From the Pastor
1st Sunday of Lent - B
February 18, 2024

HOW TO PREPARE FOR CONFESSION. The revised Order of Penance, which we started using on Ash Wednesday, 2023 and has been mandatory since April 16, 2023,

provides two Penitential Celebrations during Lent or PCDLs. By Parish custom, we do not have Penance Services, but provide Examinations of Conscience in the bulletin and on our website in the weeks before our Lent Confessions: March 22, 5:30 – 7:00 pm. This year I will reflect on one of the two model PCDLs provided by the Order of Penance. These are intended to help us more fruitfully celebrate the Sacrament of Penance. This is Part 1 of the 4 part series on the first sample Penance Service.

"Penance leads to a strengthening or restoring of baptismal grace."

Let us pray ... that we, who through our sins, were unmindful of the grace of Baptism, may now be restored to that grace through penance.

We pray, O Lord, guard with your unfailing love, those you have washed clean, that, redeemed by your Passion, they may rejoice in your Resurrection.

Who live and reign forever and ever. Amen.

This invitation to the first of the two Lenten Penance Services sets the stage: we often forget that we are God's children by adoption through Baptism and fail to act as His children - but God never forgets that we are His beloved sons and daughters! Out of love for us, God sent His Son to suffer and die to redeem us from our sins; by rising from the dead, He restored us to life. By confessing our sins and performing acts of penance, we can reclaim our hope of being future guests at God's table in heaven. However, as infomercials remind us: we must act NOW, as the next part of the Penance Service notes.

Brothers and sisters, now is the acceptable time, the day of divine favor and human salvation, when death is destroyed and eternal life has its beginning; it is the time in the vineyard of the Lord, when, at the planting of the new vines, the old vines are pruned, that they may bear more fruit.

On Ash Wednesday we hear the words, "Now is a very acceptable time." [2 Corinthians 6:2] - not that God ever closes shop on us! We must, however, strike when the iron is hot, and Lent is the perfect time to repent, confess our sins, and do penance. Our Lenten Confessions are Friday, March 22 from 5:30 – 7:00 pm, with several Priests slated to serve as Confessors. They will assist in pruning away whatever needs to go so that new growth can take place. They may suggest whatever will help us break away from bad habits and instill new methods of growing in grace. And they may even help us to see that under all those dead leaves and broken branches is a child of God who, with the Lord's love, can blossom in grace. Now, more of the Penance Service:

Each of us confesses that we are sinners, and, when encouraged to repentance by the example of others, and moved by their prayers, we testify and say: "My transgressions, truly I know them; my sin is always before me. Turn away your face from my sins, O Lord, and blot out all my guilt. Restore in me the joy of your salvation; sustain in me a willing spirit." [Psalm 51:5, 11, 14]

I believe I told you how, as a new seminarian, I was surprised when I saw the Rector, after he led the Penance Service, sat before another Priest and went to Confession; it was the first time I saw a Monsignor, or any Priest, as a Penitent. And when I 'hear Confessions,' I am so moved by the brutal honesty of those who admit their sins and failings, I am moved to confess my sins. Penitents challenge me to look more closely at my own imperfections and the faults I have ceased trying to correct. Now, the end of the Introduction

Therefore, as we humbly implore divine mercy with a contrite heart, may the mercy of the Lord come to our aid so that we, who formerly displeased the Lord with our wrongdoing, may rejoice with the Risen One, the author of our life, now that we are pleasing to the Lord in the land of the living

Make sure you have some holy water for next week's continuation of this Penance Service.

Before coming to Confession on **FRIDAY, MARCH 22** between 5:30 - 7:00 PM, examine your conscience; each week a different 'Examen' will be provided. To celebrate the Sacrament, start with your state in life [i.e., I'm married, single, parent, etc.] and approximate time since your last Confession; then list all grave, serious, major [mortal] sins by number and kind; a general admission of sinfulness suffices for less serious [venial] sins: i.e., impatience, intolerance, stinginess, lack of charity, forgiveness, etc. After the Priest offers a penance, listen to the *Prayer of Absolution*; please pray one of the *revised Acts of Contrition* PRIVATELY BEFORE or AFTER.

Act of Contrition #2 - from the revised Order of Penance

Remember, Lord, the compassion and mercy
you showed long ago.

Do not recall my sins and failings.
In your mercy remember me, Lord,
because of your goodness.

EXAMINATION OF CONSCIENCE BASED ON THE BAPTISMAL PROMISES

*Do you renounce sin, so as to live
in the freedom of the children of God?*

Have I sought the good life, not only for myself, but for all my brothers and sisters? Have I always acted as a child of God, as another Christ, for all the world to see? Have I shown in my attitudes and actions, in my example and priorities, that I am a Christian? As a child of God, do I speak regularly to my God, my loving Father, in prayer? Do I listen to and heed God's voice as He speaks to me in sacred Scripture and at holy Mass?

*Do you renounce the lure of evil,
so that sin may have no mastery over you?*

Have I given into my temptations? Have I failed to help build God's Kingdom on earth? Have I allowed the idols of money, or property, or color, or class, or position to get in the way of loving others? Have I tried to live by God's truth as taught: in the Ten Commandments; in Gospel values; in Church teaching; and by the dictates of my conscience, God's Spirit within me?

Do you renounce Satan, the author and prince of sin?

Have I given up my struggle against sin, or lost hope that God can, and will, help me to 'sin no more?' Have I tried to seek peace and to live in peace as part of one human family? Have I allowed Satan's prejudices to create a barrier to unity and peace? Have I given my attention and deeper trust to money, superstition, or other false gods? Have I voiced my opposition to all forms of darkness: abortion and euthanasia; all types of abuse and injustice; an 'anything goes' mentality?

*Do you believe in God, the Father Almighty,
Creator of heaven and earth?*

Do I see myself, and others, as children of the one Father, who loves us and cares for us? Do I see the hand of God in all created things: in myself; in my neighbor; in the gift of nature? Have I generously used God's gifts of time, health, strength, fortune, and talent in service for the Gospel? As a co-creator of the world with God, have I tried to further establish His Kingdom in my family, at my workplace or school, and among my relatives and friends?

*Do you believe in Jesus Christ His only Son, our Lord,
who was born of the Virgin Mary, was crucified,
died, and was buried, rose from the dead,
and is now seated at the right hand of the Father?*

Do I believe "God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life" [John 3:16] - which includes me? Do I feel unloved, or uncared for, by God? Have I patiently accepted my disappointments and sorrows by which "in my flesh I am filling up what is lacking in the afflictions of Christ?" [Colossians 1:24] Do I try to 'make it on my own,' forgetting that Jesus is at God's right hand, interceding and pleading for me?

Do you believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy Catholic Church, the Communion of Saints, the forgiveness of sins, the Resurrection of the Body and life everlasting?

Have I ignored the Spirit of God who dwells within the Church, who dwells within me? Have I forgotten that we are all connected by Faith to one another and to the whole Church, here on earth and in heaven? Am I so centered on the things of this world that I have forgotten we are created to share eternal happiness with God in heaven for all eternity? Have I lived as a temple of God's Spirit and a channel of God's love for all to see?
