MARRIAGE: The Sacrament of Marriage requires a time of spiritual preparation. According to the Common Policy adopted by the Bishops of New Jersey, this preparation requires attendance at a marriage preparation program (Pre-Caná) as well as sessions with the parish deacon or priest. Therefore, couples should make arrangements at the Parish Office one year before the planned wedding date and before finalizing any social plans.

OUR LADY OF LOURDES. Today the Church pauses its Ordinary Time Rites to celebrate The Presentation of the Lord - 'Candlemas' or 'The Mass of Candles.' All faithful Jewish parents brought their 40-day-old first-born son to the Temple for a ritual blessing. For as God told Moses: "Consecrate to me every firstborn; whatever opens the womb among the Israelites ... belongs to me." [Exodus 13:2] Since the Prophet Simeon proclaimed Jesus "a light for revelation to the Gentiles, and glory for your people Israel." [Luke 2:32] the Church blesses candles today.

Since blessed candles played a significant role on our Parish Pilgrimage to Fatima and Lourdes last year, I will pre-empt my Jubilee Year reflections to fulfill my promise to offer reflections on that pilgrimage during the year when appropriate. Although the optional memorial of Our Lady of Lourdes is on February 11, and next weekend is the Jubilee Day for Armed Forces, Police and Security Officials, I will share with you my main memories of our visit to Lourdes.

Our 48-hour visit to Lourdes was in the middle of our pilgrimage; we arrived *Sunday* afternoon [11/17] after a long bus ride from *Loyola, Saint Ignatius'* birthplace, where we were scheduled to celebrate *holy Mass* ... but pilgrimages, like life, rarely go as planned. We settled for a small chapel near our hotel, where a few people got stuck in the elevator. We returned to that chapel the next day to celebrate the *Sacrament of the*

Sick; even the elderly Religious Sister, who served as Sacristan yet spoke no English, was so moved by our singing and prayers, she joined us for the Anointing. Then we received a great blessing.

We were slated for holy Mass at the Chapel of Saint Maximilian Kolbe, but the rain [it snowed the next day] kept the crowds down, so we got 'bumped' up to the very wet but beautiful Grotto Shrine for the 8:30 AM Mass in English.

However, when my brother, Fr. Mike, Fr. Tom Serafin and I, and Deacons Jim Gillespie [from our Parish], Jim Guida [St. Mary, Rutherford] and Bill Weber [St. Elizabeth Ann Seton, Three Bridges] entered the Sacristy, we found two other American Priests already vested. Since they had both celebrated before at the Grotto, they let us be the main presiders and Deacon Bill, a Hospital Chaplain at St. Peter Hospital in New Brunswick, preached on the Mass orations, 'The BVM, Health of the Sick.' Celebrating holy Mass at that Altar, under that statue of Our Lady of Lourdes, was certainly one of the highpoints of the pilgrimage.

CANDLELIGHT PROCESSION. Although there are no Candlelight Processions scheduled at that time of year - it's too cold! - we held our own 'impromptu' rites. That night, many of us gathered around the ring of candles beneath the statue to sing our Marian hymns as others sang to her in their own language. Many prayed the Rosary. And many, if not most - or even all - lit candles as a sign that our intentions, which would continue even after we left the Shrine, were securely entrusted to Our Lady of Lourdes.

The 'tradition' of leaving lit candles at Lourdes is from the 4th apparition on February 19, 1858. Saint Bernadette went to the Grotto, which civil authorities had forbidden her to do, with a lit candle; some say she held it until it was totally consumed - yet she was not burned. The next day, one of her aunts gave her a candle, which she rested on the Grotto walls - and a tradition was born! Many purchased containers and filled them from the spickets flowing from the Shrine Church's walls to bring home some Lourdes Water, some of which I used for the Rite of Sprinkling on the Baptism of the Lord.

One third of people in America suffer from high blood pressure. This is a dangerous condition that can lead to heart disease or strokes. Did you know that over 50% of people who suffer from high blood pressure have their condition under control. It is recommended that adults have blood pressure checks regularly. A blood pressure cuff will be placed around your upper arm. It is inflated and tightened around your arm. Once the cuff has tightened, the RN will let air out gradually. The results are presented in two numbers. You will be given your results to share with your doctor

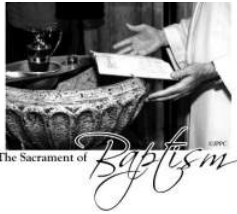


Is God Calling you to Help

The Sacrament of the

Anointing of the Sick

**We will celebrate the Sacrament of the
 Anointing of the Sick
 Saturday, February 8, 2025, at 2:00pm**

No registration is required, just come to the Mass.

Anointing "is not a sacrament for only those who are at
 the point of death" but is intended for all those who are
 seriously ill. Consequently, what we formerly called
 "Extreme Unction" is now more properly called
 "The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick".

More has changed than the sacrament's name. Our
 experience of the revised Sacrament of the Anointing has
 brought about a change in the way we think about the
 sacrament. For example: 1) This sacrament (like all
 sacraments) is a community celebration; 2) sickness
 involves more than bodily illness; and 3) anointing heals
 us through faith.

Offering the sacrament before one is in the final moments
 of life affords the patient a better opportunity to
 appreciate the prayers and symbols of the rite. Also, in
 light of a shortage of priestly vocations and increasing
 demands on the priest's time, a priest may not be
 immediately available at the final moments of life.

The grace of the sacrament has the following effects: the
 uniting of the sick person to the passion of Christ for his
 or her own good and for that of the whole Church; the
 strengthening, peace, and courage to endure in a Christian
 manner the sufferings of illness or old age; the restoration
 of health, if it is conducive to the salvation of his soul;
 and preparation for the passing from this life to eternal
 life (Catechism 1532).

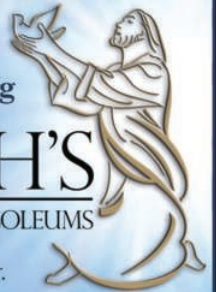
