

From the Pastor 3rd Sunday in Ordinary Time - C January 23, 2022

AN UNSUNG HEROINE? Many have heard of Saint Damien of Molokai, the Belgium born

Priest who accepted God's call to tend to the unwanted sent to die in quarantined leper-colonies on an Hawaiian island. But after contracting and dying from Hansen's disease on April 15, 1889, his ministry was led by the Religious Sister

pictured above: Saint Marianne Cope. She died of natural causes on August 9, 1918, was

beatified in 2005, and canonized in 2012. Her Feast Day is the day she was born in 1838 in Germany: January 23, which is <u>not</u> celebrated when it falls on a Sunday as it does this year. More about her life and ministry after praying her Feast Day's Collect.

<u>Collect - Saint Marianne Cope, Virgin</u> O God, who called us to serve your Son in the least of our brothers and sisters, grant, we pray, that by the example and intercession of the Virgin Saint Marianne Cope, we may burn with love for you and for those who suffer. Through our Lord Jesus ... for ever and ever. Amen.

GOD'S WAYS VERSUS OUR WAYS. One of ten children born to a German farmer, Peter Koob, and his wife Barbara, the future Saint was named after her mother. A year or so after her birth, her family emigrated to the USA and settled in Utica, NY, where their surname was 'Americanized' to 'Cope.' After graduating from Saint Joseph Parish School, young Barbara worked in a factory to support her family after her father became ill. This delayed her desire to enter the Convent for almost 10 years; at 24, she entered the novitiate and on November 19, 1862, made her religious profession as a Sister of Saint Francis in Syracuse, NY, and was given the name: 'Sr. Marianne.' She served as a teacher and principal in several NY State elementary schools.

GOD'S 'RE-DIRECTION' OF HER LIFE. Her love was for teaching, but her superiors, noticing her skills, called on her to help establish two central NY area hospitals. In her new ministry as a nurse -administrator, she assisted those who, at that time, were deemed unworthy of help: alcoholics, 'outcasts,' and other 'undesirables.' In 1877 she was elected provincial and '*Mother Marianne's*' compassion and dedication to the least of Christ's brothers and sisters became widespread. Not surprisingly, when she received a letter from a Catholic Priest asking for help in managing the hospitals and schools in the Hawaiian Islands that took in lepers, she and six other Sisters of Saint Francis headed off to Honolulu in November of 1883.

A LIGHT IN THE DARKNESS. At first, she and her Sisters opened a hospital and school for girls; despite Church and Government concerns for their safety, the Sisters reached out to destitute and 'wayward' girls and women. In January 1884, she met Father Damien for the first time; when he became ill with leprosy and was shunned by Church and State officials, she took care of him and accepted the management of the ministries he had founded and led. Then her light began to truly shine in the darkness!

Contrary to the practice of the time, she insisted on - and I quote her - on making "life as pleasant and as comfortable as possible for those whom God has chosen to afflict with this terrible

disease." She encouraged her Sisters to always be optimistic and serene, trustful and hopeful, and not to be fearful of contracting leprosy. She instilled cleanliness, pride - and even fun - into the leper colony; children and women were to wear bright colored scarves and pretty dresses; she made respectful treatment of the sickest and most miserable lepers mandatory! All were to strive to see the face of Christ in each other and to build the Kingdom of God where some, if not many, found it hard to even believe in God!

A SPECIAL PATRONESS. Even after offering thirtyfive years of dedicated service on earth, Saint Marianne Cope is still at work from heaven! On October 21, 2012, in the same ceremony in which Saint Kateri Tekakwitha was canonized, Pope Benedict XVI said of her, "[she] showed the highest love, courage and enthusiasm ... and is a shining and energetic example of the best of the tradition of Catholic nursing sisters and of the spirit of her beloved Saint Francis." She is the Patron Saint of Lepers, Outcasts, Those With AIDS/HIV, and of Hawaii. Saint Marianne Cope pray for us!


