

Last Sunday before Lent

**ASHES TO ASHES, DUST TO DUST.** The Church has 'changed' her policy on dividing cremated ashes. and with Ash Wednesday this week, it

is most timely to clarify what 'changed.' But first, a tongue-in-cheek story told by a fundraiser at a Stewardship Conference years ago. The speaker joked - and I repeat - JOKED - that one way to raise funds is to let the highest bidder provide someone's ashes for the imposition of ashes on Ash Wednesday. Imagine hearing: "This year's ashes were provided by Grandma Moses, who will be going places she had never been before!" All joking aside, our Parish follows the rubrics and burns the previous year's blessed palm branches. Anyway, here's how Church policy on cremation has evolved over the centuries.

In 1963, the Church lifted her ban on cremation, enacted in the days of ancient Rome, when anti-Christian pagans cremated martyrs, thinking that would keep them from being bodily resurrected. [Since God created everything out of nothing, rearranging our charred atoms on the Last Day is like child's play!] In 1969, the Church added a Rite for interring cremains. Then, in 1997, Funeral Masses WITH cremains were permitted; before that, cremation HAD to take place AFTER Mass. In 2016, the Church restated her preference for bodily burial, but was more acceptable of cremation, unless it is chosen to contradict Christian doctrine. This has always been, and still is, one stipulation for allowing cremation.

**THREE HERESIES: PANTHEISM, NATURALISM & NIHILISM.** These are the main beliefs that make opting for cremation wrong. Pantheists say we all meld into a cosmic soup, with no distinction between us as individuals - or us with God! Naturalists say there is nothing 'supernatural' or beyond what our senses detect, and God, if He exists, merely started creation and does not interact or interfere with it. Nihilists go to the extreme: nothing really exists; everything vanishes into nothing. While real philosophers would rip this simplistic presentation of these heresies to shreds [and rightfully so!] the point is merely to give a basic idea or overview of them.

**THE CASE FOR CREMATION.** Since cremation merely accelerates our natural decomposition, it is allowed, but preferably AFTER all Funeral Rites.

Since, in the Sacraments, our bodies are blessed, anointed, and fed with the Body and Blood of Christ, they are like relics and must be treated honorably - even when they are reduced to ashes. So, like our bodies, our cremated remains **MUST** be interred in a cemetery or specially designated sacred place. This is so important that Catholic Funeral Rites can be denied if the cremains will not be properly interred. Of course, those who earthly remains are obliterated in a disaster or terrorist attack would not be denied a Christian Burial. The bottom line: human ashes must be treated as human bodies are treated after death, which leads us to the most recent clarification in Church policy concerning cremains or ashes.

**CAN WE 'DIVIDE' ASHES?** In 2016, the Church reiterated that ashes can NEVER be scattered, carried in lockets or other jewelry, kept on a mantle, etc. They must be interred in a place the Church designates as sacred: a cemetery, shrine or other holy site. In 2023, the Church further clarified her policy: 1] Ashes **MAY** be combined with other human [but not animal remains] IF the names of all those whose cremains are interred in that place are marked, lest they lose their identity and individuality. 2] **SOME** of the ashes **MAY** be separated and kept in another place, i.e.: a shrine or oratory that had special significance to the deceased and/or his/her loved ones. Note: it is still NOT permissible to keep human cremains in a park or one's home ... unless your home has an officially designated chapel or shrine! Note, too: this has **ALWAYS** been Church policy!

Recently, a relic of Saint Jude the Apostle, believed to be a part of his arm, drew crowds on its pilgrimage through the USA. Our Altar has a relic of the cross of our Lord. Splinters of the cross are enshrined in many places. So, the Church has permitted ashes to be divided, but only if they are to be properly preserved in what an ecclesiastical authority [i.e.: a Bishop] deems a sacred place. May you use this Lent to be properly prepared for death, when "... to dust you shall return!"

St. Justin's is reestablishing the Holy Name Society at the parish!


