

From the Pastor
1st Sunday of Lent - B
February 21, 2021

SAINT PETER: FIRST AMONG EQUALS. On February 22, even when it falls during Lent, as it does this year, we don white vestments and pray the Gloria which we omit during most of Lent, to honor our first Pope, the first Bishop of Rome and Vicar of Christ: Saint Peter. Although

tomorrow's orations are for 'The Chair of Saint Peter the Apostle,' we will reflect on an additional set of orations for a votive Mass in his honor, for use in Ordinary Time, simply called Saint Peter, Apostle. It is surprising how appropriate these orations are for us as we set out on our annual Lenten journey. Through the prayers of Saint Peter and his current successor, Pope Francis, may we have a spiritually beneficial Lent!

Collect - Votive Mass #16. Saint Peter, Apostle

O God, who gave the keys of the Kingdom of Heaven to your blessed Apostle Peter and handed over to him the pontifical office of binding and loosing, grant, we pray, that through the help of his intercession we may be set free from the bonds of our sins. Through our Lord Jesus ... for ever and ever. Amen.

"WHY MUST WE CONFESS OUR SINS TO A PRIEST?" The simple answer to this often-asked question is: "Because Jesus said so!" On two separate occasions, Jesus gave the power to 'bind' or 'loose' [condemn/absolve]. First, He gave it just to Saint Peter; later He gave it to all of His disciples - but He only gave the 'keys to the kingdom' to Saint Peter. [Cf. Matthew 16:19] We can safely assume Jesus wanted the authority to decide Church disciplines, dogmas and juridical matters to be passed on to the successors of Saint Peter, the Popes - which they share with the successors of all the other Apostles, the Bishops. And they, in turn, authorize Priests to use that authority in the Confessional.

Jesus said Christians may hold bound - or loose - the sins committed against them; this presumes they know what these sins are. However, in the Sacrament of Penance, the Penitent must tell all mortal, serious or grave sins, by number and kind, and make a general admission of all lesser

venial sins. Why? Unless the Priest knows what sins he is being asked to absolve or hold bound, he would be acting whimsically, with no basis in reality - and Jesus would certainly not want His Priests to do anything like that!

Prayer over the Offerings - Saint Peter, Apostle

Receive with favor your people's oblation,
O Lord, we pray, as we commemorate
the blessed Apostle Peter, for you taught him
by a hidden revelation to confess you,
the living God, and the Christ your Son,
and led him to bear witness to his Master
by means of a glorious passion.
Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

A GLORIOUS PASSION. According to tradition, Saint Peter was crucified in AD 64; some ancient accounts say that - at his own request, his cross was turned upside down, for he said he did not deserve to die as Jesus died. However, the bottom line is: he gave his life for God, and so must we. And while the ways we 'die to sin' this Lent, and the penances we perform to show our love for God and sorrow for sin may not be as 'glorious' as Saint Peter's life and death - they are also pleasing to God, and that's all that matters!

Prayer after Communion - Saint Peter, Apostle

Having been admitted, O Lord, to the banquet of salvation as we venerate the memory of the blessed Apostle Peter, we ask with gladness that we may always hold fast to your Son, who alone has the words of life, so that, as faithful sheep of your flock, we may be happily led to eternal pastures. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

ONE FOOD FOR ALL AGES. Do we forget that what Saint Peter received at the Last Supper: Christ's Sacred Body and Precious Blood - we can also receive? For as members of God's flock, guided from heaven by Saint Peter and all the Apostolic Shepherds - and from earth by their Successors, our Pope and Bishops - we can be led, as we sing in 'Lord, Who Throughout These Forty Days:' "... through these days of penitence, And through your Passontide ... [to] ... an Easter of unending joy."


