

From the Pastor
7th Sunday in

**PRAY FOR THE SYNOD
PROCESS.** By His
words, and even more
so by His Example,
Jesus taught us to

PRAY before doing anything. He spent intense and lengthy time in prayer before starting His public ministry, choosing His Apostles, and in the Garden before His arrest to name just a few biblical accounts. So, as we enter this Synod process, we pray, using a set of orations specifically for use before such times as these: #20: For a Spiritual or Pastoral Gathering. We are encouraged to use these orations outside of Advent, Christmas, Lent and Easter and on days that have no specifically required orations. I will use them often.

Collect A - #20 - For A Spiritual or Pastoral Gathering
Pour out on us, O Lord, we pray,
a spirit of truth, understanding and peace,
that we may know with all our hearts
what is pleasing to you and, with one accord,
pursue what we have come to know.
Through our Lord Jesus ,, for ever and ever. Amen.

"TO KNOW, LOVE & SERVE GOD IN THIS WORLD ..."
If these words sound familiar to you, you are showing your age! They come from the answer to Question #6 of the Baltimore Catechism, which was: "Why did God make me?" "God made me to know Him, to love Him, and to serve Him in this world, and to be happy with Him for ever in heaven." Know, Love, Serve: the triple play that opens the Gates of Heaven! Contrary to a popular assumption, learning about our Faith cannot - **MUST** not - end with Confirmation, which is so often the case for so many Catholics!

Can we truly LOVE and SERVE a God we do not KNOW? And how can we KNOW our God if we do not LISTEN as He speaks to us through Sacred Scripture and Church Teaching, the Sacraments and the Liturgy, through those Ordained to speak in His Most Holy Name, and through the poor, the needy, and all in whom He said He would be present? No wonder the second step, after the first step - PRAYER - is to LISTEN as God speaks to us in the many ways He has chosen to help us to KNOW, to LOVE and to SERVE Him!

**Prayer over the Offerings -
Spiritual/Pastoral Gather**
Look with gracious favor, O Lord, we pray,
on the offerings of your servants, that they may truly
understand and proclaim with confidence
what is right and wholesome in your sight.
Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

STEP 1: UNDERSTAND; STEP 2: PROCLAIM. So many are so quick to say, "Doesn't the Church say I must follow my conscience?" - which is true - but only if our conscience is properly INFORMED. Like our First Parents, to whom we give the names Adam and Eve, our conscience is often tainted by the designs and plans of the Evil One, who even tried to confuse and misguide Jesus, as we will soon hear on the 1st Sunday of Lent. However, once we make sure we TRULY know what is right in God's sight, we must share it with others. And while we must do this in word, it is far more essential that we do it by example, in our deeds, for they speak far louder - and have a far greater impact - than our words!

**Prayer after Communion -
Spiritual/Pastoral Gather**
Grant us, O merciful God, that the holy gifts
we have received may confirm us
in our resolve to do your will and make us
everywhere witnesses to your truth.
Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

"WITNESSES TO [GOD'S] TRUTH." Before His Ascension, Jesus gave the Great Commission: "[teach all nations] to observe all that I have commanded you" [Matthew 28:20a]. Again, we cannot teach what we did not learn, give what we did not accept, or share what we did not receive. So, as we enter this Synod process, we must open - or reopen - ourselves to God's saving Word. We can never stop learning about God!

If we are open to interpreting God's holy Word - not according to our personal, often biased, ideas and opinions - but in accord with time-honored, saint-recommended, theologically-sound Church dogmas and doctrines, we can be sure that we are living God's holy truth. May the exercises and activities of the Synod help us to build a firmer foundation in Christ and in His Church, and to share this treasure with every-one.


