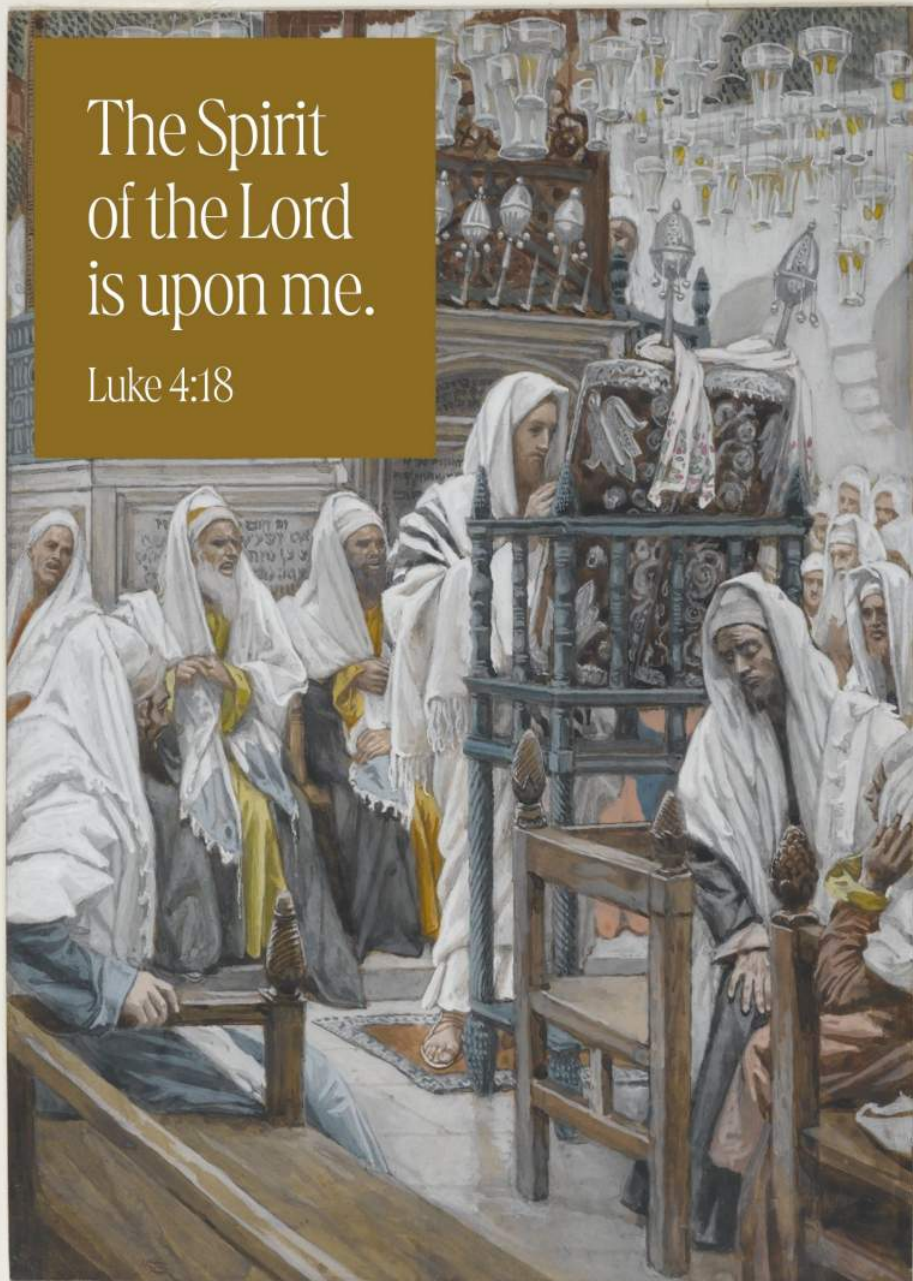

From the Pastor
3rd Sunday in
Ordinary Time - C
January 26, 2025

JUBILEE OF THE WORLD OF COMMUNICATIONS. The first of the special 'Jubilee Weekend' themes that will occur throughout the Holy Year is 'The World of

Communication.' It appropriately falls on the 3rd Sunday of Ordinary Time which Pope Francis declared to be 'Word of God Sunday' in 2019. The events at the Vatican will both honor and challenge those who work in the world of communication: journalists, media professionals, managers and editors of newspapers, Boards of Directors, video makers, graphic designers, copywriters, Public Relations staff, social media managers, audio and video technicians, typographers, IT experts, and the like. Why?

I need not explain how virulently contentious the world of communications is these days. Some are so disgusted by the bias and outright lies promoted by news outlets that they have limited or even ceased watching the news and reading the papers! It seems that many information sources never heard the Commandment:

"You shall not bear false witness against your neighbor." [Exodus 20:16] As bad as this is with 'gossipy tabloid' news, it is far worse, and sinful, when it destroys careers, reputations, people's livelihoods and, most dangerous of all, their Faith in God and/or His Church. [Sadly, Priests often do enough damage to the Church and ourselves because of our own sins and imperfections ... we need no help from vindictive media sources!]

