From the Pastor

**ARMED FORCES, POLICE & SECURITY OFFICIALS.** On the second special 'Jubilee Weekend' in this Holy Year we honor those who

protect and defend us: those in the **Armed Forces and Police & Security Officials**. These reflections are based on the homily given by **Saint John Paul II** at the Jubilee Year 2000 celebration honoring those in law enforcement and on **Pope Francis'** message to a gathering of military personnel at the **64<sup>th</sup> International Military Pilgrimage** last May.

In 1958, the **100<sup>th</sup> Anniversary** of the apparition of the **Immaculate Conception to Saint Bernadette**, a troop of French soldiers made a pilgrimage to **Lourdes** to pray for peace - a tradition that continues to this day. In his message to them, **Pope Francis** wrote: "The world needs you, especially at this dark moment in our history. We need men and women of faith who are capable of putting weapons at the service of peace and brotherhood." These words echoed and reinforced what his predecessor had said in 2000. **Pope Francis** also encouraged them to be people of profoundly deep prayer so they could face the harsh realities they endure with compassion and hope.

An old joke asks, "Why are some cops and clergy so sinful?" - "The troublemakers they interrogate ... and the sinners who confess to them ... tell them who all the bad people are ... and all the bad places to go!" Additionally, in the case of military personnel and armed protectors, it goes against the grain of our fallen human nature **NOT** to respond in kind to those who are often so wicked. That's why prayer, and more prayer, is essential! So, too, the need for those in these careers to regularly practice their **Faith** and allow their **Faith** to govern how they use the powers entrusted to them for the common good.

**CATHOLIC TEACHING ON BEARING ARMS.** As **Cain's** murder of his brother **Abel** shows, the human heart, created to be loving, can become hardened and violent. We cannot ignore this sad fact. So, the **Church** teaches: "*Legitimate defense can be not only a right but a grave duty for one who is responsible for the lives of others. The defense of the common good requires that an unjust aggressor be rendered unable to cause*

*harm. For this reason, those who legitimately hold authority also have the right to use arms to repel aggressors against the civil community entrusted to their responsibility.*" [Catechism of the Catholic Church #2265] As **Pope Saint John Paul** said as he implored prayers **FOR** those who wield defensive weapons and encouraged them to **pray for themselves**: "Who better than you, dear soldiers and members of the police ... can testify to the violence and to the disruptive forces of evil present in the world? You fight against them every day: indeed, you are called to defend the weak, to protect the honest, to foster the peaceful coexistence of peoples. The role of the sentinel, who scans the horizon to avert danger and promote justice and peace everywhere, befits each of you."

In our prayers we remember **Military Chaplains** of every **Faith** who seek to shine divine guidance and hope onto all who face this world's darkness. We pray for the repose of the souls of all who once served as soldiers, police or security personnel. We ask **Jesus**, who said "No one has greater love than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends." [John 15:13], to welcome into heaven all who died in the line of duty. And we pray for all recruits and those considering a life of service in dangerous fields and their loved ones.

For all of them, we offer this great prayer, full of militarist imagery, from **Saint Paul**: "... draw your strength from the Lord and from his mighty power. Put on the armor of God so that you may be able to stand firm against the tactics of the devil. For our struggle is not with flesh and blood but with the principalities, with the powers, with the world rulers of this present darkness, with the evil spirits in the heavens. Therefore, put on the armor of God, that you may be able to resist on the evil day and, having done everything, to hold your ground. So stand fast with your loins girded in truth, clothed with righteousness as a breastplate, and your feet shod in readiness for the gospel of peace. In all circumstances, hold faith as a shield, to quench all [the] flaming arrows of the evil one. And take the helmet of salvation and the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God." [Ephesians 6:10-17] **May God** bless all who risk their life to protect us!

### **Blood Pressure Screening at St. Justin's Church**

One third of people in America suffer from high blood pressure. This is a dangerous condition that can lead to heart disease or strokes. Did you know that over 50% of people who suffer from high blood pressure have their condition under control. It is recommended that adults have blood pressure checks regularly. A blood pressure cuff will be placed around your upper arm. It is inflated and tightened around your arm. Once the cuff has tightened, the RN will let air out gradually. The results are presented in two numbers. You will be given your results to share with your doctor

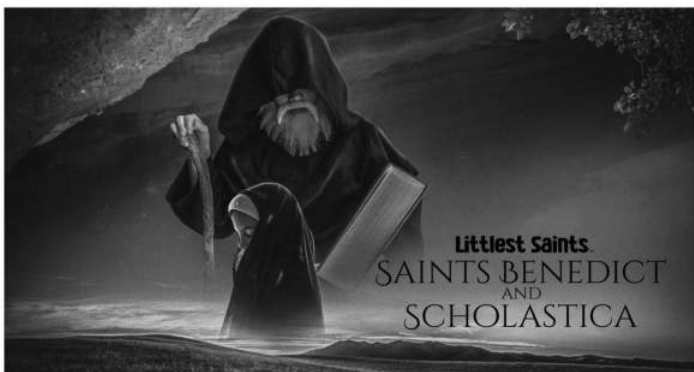
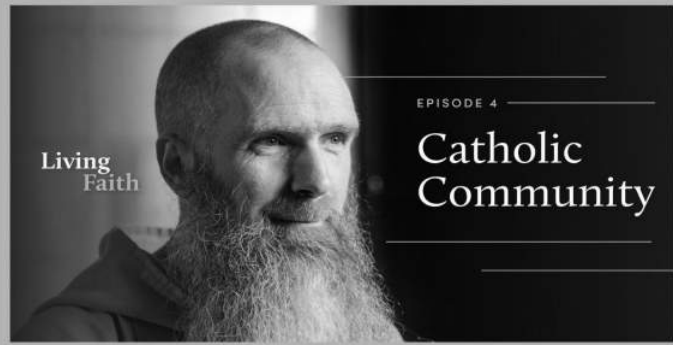

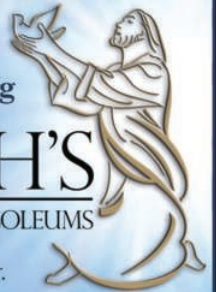
