people to join this ministry.






