Therefore, couples should make arrangements at the Parish Office one year before the planned wedding date and before finalizing any social plans.

From the Pastor
2nd Sunday in
Ordinary Time - C
January 19, 2025

NEW HOLY YEAR MASS ORATIONS: SET A. Three new sets of Mass orations have been provided for use on weekdays when a Solemnity, Feast, Memorial, or other **non-**optional set of orations is obligatory, as in Holy and Easter Week. Here is 'Set A' with reflections.

Collect - Mass for the Holy Year - A
Almighty ever-living God,
fervent desire of the human heart,
look with favor upon your people who make their pilgrim journey in this year of grace,
so that, bound to Christ the rock of salvation,
they may happily attain
the goal of blessed hope.
Through our Lord Jesus ... for ever and ever. Amen.

CLING TO THE ROCK. The refrain of the American folksong, 'How Can I Keep From Singing?' echoes this oration's theme: "No storm can shake my inmost calm, While to that rock I'm clinging." By tradition, Catholic Altars were made of marble or other stone [now it is common to see wooden altars like our altar]; at one time, a small Altar Stone was inlaid in Altars not made of stone. Why? Jesus is the Rock upon whom the wise build their lives, unlike the foolish, who build their lives on sand. [Cf Matthew 24:27] In this Holy Year, how will you make Jesus your Rock so that, unlike those who reject God, it can be said of you: "The stone that the builders rejected has become the cornerstone." [Mark 12:10]

Prayer over the Offerings - Mass for the Holy Year - A
Accept in compassion, Lord, we pray,
the offerings of your family,
so that under your protective care
they may never lose what they have received,
but attain the gifts that are eternal.
Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

USE IT ... OR LOSE IT. This oration reminds us to be 'practicing' Catholics, we are never inactive or under the illusion we are finished.' While we cannot be 'unbaptized,' and our First Communion, Confirmation or Anointings in the Sacrament of the Sick cannot be revoked, as Marriage and Ordination can be, no Sacrament does us any good if it is not activated, nurtured, consciously reflected on. What will you do with

the Sacraments you have received in this Holy Year?

Preface - Mass for the Holy Year - A
It is truly right and just, our duty and our salvation,
always and everywhere to give you thanks,
Lord, holy Father, almighty and eternal God.
For in this time of grace,
you gather your children into one family,
so that, enlightened by the Word of Life,
they may joyfully celebrate
the mystery of your Son crucified and risen.
He is salvation, ever invoked and awaited,
who calls all to his table,
heals the wounds of body and spirit,
and to the afflicted gives joy.
Through all these signs of your favor, we are reborn with living faith to a more certain hope,
and we offer ourselves to our brothers and sisters in loving service,
as we await the return of the Lord.
Through him, with the Angels and all the Saints,
we sing the hymn of your praise,
as without end we acclaim: Holy, Holy, Holy ...

A CALL TO ACTION. New Prefaces are rarely created; this one is superb. It issues a loud call to **GET INVOLVED**: be a more active worshipper; get renewed by coming to Holy Communion, the Confessional, the Sacrament of the Sick; use every means available, and the special Jubilee Year events, to bolster our Parish's faith, hope and love, which will increase our good works.

that, made one body and one spirit in Christ,
we may rise with him to glory.

As we gather as one to celebrate Eucharist, God expects us to join forces to change the world. Even if we do nothing 'extra' or 'special' for this Holy Year, what can we do to better know, work with, and support our Parish Community and the Diocese of Trenton in the good works done by others in our name?

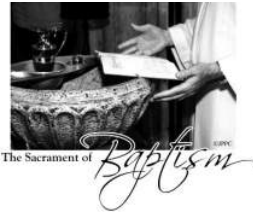

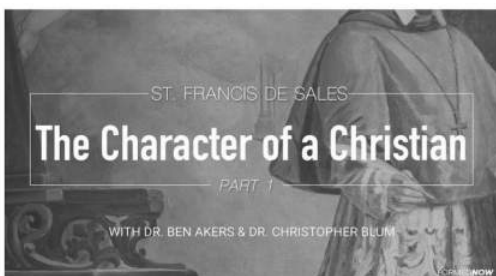

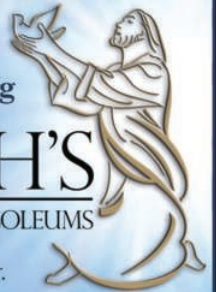
