From the Pastor
6th Sunday in
Ordinary Time - C

ARTISTS. As said in previous articles on this Jubilee Year [which are available on our parish website], we will devote columns to each of the 'special Jubilee Days' we will mark throughout this Holy Year. This weekend is the 'Jubilee Day for Artists.' Each artist, in his or her own field, reflect the **Ultimate Artist: God our Creator.** Among them are poets, writers, painters, sculptors, architects, actors, craftsmen and, perhaps above all, musicians. I say that because no one asks for a special statue or icon at a **Wedding, Funeral** or other Rite. Sometimes, particular **Scripture** passages are chosen, but **beloved hymns** are **regularly requested.** For sacred music combines both art and words, and in most hymns, art and **God's word.**

THE POWER OF ART. Human beings seem to be the only creature that creates beauty simply for beauty's sake. Beehives, birds' nests, spiders' webs and the like are magnificent to behold, but they are crafted, if not solely made, for utilitarian purposes. To our knowledge, no animal sits back to reflect on the beauty of its creation as we human beings do. For like **God our Creator,** we admire harmony and order, structure and beauty and the 'inner spiritual reality' of physical things. And since the human person is the highpoint of **God's Creation,** what we create ranks higher than what any other creature creates after **God.**

JESUS IS THE IMAGE OF THE INVISIBLE GOD. In our Church's history, some have censured the use of created things to help us better know and understand the **God** we cannot see. Those who hold to this heresy are called 'Iconoclasts,' Greek for 'image-destroyers.' Citing the **Commandment** forbidding graven images, they denounce statues, icons, paintings and other depictions of **God.** However, as **Saint Paul** wrote: "[Jesus] is the image of the invisible **God,** the firstborn of all creation. For in him were created all things in heaven and on earth, the visible and the invisible." [Colossians 1:15] So, as long as we are not worshipping the images themselves, but who or what the image represents, and do not treat them like magic charms or good-luck pieces, we can use sacred images to worship the **God** we cannot see.

SACRED ART AND RELIGION. I already noted the inspirational power music has on us, above and beyond all other forms of art. Yet, as we recently saw, Paris' post-fire, renovated **Notre Dame Cathedral** has set records for the number of visitors since its reopening. Many people stood in a long line at the 1964-65 NY World's Fair to see **Michelangelo's 'Pieta'** as many still do at its home in **Saint Peter Basilica.** I believe most people's image of the **Last Supper** is the one depicted by **Leonardo da Vinci.** And, in **Christian art,** one of the most frequent subjects is the **Annunciation,** perhaps because our **Blessed Mother** is the **second** greatest of all people [her **Son** is Number 1!] since she was conceived without sin. And, since no one knows what **Angels** look like, artists have free rein when creating angelic images. Anyway ... these are just a few examples of how art and religion deeply influence each other.

ART ENHANCES THE INCARNATION. When **Jesus** took on flesh, He wedded heaven and earth. As His mission spread to the ends of the earth, to all nations and peoples, each 'blended' our **Catholic** [which means **Universal**] **Faith** to their culture. We see this in images of **Madonna and Child** in which they are depicted in local garments, various ethnic characteristics and skin colors. **Nativity Scenes, Rosaries, Crosses and Crucifixes** are crafted from Island coconut shells, African ivory, Black Forest wood, glacier ice, etc. For **Christ** came for **all peoples** in **all places** in **all times** ... and our art bears witness to that fact.

ART INSTILLS HOPE IN US. All recent **Popes,** in their addresses to artists, commend them for raising human spirits through their 'ministry.' By lifting our minds and hearts from the ordinary to the sublime, we are raised up to a new hope. Or, as **Pope Francis** told a group of artists gathered in 2023 in another site of sacred images, the **Sistine Chapel,** "You are sharers in **God's dream!**" No wonder that for centuries, the **Catholic Church** was the greatest patron, promoter and supporter of the **Arts** [and **Sciences, too!**] On this **Jubilee for Artists,** may all the faithful join with all artists for a renewed encounter with **Jesus Christ** as pilgrims of hope on the "way of beauty."

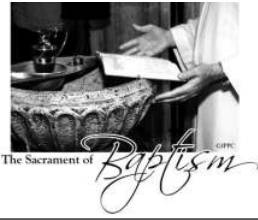
ALTAR ROSARY SOCIETY

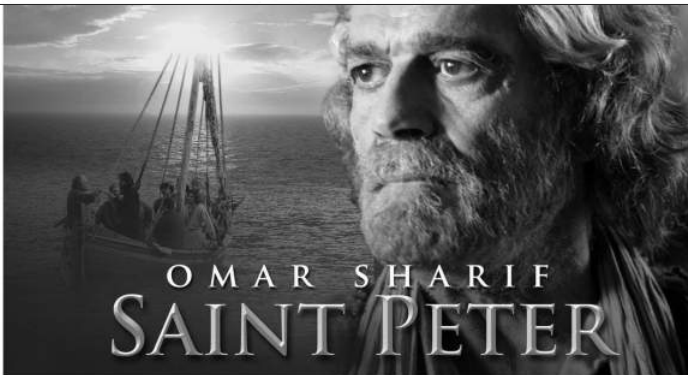
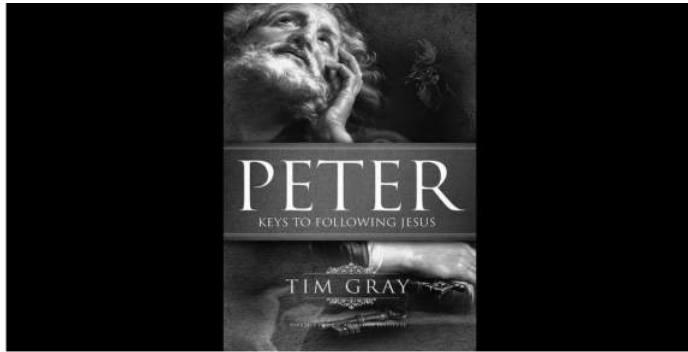

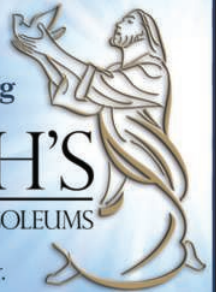