BIBLICALLY BASED ADVICE. Some say God gave us two ears and one mouth so we would listen more and speak less! However, to speak the truth we must listen to and strive to echo Jesus, who is "the Way, the Truth, and the Life." [John 14: 6] and is God's Truth in human form. We also gain great guidance from Saint Paul who wrote: "No foul language should come out of your mouths, but only such as is good for needed edification, that it may impart grace to those who hear. [Ephesians 4:29] which is more casually translated, "Say only the good things others need to hear." For even when we must offer stern words of fraternal correction, we must speak and act in LOVE. Then, and only then, will "we know the truth, and the Truth will set us [and others] free." [Cf. John 8:32]

HOW CAN WE, THE CHURCH, SET THE EXAMPLE?

On rare occasion, I am asked why I do not preach more often about 'hot topic' issues like abortion, what constitutes a valid marriage, politicians and the like. Know that I know and try to profess what the Church teaches about these things, and so do many, if not most Catholics. Simply put, I try to be like Jesus, who called people to "come and see." [Cf John 1:39, 46] Only after they had a relationship with Jesus did He call them to strive harder to know and live the Truth. To put it in common parlance, "you catch more flies with honey than you do with vinegar!" Besides, the place to work out the differences between the ideals God calls us to live by - and the reality we live - is the Confessional, or with a trained Spiritual Director, not the public forum.

Pope Francis lives by this non-confrontational mindset, as did our first Pope: "Always be ready to give an explanation to anyone who asks you for a reason for your hope, but do it with gentleness and reverence." [1 Peter 3:15-16] While we may not be able to alter the content or tone of what others say, we can learn to control what comes out of our own mouths ... and how it is said. The Holy Father suggests that to do this, all our words must first pass through our heart.

This requires us, before saying anything, to pray that we will be seen and heard as icons of Christ. If our body language and facial expressions do not imitate Jesus ... we need to alter ourselves to conform to the image of Christ. I can still hear my mother saying, "Don't look at me like that!" ... and I had enough wisdom and desire for self-preservation NOT to point out that Jesus would not approve of the face she was giving me as she said those words!

INTERCEDE FOR OTHERS, TOO. It would also be very helpful if we prayed for those who are commissioned to speak in the name of the Church or the State. May they be as gentle and honest in their reports on events and people as they hope God will be when He judges them! May our world be a better informed and more loving place because of the service they provide to give us the truth, the whole truth, and nothing but the God's honest truth.

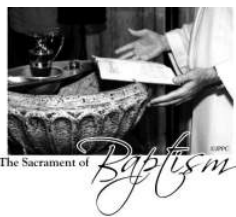


Is God Calling you to Help

Blood Pressure Screening at St. Justin's Church

One third of people in America suffer from high blood pressure. This is a dangerous condition that can lead to heart disease or strokes. Did you know that over 50% of people who suffer from high blood pressure have their condition under control. It is recommended that adults have blood pressure checks regularly.

When: Volunteer RNs will be available at St. Justin's conference room after Masses on **Sat. & Sun., Feb 15th & 16th.**

How: A blood pressure cuff will be placed around your upper arm. It is inflated and tightened around your arm. Once the cuff has tightened, the RN will let air out gradually. The results are presented in two numbers. You will be given your results to share with your doctor

The Sacrament of the

Anointing of the Sick

We will celebrate the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick
Saturday, February 8, 2025, at 2:00pm

No registration is required, just come to the Mass.

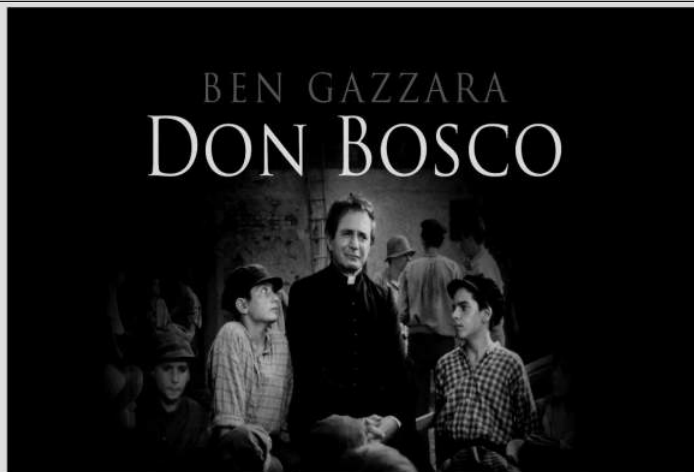
Anointing "is not a sacrament for only those who are at the point of death" but is intended for all those who are seriously ill. Consequently, what we formerly called "Extreme Unction" is now more properly called "The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick".

More has changed than the sacrament's name. Our experience of the revised Sacrament of the Anointing has brought about a change in the way we think about the sacrament. For example: 1) This sacrament (like all sacraments) is a community celebration; 2) sickness involves more than bodily illness; and 3) anointing heals us through faith.

Offering the sacrament before one is in the final moments of life affords the patient a better opportunity to appreciate the prayers and symbols of the rite. Also, in light of a shortage of priestly vocations and increasing demands on the priest's time, a priest may not be immediately available at the final moments of life.

The grace of the sacrament has the following effects: the uniting of the sick person to the passion of Christ for his or her own good and for that of the whole Church; the strengthening, peace, and courage to endure in a Christian manner the sufferings of illness or old age; the restoration of health, if it is conducive to the salvation of his soul; and preparation for the passing from this life to eternal life (Catechism 1532).
